At a special meeting of the Mayor and the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Lake Lure, held Tuesday, September 26, 1939, the following business was transacted:

Upon motion by Commissioner Greig and duly seconded by Comm. Vess, the following resolution was offered and unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Lake Lure to appropriate various sums for the maintenance and operation of the Town government and its institutions for the fiscal year begun July 1, 1939 and ending June 30, 1940;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Lake Lure, does hereby appropriate the following sums for the maintenance and operation of the town government and institutions for the fiscal year aforesaid:

AND, WHEREAS, in order to raise the necessary revenue to provide for the above appropriated expenditures, it is necessary that the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Lake Lyre levy a tax rate for the fiscal year;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that there shall be levied and collected in accordance with existing laws a tax upon all real estate situated in the Town of Lake Lyre and upon all personal property owned by residents of the Town, of \$1.00 per \$100 valuation of said properties, the said tax being necessary to raise the required revenues for the General Fund appropriates designated above.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a levit of \$ .25 on the \$100 valuations of all real estate and personal properties in the Town to be appropriated for Debt Service Use. Total Tax Rate of \$1.25 per \$100 is here adopted.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk and Tax Collector is hereby instructed to allow such discounts and to charge and collect such penalties upon such taxes, if and when paid, as are set forth in Section 805, of the Machinery Act of 1933 and all subsequent laws.

The Board approved a bill in amount of \$101.40 to be paid to F. P. Stratford, C.P.A. for auditing the town's records after same had been approved by the Local Government Commission.

Upon application from John S. Delevie and several other residents residing across the lake from the town center for water service from the town's supply, the Board authorized the clerk make such estimated and if possible to make an application to the Works Progress Administration for a Federal project for any necessary water extention.

The Mayor was authorized to fix a reasonable salary for the town policeman for the winter months and also to reduce the salary of the Golf Pro according to the season green fees.

J. A. Riddick, Tax Collector for the Town of Lake Lure, presented the tax books as prepared by him for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1940, based upon the levy heretofore made, which were examined and motion made and seconded and by unanimous vote of the Board, the same were approved.

Upon motion and second, and by unanimous vote of the Board, it was ordered that the tax books presented at this meeting be delivered to J. A. Riddick as Tax Collector for the year 1939, with full authority to collect the same as provided by law and that same shall operate as an execution in the hands of the sheriff as provided by law, and he is authorized and directed to make collections of said taxes as provided by law.

Upon motion and second, meeting was adjoined.
