At a special meeting of the Mayor and Board of Commissioners held in the Town Office on Tuesday, March 25, 1947, the following business was transacted:

Upon motion of C. W. Keeter, seconded by N. A. Greig, it was ordered that the regular biennial election for the Town of Lake Lure be held on Tuesday, May 6, 1947.

It is further ordered that Walter N. Leiter be and he is hereby appointed Registrer for said election, and that J. Seymour Wilson and Mason. W. Smith be and they are hereby appointed Judges for said election.

It is further ordered that the Registration Books for said election shall be open for registration on Saturday, April 19th, 1947 at 9:00 O'clock a. m. and remain open until 9:00 O'clock of said date; and that said Registration books shall be open on Monday, April 21, Tuesday April 22, Wednesday April 23, Thursday April 24, Friday April 25, from 9:00 O'clock a. m. until 5:00 O'Clock p. m. and shall be open on Saturday April 26 from 9:00 o'clock a. m. until 9:00 o'clock p. m., for the registration of voters for the Town of Lake Lure for the municipal election.

It is further ordered that the Town Clerk shall post a notice of said Registration at the Town Office and shall arrange for suitable ballots to be printed for said election.

The town board considered the application from Gerald B. Warthen as pro-manager of the municipal golf course for six months starting around April 15th. Upon motion and second, the Board voted to employ Mr. Warthen at a Salary of \$75.00 per month, plus the privilege of the concession at the club house. Said salary is subject to increase provided conditions warrant same.

The Board instructed the Clerk to raise the green fees at the Municipal course before June 1st to .75¢ with the provisions that local members of the course may pay a fee of .50¢ provided they pay an additional membership fee annually.

The Board approved a contract submitted by Mr. F. P. Stratford, C. P. A. for the audit of the Town books for the year 1946-47 at a salary of \$25.00 per diem for actual time plus automobile expenses.

The Board instructed the Clerk to purchase a new Remington type-writer for a sum not to exceed \$180.00 less the trade-in price for the machine now owned by the Town.

Upon motion and second, meeting was adjourned.
