At a regular meeting of the Mayor and the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Lake Lure, Held on Tuesday, November 5th. 1940, the following proceedings were held:

Mr. Dewey Price, chief of police, presented a letter to the Board requesting an approximate six (6) months leave from his duties, without pay, for the purpose of residing in the state of Florida for that period.

After due consideration, the Board voted to grant this leave of absence from the police force without any obligation on the part of the town, thereby relieving Mr. Price of his duties.

It being necessary for the town to have adequate police protection for the above time, the Board received applications for the vacancy in the police force and after due consideration, the Board appointed Mr. Wallace M. Weber, as police and warden for an approximate period of six (6) months.

Mr. Weber's salary was fixed at \$75.00 per month and it was ordered that \$5.00 of this salary be withheld each month and paid to Mr. Price as a rental of the police boat in patrolling the lake. Mr. Weber is to use his own car for patrolling the town streets and he was granted permission by the Board to engage in any other gainful occupation in the community provided same does not interfere in any way with his duties as a police officer.

Upon motion and second, meeting was adjourned.
