

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR TOWN MEETING  
OF THE LAKE LURE TOWN COUNCIL

August 25, 1987

The regular meeting of the Lake Lure Town Council was called to order at 7:30 p.m. in the Community Center on August 25, 1987.

Those present were: Mayor Charles F. Hicks, Commissioners Karr, Michelon, Price and Wildman and Town Attorney Chris Callahan.

Commissioner Karr moved, seconded by Commissioner Wildman to dispense with the reading of the minutes. The motion passed with a unanimous vote.

The first subject to be introduced was the dispute between John Barber and Mr. Donald Godehn regarding the location of the Barber boathouse. Mr. Godehn's attorney, Mr. James Creekman, appealed to the council to have Mr. Barber remove his boathouse from its present location. After a lengthy discussion, no action was taken by the Council.

Col. Dick Weaver was next on the agenda. He presented to the Council a home owners survey he had conducted and a letter stating his concern about the fire protection in Lake Lure.

After a discussion concerning the status of fire protection in Lake Lure, Commissioner Michelon moved, seconded by Commissioner Karr to set up a committee consisting of the fire chiefs of the four fire departments that service Lake Lure and geographically diverse citizens of Lake Lure to study and evaluate the four fire departments.

Areas to be evaluated are:

1. Training schedules
2. Financial status
3. Personnel
4. Equipment
5. Response time
6. The effect on insurance ratings.

The motion passed with a vote unanimously in favor.

Commissioner Price moved, seconded by Commissioner Karr to table further discussion of the fire department. Motion passed with a unanimous vote.

Other areas discussed were the proposal to install liquid sewer lines in certain coves, the status of the dredging of the lake and the Lure Woods silting of the lake. There was no action taken.

Commissioner Michelon moved, seconded by Commissioner Karr to enter into an executive session to consult with an attorney.

Motion was made seconded and unanimously approved to return to regular session.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.
