MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWN OF LAKE LURE Tuesday, October 22, 1968

A special meeting of the Board of Commissioners was held in the Town: Hall at 7:30 o'clock P. M. on October 22, 1968. The following members of the Board were present:

J. Paul Wilson, Mayor Robert B. Jones, Commissioner Woodrow Price, Commissioner

Hollis M. Owens, Jr. Attorney, was also present,

The Mayor, J. Paul Wilson, called the meeting to order and the clerk read the minutes of the last meeting. The minutes were approved as written.

The matter of working out a schedule of fees to be charged to owners of dwellings and business places presently connected to the Town of Lake Lure sewer system, and charges and fees for dwellings and business places to be connected to said system in the future was discussed at length. After discussion, Commissioner Jones moved, seconded by Commissioner Price, that the following resolution be adopted; said resolution was unanimously passed.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Lake Lure is advertent to the fact that it will soon be necessary to impose asschedule of charges and fees on business and residential properties that are now connected and which will be connected in the future to the sewer system of the Town of Lake Lure; and

WHEREAS, the Board understands that the North Carolina League of Municipalities will assist upon request cities and towns in working out such a schedule of charges and fees;

## NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. That the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Lake Lure request the North Carolina League of Municipalities to give the Board assistance in working out a schedule of fees and charges to be imposed upon residential and business properties which are now connected and which will be connected in the future to the Town of Lake Lure sewer system.
- 2. That the Mayor and the Town Clerk and Treasurer be, and they are hereby authorized and directed to forward this request to the North Carolina League of Municipalities.

The matter of lowering Lake Lure was discussed at length, and after discussion, upon motion made, seconded and unanimously passed, the Board decided to lower the lake 5 feet for thirty days beginning on December 1, 1968, to facilitate repairs to boat houses and docks.

The matter of the lease with the Western North Carolina Scenic Railroad, Inc. was discussed and after discussion, and upon motion made, seconded and passed, the Town Attorney was instructed to investigate the steps necessary to recover the property owned by the Town of Lake Lure on which the Western North Carolina Scenic Railroad, is situated.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 10:30 o'clock P. M.
