MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWN OF LAKE LURE, NORTH CAROLINA HELD IN THE TOWN OFFICE AT 7.30 P.M. TUESDAY JANY. 13,1953

At the meeting held at 7.30 P.M.Tuesday Jan. 13, 1953 in the Town Hall at Lake Lure N.C., the follwoing were present.

L.M.Pearson Jr., Mayor W.C.Allison, Commissioner, Chas.R.Yopp, Clerk Fred D. Hamrick, Town Attorney

The meeting was called to order by the Mayor, L.M. Pearson, Jr. The matter of furnishing water to Ray Vess at the Golf Course was discussed and it was decided that the service should be provided.

The question of an entirely new registration for the municipal election to be held in May was brought up and it was agreed that

this new registration should be had.

Mr. Hamrick is to prepare a set or code of ordinances for the Town especially the boating and fishing privileges which he is to submit at the next regular meeting of the Board Feb.10,1953 Mr. PearsonMr. Allison, and Mr. Hamrick are to go to Raleigh to Wednesday, Jan.21,1953 to discuss with Mr. W.E. Easterling the matter of a bond issue covering the probable refunding of the outstanding bonds of the Town and also, in reference to the

possible issuance of Bonds to cover the purchase of the holdings of the Carolina Mountain Power Corporation.

It was decided that these three gentlemen will ,also, contact our Representative, Hon. George Mills, relative to the passage of certain local legislation concerning a Property Re-Valuation, a Dog Track with Pari-Mutuel Wagering, and a vote on the question

of A.B.C.Store for Lake Lure, N.C.

Mr. Hamrick then discussed the proposed purchase of the Carolina Mountain Power Corporation's holdings by the Town. Their report was analyzed and after considerable discussion, it was suggested that it might prove wise to engage another engineer to appraise and report as glaring inconsistent and irreconcilable statements were apparent in the report submitted by the Carolina Mountain Power Co.'s engineers, who appraised. Mr. Hamrick was to ask for certain additional information but no offer was to be made until after the matter had been discussed with Mr. Easterling.

No further business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
