MEETING OF THE TOWN COUNCIL

PURPOSE:

To Review Wastewater Treatment Plant Progress

To those Participating:

Thank you all for coming to Lake Lure to review the Wastewater Treatment Plant improvement project. (See atch #1 for names of those attending).

I believe that each person gathered here today feels that we are in the final stages of a long overdue corrective action process. Indeed, recent analysis tends to provide considerable room for optimism, for in perusing every test report I have seen no unsatisfactory indications.

As you know, the Town has in the past six months made significant progress in improving upon our two major problem areas:

- 1) Influx of lake water into the sewer through manhole and subsurface leakage has been reduced from 1,300,000 GPD to approximately 400,000 GPD measured. (Minimum measured flow was 362,000 GPD). Leakage was found at points around manhole covers as well as around flow pipe/manhole junctures. Oubsurface leaks were found, then packed and clamped at pipe joints. One leak was major, two were lesser in volume. Divers from Commercial Divers, Inc. Columbus, Ohio were employed to repair the leaking joints.
- 2) The other major problem, the lack of transportation capability from the sewer outlet at the base of the dam to the treatment plant, (1500 feet downstream and uphill), had existed from the time of original construction due to design deficiency. An adequate pump well and 3, 7.5 H.P. Hydramatic pumps were installed. Most of the time, only one pump is actually running.

We are confident that:

- 1) A flow of under 400,000 GPD will be maintained, and
- 2) NPDES permit test requirments can, and will continue to be satisfactorily achieved.

In addition to recently completed engineering improvements other steps have been taken to further enhance overall plant performance levels:

1) An additional operator is being trained at Blue Ridge Tech.

2) A professional testing/analysis company, Wastewater Services, Inc. has been hired to conduct required testing and provide other technological advice as necessary.

On behalf of the Town Council I want to thank all who have assisted us in so many ways—engineering, testing, analyses, routine maintenance and administratively in achieving what we feel is a viable treatment facility. Furthermore, the Town is determined to leave no stone unturned in continuing our effort to maintain a clean effluent well within permit parameters.

I am available at all times to further discuss this vital matter.

Thank you for the excellent and informative tour of the Town of Lake Lure's wastewater treatment facility on February 10, 1983. The officials of the Town of Lake Lure have recently accomplished much toward achieving a satisfactory solution to the Town's long lived and difficult wastewater disposal problems.

Now that the wastewater treatment facility has been placed in operation, the Town of Lake Lure should begin monitoring the facility in accordance with the final effluent limitations and monitoring requirements page of NPDES Permit No. NCO025381. Also, as much additional data as possible should be generated on influent and effluent BOD and total suspended solids concentrations. The additional influent and effluent data can be used by personnel of the Town of Lake Lure to determine the most effective and efficient manner in which to operate the treatment facility. This data can also be used by the Division of Environmental Management to evaluate the capacity of the wastewater treatment facility to accept additional volumes of wastewater from new sources.

Your generosity in taking the time to show and explain to Mr. Heath Dobson, Mr. Jim Reid and the writer the considerable improvements in the Town of Lake Lure's wastewater treatment system was much appreciated.
