

MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS  
OF THE TOWN OF LAKE LURE, N.C. HELD IN THE TOWN OFFICE IN  
LAKE LURE, N.C. TUESDAY NOVEMBER 9, 1954 AT 7.30 P.M.

At a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Lake Lure, N.C. held in the Town Office at 7.30 P.M. Tuesday November 9, 1954, the following were present-

The mayor called the meeting to order and V.T. Salter was recognized.

Mr. Salter discussed the matter of the development of the lake shore, the possibility of operating a bathing beach, and the probability of securing a longer lease than one year on the Carolina Mountain Power Company's holdings. Mr. Salter, also, suggested that an automatic switch be installed on the pumps used by the water department. And, as usual, criticised the condition of the Chalet Club Road and the Town's upkeep of it.

Mr. Pearson brought up the matter of a certain letter that had come to the Town over Mr. Ben John Moore's signature as secretary of the Civic Club. This letter as much as demanded to know what the Town intended to do about the Beach and insisted that it be operated by the Town as a business proposition separate from the Town's regular municipal operations. And further that such matter should be attended to immediately before the season opens next April 1, 1955. Mr. Pearson let it be known that such a letter was not at all appreciated, that the Town as a municipal corporation could not and did not intend to operate such a business. Mr. Salter thought that the letter was not intended as a request or even a suggestion that the Town go into such a business even though it plainly read as such. He, Mr. Salter, explained that the Civic Club simply wanted to know what if any action the Board had taken for the operation of the Beach for Bathing, etc., etc.,.

Mr. Pearson brought up the matter of the Town's purchase of a road scraper, the present one too light and just about worn out and worthless. No action or discussion was had.

No further business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
