

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS  
OF THE TOWN OF LAKE LURE  
TUESDAY, AUGUST 8, 1972

The regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners was held in the Town Hall at 7:30 p. m. on August 8, 1972. The following members of the board were present: Mayor J. Paul Wilson, Commissioner Avery T. Cashion, Jr., and Commissioner Zeb V. Dalton. Hollis M. Owens, Jr., Town Attorney, was also present.

Mayor J. Paul Wilson called the meeting to order and recognized Honorable Robert A. Jones, member of the North Carolina House of Representatives, who spoke briefly. In his remarks, Representative Jones commented on the growth of the Town of Lake Lure, commended the policemen of the Town of Lake Lure for efficient patrolling of the Lake known as Lake Lure, commented on crowded boating conditions and advised that the charter of the Town of Lake Lure could be amended at the 1973 Session of the North Carolina General Assembly to add more members to the Board of Commissioners.

Commissioner Dalton moved that Gene L. Lovell be retained as Chief of Police of the Town of Lake Lure. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Cashion and unanimously adopted.

The minutes of the regular meeting held on July 11, 1972, and of a special meeting held on July 25, 1972, were read and approved as written.

The Clerk advised the board that a 1963 Ford Dump Truck owned by the Town had been advertised for sale as required by law, and that the highest bid received was from L. M. Pearson, Jr. in the amount of \$1,100.00. Commissioner Cashion moved, seconded by Commissioner Dalton that Mr. Pearson's bid be accepted and that said 1963 Ford Dump Truck be sold to him. This motion was unanimously adopted.


The Clerk advised the board that it is required by law that all surplus moneys be included in the budget for the 1972-73 fiscal year, and further advised that an amended budget will be presented to the board at its regular meeting to be held on September 12, 1972.

Mayor Wilson read a letter from Mrs. Mary Nesbitt regarding the paving of Cane Creek Road, and advised the board that the center line of said road would have to be established before any paving work could be done on it.

A letter was read from Mr. J. V. Bell asking that the minutes of the meetings of the board be written by the Clerk or by a special secretary in the absence of the Clerk and kept in the Town Hall at all times. The Clerk suggested that a tape recorder be used to record the proceedings of the board.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned at 9:30 p. m.
