RECESSED WORKSHOP MEETING OF THE LAKE LURE TOWN COUNCIL HELD FRIDAY, MAY 21, 1993 AT THE LAKE LURE TOWN HALL AT 9:00 A.M.

Mayor Doyle called the meeting to order at approximately 9:00 a.m.

Berkeley Young, Executive Director for the Hickory Nut Gorge Chamber of Commerce, met with Council to inform them of the progress being made by the Chamber. The Chamber is presently preparing packets for individuals who own summer cottages encouraging them to buy locally. The packets are being referred to as "Welcome Back to Lake Lure". Berkeley requested that the Town participate by preparing a letter from the Town Officials to be included in the packet.

Council discussed the time of the Tuesday, June 8, 1993 workshop meeting and it was the consensus of Council to change the time from 10:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. at the Town Hall instead of the Community Center.

Council briefly discussed the Lake Lure Golf Course and how to increase the revenue. Council recommended that plans get underway for the annual Beat the Council Golf Tournament to be held possibly late June or early July, 1993.

Mr. Hord informed Council that the two new paddleboats which were ordered for the Lake Lure Marina have been generating excellent revenue. The paddleboats are virtually maintenance free.

Council discussed the beach fees and slip rental fees for fiscal year 1993-94. Council requested that the Town Manager investigate the fees to consider possible raising the rates in the budget for 1993-94.

It was the consensus of Council that the public telephone at the Community Center be removed.

Council requested that a new lake use contract be presented to Colony Resort for endorsement since they are in charge of the showboat which used to be run by Fairfield Mountain's Inc.

Council discussed the Marina parking area and requested that Luther Smith be contacted letting him know their plans for boat trailer parking. Council also discussed the possibility of posting a sign at the Marina explaining the boating and parking procedures.

With no further items of discussion, Commissioner Donovan moved, seconded by Commissioner Lehner, to adjourn. The vote of approval was unanimous.
