A special meeting was held by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Lake Lure on Tuesday, April 29, 1947, in which the following business was transacted:

Applications were submitted for Town policeman by W. H. Packard of Cliffside, N. C. and Elmer G. Wilson of Tryon, N.C. The Board carefully considered same and deferred the matter for further investigation, and empowered the Town clerk to employ one of these applicants for a period of six months at a salary not to exceed \$150. with some allowance for personal car use.

The Town Board examined and approved four permits for the building of boat houses on Lake Lure with the further approval of the Carolina Mountain Power Corporation.

Upon motion and second, it was decided by the Town Board that suitable folders on the recreational facilities on the resort should be printed for distribution to tourists, and the Board accepted the lowest bid of five thousand folders from the Miller ~~Express~~ Company not to exceed \$150., and authorized the Treasurer to expend same from the general fund for this purpose.

Upon motion by N. A. Greig and seconded by C. W. Keeter a resolution was unanimously passed to fix the salaries for the incoming Town officers as follows:

Mayor, \$15. per month, and Town Commissioners, \$10. per month, effective July 1, 1947.

The Town Board authorized the Clerk to hire some clerical and stenographic assistance in the office during the summer months to handle the increased correspondence and office routine.

Upon motion by C. W. Keeter, which was unanimously adapted a resolution of appreciation was extended to Commissioner N. A. Greig for his valuable work on the Board for the past several years, as Mr. Greig presented his resignation effective May 6th, 1947.

Upon motion and second, the meeting was adjourned.
