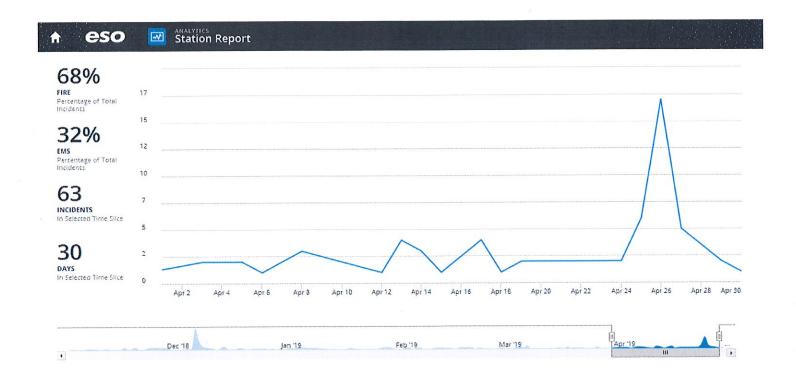

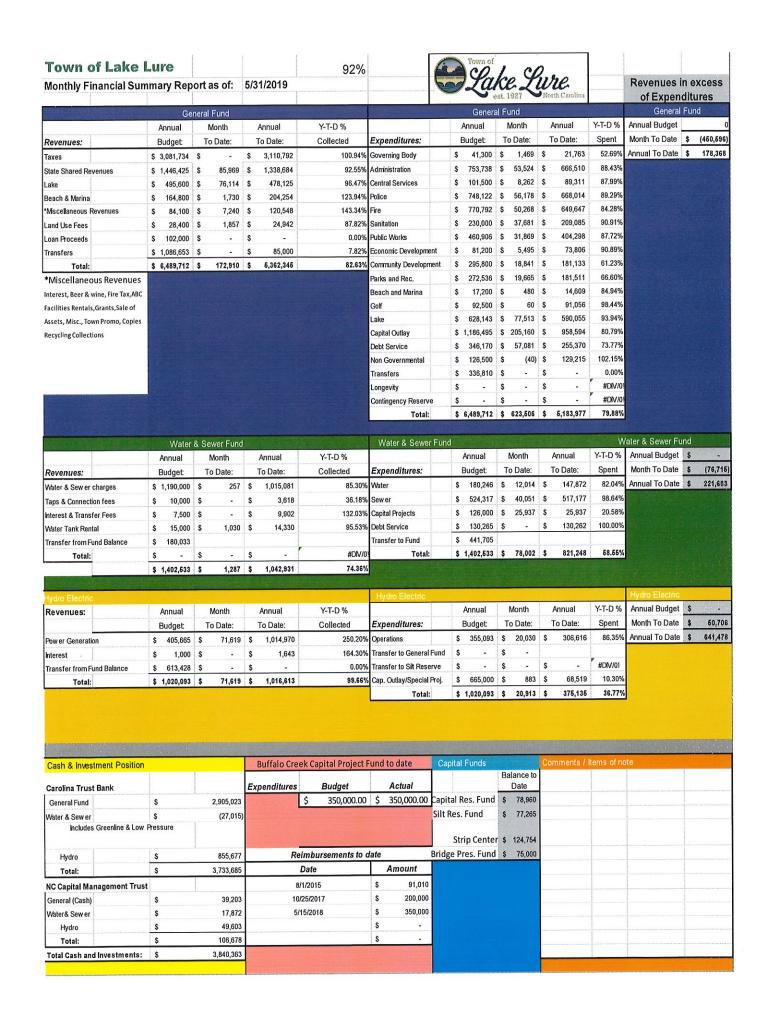

### **CALL TO ORDER**

Mayor Pro Tem John W. Moore called the meeting to order at 9:05 a.m. and gave the invocation. Council members led the pledge of allegiance.

### APPROVE THE AGENDA

Commissioner Stephen Webber proposed that the following item be added to the agenda:

 Jeffrey Brown, Brown Engineering should be added to the beginning of the agenda to present a Policy Summary.

Commissioner Bob Cameron made a motion to approve the Agenda as amended. Commissioner Stephen Webber seconded the motion and it carried 4-0.

### **BROWN ENGINEERING**

Mr. Brown presented the following information. He noted that the Utility Advisory Board has reviewed the Policy Summary and concurs with the information. There was discussion on each item below:

- 1. Overall Policy Statement(s)
  - a. The Town of Lake Lure is developing a LPSS (low pressure sewer system) in order to comply with NCDEQ water quality regulations.
  - b. Properties that reside within the Lake Lure service area will be required to hook onto the sewer system when it is available.
- 2. Utility Policy Ownership

Policy: The Town of Lake Lure will own and maintain a LPSS. The cost to operate, maintain, repair shall be covered by the sewer rate(s) established.

3. Utility Policy - Shared Connections

Policy: Shared systems shall be allowed if the system is NCDEQ approved collection system and meets the Town of Lake Lure LPSS Standards.

- 4. Utility Policy Connection Program
- 5. Policy: Connection Fees:
  - a. Connection fees are waived during the construction phase of a Lake Lure low pressure main.
  - b. Post Construction of low-pressure mains; Connection fees shall apply and shall be set by the current policy/ rate structure.
  - c. Utility Policy Connections below Lake Level
- 6. Policy: There shall be no active sewer below Lake Full Pond.
- 5. Utility Policy Rates.

Policy: The Town of Lake Lure owns and operates a LPSS Enterprise Fund. The Enterprise fund shall be funded through a rate structure. The Rate Structure shall include both common costs and user driven costs.

After a thorough discussion, consensus was reached to use the policy recommendations outlined above as guidance for the design phase of the LPSS.

### **CLOSED SESSION MINUTES**

Shannon Baldwin, Town Manager presented the minutes of the May 14, 2019 Town Council Closed Session. Council members reviewed the minutes and approved them by signing their initials.

### BUDGET WORKSHOP

I. Overview, Revenue: Sam Karr, Finance Director, provided an overview of the FY2019-2020 budget information. He noted that Rutherford County re-assessed properties this year. He explained that overall, the average growth rate county-wide is only 1.065%, however, they reduced tax values in Lake Lure by about 4.5%. He added that one cent on the tax rate is equivalent to about \$81,253; a neutral revenue tax rate would require a .017 tax rate increase to .377 from .36 cents from last fiscal year.

Mr. Karr stated that the state economic outlook at this time of year's annual revenue forecast is much the same as it has been for all recent revenue forecasts. Indicators continue to point to a slow, steady economic growth for the state in the coming months. He stated that although there is talk of a recession, the recession speculation primarily centers on 2020 and beyond. He advised that

meetings had been held with Town Council to review the Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) and he met with Town department heads on their operational budgets. He explained that the budget that was being presented included cost-of-living adjustments (COLAs) to 1.9% of the Consumer Price Index (CPI-2018). The budget also includes Health Insurance and retirement rate increases.

There was a general discussion. Mr. Karr noted that the proposed budget is roughly \$715,000 out of balance in the General Fund.. He added that \$243,762 was coming out of the General Fund to the Capital Reserve Fund and noted that the Capital Reserve Fund will have a balance of \$322,722 without any transfers.

Town Council reviewed each department's respective budget in the following order:

- a. The Police Department budget was presented by Sean Humphries, Police Chief. There was a general discussion and consensus on the proposed operational budget and related items included in the CIP.
- b. The Communications and Events budget was presented by Laura Krejci, Communications/Events Coordinator. There was a general discussion on the proposed budget and consensus on the proposed operational budget and related items included in the CIP.
- c. Economic Development was presented by Laura Doster, Executive Director for the Chamber of Hickory Nut Gorge (CHNG) and Bill Ashman, Secretary (CHNG). Ms. Doster provided the attached overview for discussion. The Town budgeted \$10,000 for the Chamber for the purpose of Economic Development. The attached proposal included a request for \$30,000 to address Economic Development through grant writing for the Town. There was a discussion about economic development and what the needs and expectations were for the Town. There was consensus that a memorandum of Understanding (MOU) needed to be developed to clearly outline these expectations to secure value. Commissioner Bob Cameron recommended adding \$10,000 towards this request. There was consensus on putting aside an additional \$10,000 until An MOU could be agreed upon.



- d. The Public Works and Hydroelectric Plant budget were presented by David Arrowood, Public Works Director. There was a general discussion on the proposed budget and consensus was reached on the proposed operational budget and related items included in the CIP.
- e. The Parks, Recreation and Lake budget, including the Beach & Marina were presented by Dean Givens, Parks, Recreation and Lake Director. Note that there had been \$5,000 taken out of the budget for the flowering bridge. There was consensus to add this back into the budget due to the added value of the Flowering Bridge to the Lake Lure community with their over 50,000 visitors that come out to see the bridge.

There was consensus to add an additional \$25,000 for increased dredging and discussed letting Tim Edwards dredge without payment as he has found a way to make this profitable. There was also consensus to complete a budget amendment to use the Silt Removal Funds to purchase the

### **CALL TO ORDER**

Mayor Pro Tem John Moore called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. and gave the invocation. Council members led the pledge of allegiance.

### APPROVE THE AGENDA

Commissioner Stephen Webber proposed that the following item be moved from the item C on the Consent Agenda and added to New Business, item D for discussion:

• Item C. Budget Amendment # 247: To complete two custom repair projects started by Clifton Power Co. Replacement of custom made Tainter Gate Cables (\$11,892) and Installation of Electric Motor on Tainter Gate #1. (\$3,502.58)

Change the description from Propane Tank (#533) to Tainter Gate Repairs and budgeted amounts change from \$25,000 to \$15,500 (balance of \$9,500 moves to Fund Balance).

Commissioner Bob Cameron made a motion to approve the Agenda as amended. Commissioner John Kilby seconded the motion and it carried 4-0.

### **MAYOR'S COMMUNICATIONS**

Mayor Pro Tem John Moore provided the following updates:

- **Mayor Cooley:** We ask that the community keep Mayor Cooley and his family in prayer. At the time we are respecting the family's privacy and protocol regarding the release of information regarding his condition.
- **Zoning and Planning Board:** Mayor Pro Tem John Moore provided a Council Liaison Report for the Zoning and Planning Board.

### TOWN MANAGER COMMUNICATIONS

Shannon Baldwin, Town Manager, provided the following updates:

- **Installation of Geo-tubes:** Geo-tubes have been installed at the Waste Water Treatment Plant and they are working well.
- Small Generator Repair: The Town is reviewing a contract with Clifton Power Co. and recommendations for repairing the hoist for the intake. The Town will be working with Schnabel Engineering on this contract review as well as the hoist for the intake before releasing an RFP.
- **Dam Updates:** Town staff met with the NC Department of Environmental Quality's Dam Safety Office (DSO) in Greensboro, NC. They were receptive to the conditions assessment report. They have advised that they have a much more accurate report of the dam's condition from Schnabel Engineering. With this assessment completed, we are in good standing with the DSO.
- Workshop on the Low Pressure Sewer System: Town Council held a workshop on 5/8/19 with Brown Engineering to discuss the Low Pressure Sewer System (LPSS). This generated an action item for Brown Engineering to complete a white paper on policy recommendations related to the LPSS. Brown Engineering delivered a draft of the policy recommendations and these have been shared with the Utility Advisory Board for review. Once they review these recommendations, these will be shared with Town Council as soon as possible.
- **Budget Workshop**: Sam Karr, Finance Director, announced the upcoming Special Meeting for a Budget Workshop on 5/23/19, beginning at 9:00. He advised that department heads had been asked to attend the meeting, along with representatives from any organizations that have requested contributions from the Town.
- NC Department of Transportation (NCDOT) Bridge Meeting: A meeting was held on 5/21/19 with the NCDOT, Dam Safety Office in Ashville, Schnabel

Engineering, and Town staff to discuss the bridge over the dam. There will be ongoing discussions on plans or the dam.

• Infrastructure Projects Brochure: This brochure was available for review at the meeting. The brochure highlights the major infrastructure needs for the Town, as well as the costs associated with these needs. This brochure was developed by Mayor Cooley, Shannon Baldwin, Brad Burton and Laura Krejci and is being used to help communicate significant Town needs to those who may be in a position to assist the Town with these costs. (Attachment A)



• Communication/Events: Laura Krejci, Communications Specialist and Events Coordinator gave an update on Everbridge, Lake Lure's new mass notification service. She explained that this is the notification system is utilized by Rutherford County and it will replace the Code Red System that is currently in place. Commissioner Stephen Webber asked if those who were registered with Code Red would be automatically registered with Everbridge. Ms. Krejci confirmed that this was not possible. Code Red registrants do not automatically become Everbridge Registrants so everyone must sign up to receive notifications. Ms. Krejci distributed the attached Everbridge Flyer with information on how to register. (Attachment B)



• Ms. Krejci also provided an overview of the Memorial Day Program scheduled for 5/27/19 at 9:00 am at the Veterans Memorial Kiosk in front of the Lake Lure Beach. She announced that Captain Ed Dittmer, US Navy (Ret.) was serving as the Chairperson for the event. ### **PUBLIC FORUM**

Mayor Pro Tem John Moore asked if anyone had a public comment and noted that no one had signed up to speak during the Public Hearing.

A. Ordinance No. 19-05-14: Brad Burton, Community Development Director gave an overview of this Ordinance amending the Town of Lake Lure's Code of Ordinances, Chapter 40, "Streets and Sidewalks, " specifically § 40.21, formerly entitled "House Moving;" proposed to be re-titled as "Heavy/Oversize Loads, Moving of Houses of Modular Homes."

Mr. Burton requested the following minor changes be made:

- #5, page 52 of the Meeting Packet. Add "and a Public Works Director" to the General Requirements: A pre-transport meeting is required with the Community Development Director or assigns the Chief of Police, Fire Chief and Public Works Director.
- The other change is at the end, there should be a sentence that says, "Penalty, see section 10.99."

There was a general discussion regarding the proposed ordinance and the regulations.

Mayor Pro Tem John Moore asked if anyone had a public comment and noted that no one had signed up to speak during the Public Hearing. There were no public comments.

Commissioner Bob Cameron made a motion to close the Public Hearing for Ordinance No. 19-05-14A. Commissioner Stephen Webber seconded the motion and it carried 4-0.

Commissioner Bob Cameron made a motion to open the Public Hearing for Ordinance No. 19-05-14A. Commissioner John Kilby seconded the motion and it carried 4-0.

B. Ordinance No. 19-05-14A: Dean Givens, Parks, Recreation and Lake Director, gave an overview of the proposed ordinance amending the Town of Lake Lure's Code of Ordinances, Chapter 81, "Animals," specifically § 81.02C adding the Dittmer Watts Nature Trail (Tax Pin 1649620) to the list of Town properties where leash restraints are required for dogs. He advised that there had been two recent incidents involving dogs that were not on leashes. He explained that these incidents prompted a discussion about proposing an amendment to this ordinance to expand the areas that require dogs to be on a leash to protect those that were visiting our Town.

Mr Givens stated that the amendment was recommended by the Parks and Recreation Board by a narrow vote. He added that the primary reason for the proposed amendment was to ensure that those visiting Lake Lure felt safe. Mr. Baldwin, Town Manager, asked for a summary of the dissenting views from the Parks and Recreation Board. Mr. Givens provided a summary stating that some Board members preferred allowing dogs to run free of a leash in some areas, such as parks. Mr. Baldwin stated that the proposed amendment was to ensure dogs were on a leash in parks that were within Town Limits and not those parks outside Town Limits. Commissioner Webber asked about the liability and Town Attorney, William Morgan, stated that liability was generally for the dog owner in these situations. He added that if there proved to be a problem, there may be a duty to take further action, but he was not aware of any penalties for Towns that do not have a leash law. Police Chief Sean Humphries added a synopsis of the two recent incidents that prompted the proposed amendment. Mr. Givens and Council members had a discussion about concerns on both sides of the issue. It was noted that some members of the Parks and Recreation Board were not present for the last Board meeting when the proposed amendment was being discussed. Mayor Pro Tem John Moore recommended that the proposed amendment go back to the Parks and Recreation Board for further review and discussion with all the Board members represented so that a thoughtful decision could be made. Commissioner John Kilby recommended that the Town Attorney, William Morgan, also look into this proposed ordinance further.

Mayor Pro Tem acknowledged Maria Diorio as she asked to make a Public Comment. She stated her name and said that she lived at 145 Neighborly Drive. She stated that she was a dog owner and she keeps her dog on a leash. She said that her husband frequently takes her dog on walks in Dittmer Watts Park and the problem occurs when dogs that are not on a leash, approach her dog. She is concerned that these dogs might be injured by her dog as he is not as socialized. She said that she spoke with her veterinarian, Dr. Lisa Shumate, about this issue. She said she would be happy to speak with any one about this issue and she advocates for the Leash Law. She added that this is another reason to create a dog park that is being considered. Mayor Pro Tem John Moore and the Commissioners agreed that this was a very controversial subject and that they wanted to be sure to make a thoughtful decision with further input from the Parks and Recreation Board and the Town Attorney.

Mayor Pro Tem John Moore asked if anyone else had a public comment. Hearing none, Commissioner Bob Cameron made a motion to close the Public Hearing. Commissioner John Kilby seconded the motion and it carried 4-0.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

A. PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. 19-5-14: ORDINANCE AMENDING THE TOWN OF LAKE LURE CODE OF ORDINANCES, CHAPTER 40, "STREETS AND SIDEWALKS"

Proposed Ordinance No. 19-05-14: An Ordinance Amending the Town of Lake Lure's Code of Ordinances, Chapter 40, "Streets and Sidewalks, " specifically § 40.21, formerly entitled "House Moving;" proposed to be re-titled as "Heavy/Oversize Loads, Moving of Houses of Modular Homes."

Commissioner Bob Cameron made a motion to approve Ordinance No. 19-05-14, Chapter 40, "Streets and Sidewalks". Commissioner Stephen Webber seconded the motion with the clarification that the ordinance be approved as amended during the Public Hearing and it carried 4-0.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

B. PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO 19-05-14A: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE TOWN OF LAKE LURE CODE OF ORDINANCES, CHAPTER 81, "ANIMALS"

Proposed Ordinance No. 19-05-14A: An Ordinance Amending the Town of Lake Lure's Code of Ordinances, Chapter 81, "Animals," specifically § 81.02C, adding all Town Parks to the list of Town properties where leash restraints are required for dogs.

Commissioner Bob Cameron made a motion to defer a decision on Ordinance No. 19-05-14A, Chapter 81 "Animals" until hearing further input from the Parks and Recreation Board and the attorney next month. Commissioner Stephen Webber seconded the motion with one amendment to the text that is presented. He noted that all discussions on this issue stipulated that the proposed amendment was pertaining to parks within the Town limits, but the proposed ordinance does not clearly make this distinction and he advised that it should be amended. Deferring this amended item until the next month with input from the Parks and Recreation Board and the attorney carried 4-0.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

# C. CONSIDER REDIFININGFULL PONDAS 990.5 MEAN SEA LEVEL (MSL)

Mr. Baldwin, Town Manager, noted that in 1927 when they originally measured the elevation of Lake Lure's Full Pond it was at 990 MSL. He stated that they used a certain method to calculate the elevation and today when we take this measurement, the calculation is 990.5. He added that the practical application of changing full pond to 990.5 is that the Town will use this new MSL to allow us to maintain lake levels and ensure that boats do not have difficulty getting in and out. He asked David Arrowood, Public Works Director, to speak to the impact of this change on running the generator. Mr. Arrowood explained that this change will allow his team to work within 24 inches below the boat and this will now be 990.5. He added that this change cuts off a small area that we are generating from and noted that the minute the generator is turned on, we draw from the full pond. There was a discussion about the attention to detail with lake levels that has been achieved from having three shifts of operators attending to the lake levels.

Mr. Baldwin asked Dustin Waycaster, Fire Chief/Emergency Management Coordinator to provide input on this tiopic. He added that as this recommended change was being considered, the Town consulted Schnabel Engineering. He stated that they had a discussion about water overflowing the top of the dam and they reported that this would not be a problem as the dam was designed to allow water to flow across the top of the flood gates if necessary. Chief Waycaster stated that at any time that water was allowed to overflow across the top of the flood gates, the water would flow across all three buttresses. Mr. Baldwin added that there had been a concern about this circumstance and they were pleased to hear from the engineers that this would not be a problem if we had this experience. Mr. Waycaster added that it would not be our intention to do this, but we were pleased to learn that the dam could withstand overflowing water, if this occurred.

Mr. Baldwin then asked Brad Burton, Community Development Director, to provide his input regarding the calculations for MSL. He stated that he was confident in the calculations based on his assessment as the Lake Structures point of contact.

Mayor Pro Tem John Moore recommended we try this change for a couple of months and see how it goes before making a definitive change.

Commissioner Stephen Webber led a discussion regarding Budget Amendment # 247- To complete two custom repair projects started by Clifton Power Co. Replacement of custom made Tainter Gate Cables-(\$11,892) Installation of Electric Motor on Tainter Gate #1. (\$3,502.58). This change would alter the description from Propane Tank (#533) to Tainter Gate Repairs and budgeted amounts change from \$25,000 to \$15,500 (balance of \$9,500 moves to Fund Balance). He noted that this amendment leaves a balance of \$9,500 and recommended that these funds be held in the account until the project is complete as these projects are often come in over budget. He asked Sam Karr, Finance Director, if this could be done. Mr Karr confirmed that the funds could remain in the account, if additional funds were required to complete the project.

Commissioner Bob Cameron asked if the remaining funds (\$9,500) could be used to purchase a shed for the dam gate operators. Mayor Pro Tem John Moore recommended that David Arrowood obtain an estimate for the shed before the Budget Workshop scheduled for 5/23/19.

Commissioner Stephen Webber made a motion to approve the budget amendment with the understanding that the balance of \$9,500 would remain in the account until the project was completed. Commissioner Bob Cameron seconded the motion and it carried 4-0.

With no further business, Commissioner Bob Cameron made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 6:34 p.m. Commissioner John Kilby seconded and the motion carried 4-0.

# Brief History of Lake Lure

Creating a resort community in Western NC was the vision of Dr. Lucius B. Morse in the arrly 1900's. Soliciting the financial backing of his brothers, Hiram and Asabel, Dr. Morse purchased Chimney Rock (400 acres) from Jerome Freeman in 1902 for \$5,000. In 1916, Chimney Rock Company was formed by the Morse brothers and construction of Chimney Rock Park began. The company acquired enough acreage (in what is now the Lake Lure area) to bring the total to 8,000 acres, including the valley in which Lake Lure lies and the hills and mountains above.

Morse's vision of a fine resort with the lake and a host of recreational amenities began to take shape in 1923 when he recruited executives of Rutherford County's textile companies and major industries; local and regional banks; and founders of Rutherford's Hospital, to became his partners, forming Chimney Rock Mountains, Inc. The company hired E.S. Draper, a nationally respected landscape architect to help bring their vision to life. The centerpiece of the resort was to be a lake created by impounding the Rocky Broad River at Tumbling Shoals. The idea of building a dam on the Rocky Broad River to create a lake and year-round resort was conceived. Carolina Mountain Power Company, all of whose common stock was owned by Chimney Rock Mountains Inc., was formed. The construction of the dam began in 1925, under the guidance of Mees & Mees, an Engineering firm from Charlotte. NC.

In return for stock, Chimney Rock Mountains, Inc. deeded the land and easements for the site of the dam and powerhouse to the power company, including all of the inundated area of Lake Lure and ground for transmission lines to the dam. The remainder of the 8,000 acres continued in the ownership of Chimney Rock Mountains,

Development of the resort was funded by a \$1,000,000 first mortgage with the Bird Mortgage Company of Asheville, NC. The United States Fidelity and Guaranty Company of Baltimore, MD acquired this mortgage, which was secured by the remaining property. The Carolina Mountain Power Company financed construction of the dam that impounded Lake Lure through a \$550,000 first mortgage with Stroud & Company of Philadelphia, PA. This mortgage was secured by the property owned by the Carolina Mountain Power Company including the land on which the dam was constructed, as well as the land inundated by Lake Lure.

The dam was completed in September 1926 and the lake began rising. The full impoundment of Lake Lure was completed in 1927. At ordinary water levels, Lake Lure covers approximately 800 acres and has a shoreline of approximately 27 miles.

The power plant began operations in 1928 with the sale of electricity under a 10-year contract to Blue Ridge Power Co., the predecessor of Duke Power Co. The Town of Lake Lure continues even today to contract with Duke Energy for the sale of electricity.

# Lake Lure Infrastructure Priorities

The Town of Lake Lure has been working to assess and rebuild infrastructure to better serve residents, business owners and visitors in the Hickory Nut Gorge. The Gorge is home to Chimney Rock State Park, the Town of Lake Lure, Chimney Rock Village, Bat Cave, Gerton and Bills Creek. It covers portions of three counties: Henderson, Buncombe and Rutherford. Chimney Rock State Park accommodates over 260,000 visitors each year.

The Town tax base decreased by 4% in 2019. The Town looses tax base as more land is added to the State Park, located within the jurisdiction of the Town of Lake Lure.

The primary infrastructure needs include:

1) Dam Renovation: Our nearly 100 year old dam creates our 800 acre lake, an essential part of the Chimney Rock State Park view shed. The dam needs renovation according to NCDEQ - Dam Safety Office to meet today's standards. Immediate action must be taken by the Town.

Estimated cost: \$50 million

Need: The Town of Lake Lure is requesting financial support to meet State requirements and better serve surrounding communities.

2) Sewer System Replacement: A new environmentally sensitive land-based, low-pressure sewage collection system and waste water treatment plant need to be constructed to meet requirements of NCDEQ - Division of Water Resources. A modernized sewer system is needed to serve Chimney Rock State Park and the Hickory Nut Gorge. Immediate action must be taken by the Town.

Estimated cost: \$25 million

Need: The Town of Lake Lure is requesting financial support to meet State requirements and better serve the surrounding communities.

3) New State Park Egress: Chimney Rock State Park plans to build an exit into Lake Lure's Town Center. We must plan for the critical rerouting of traffic for the 262,000 visitors of the State Park to ensure safe access. Additionally, we need to ensure effective traffic movement and maximize opportunity for Town Center redevelopment to increase the local tax base.

Estimated cost: To be determined

Need: The Town of Lake Lure is requesting NC elected officials appropriate sufficient funds to ensure State and community goals are met successfully and appoint a stakeholder committee with Town, State Park and NCDOT representation to address coordination of this important project.

the Lake to maintain invaluable State resource that sits at the bottom of a 95 square-mile watershed covering parts of Buncombe, Henderson, and Rutherford and McDowell Counties. A total of 48 water courses empty directly into Lake Lure, including the Broad River, and each continually deposits silt, sediment, and gravel which must be continually removed. Storm events intensely increase sediment loads and are seemingly becoming more frequent, based on changing weather patterns.

Cost: \$5 million (one time cost) and \$500 thousand annually thereafter.

- 2. All financing contracts and all related documents for the closing of the financing ("the Financing Documents") shall be consistent with the following terms. All officers and employees of the Town are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver any Financing Documents, and to take all such further action as they may consider necessary or desirable, to carry out the financing of the 4 Vehicles as contemplated by the proposal and resolution.
- The Finance Officer is hereby authorized and directed to hold executed copies of the Financing Documents until the conditions for delivery of the Financing Documents have been completed to such officer's satisfaction. The Finance Officer is authorized to approve changes to any Financing Documents previously signed by Town officers or employees, provided that such changes shall not substantially alter the intent of such documents or certificates from the intent expressed in the forms executed by such officers. The Financing Documents shall in the final forms as the Finance Officer shall approve, with the Finance Officer's release of any Financing Document for delivery constituting conclusive evidence of such officer's final approval of the Document's final form.
- 4. The Town shall not take or omit to take any action the taking or omission of which shall cause its interest payments in this financing to be includable in the gross income for federal income tax purposes of the registered owners of the interest payment obligations. The Town hereby designates its obligations to make principle and

interest payments under the Financing Documents as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" for the purpose of Internal Revenue Code Section 265(b)(3).

The Town intends that the funds that have been advanced, or that may be advanced, from the Town's general fund for project costs may be reimbursed from the financing proceeds.

### CAPTIAL PROJECT ORDINANCE

# OF THE TOWN OF LAKE LURE TOWN COUNCIL

BE IT ORDAINED by the Governing Board of the Town of Lake Lure, which, pursuant to Section 13.2 of Chapter 159 of the General Statues of North Carolina, the following capital project ordinance is hereby adopted:

**Section 1**. The project is to build a low-pressure force main sewer system adjacent to the perimeter of Lake Lure. This project will include approximately 160,000 linear feet of low pressure force main around the lake to the Town of Lake Lure Wastewater Treatment Plant. Individual pump stations will be installed as needed at each existing residence with two community pump stations at the Chimney Rock and Rumbling Bald connections. The WWTP will be upgraded either on-site, or a new pre-engineered plant at a new remote site to new projected flows and meet the Town's permitted discharge limits.

Section 2. The officers of the Town of Lake Lure are hereby directed to proceed with the capital project within the terms of the council's resolution, loan documents, grants and the budget contained herein.

### **ORDINANCE NUMBER 19-05-14A**

# AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING LEASH REQUIREMENTS FOR DOGS ON TOWN OWNED PROPERTY; AMENDING CHAPTER 81 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE TOWN OF LAKE LURE

WHEREAS, Article 8 of Chapter 160A of the North Carolina General Statutes, N.C.G.S. 160A-174, et seq., delegates to municipalities the regulation of domestic animals; and

WHEREAS, on July 10, 2012 the Lake Lure Town Council amended §81.02 of the Code of Ordinances of the Town of Lake Lure to include a leash requirement on specified properties; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Lake Lure Parks and Recreation Board has recommended modifications to the Code of Ordinances of the Town of Lake Lure in an effort to ensure public safety; and

WHEREAS, the Lake Lure Town Council finds that it is in the public interest to amend Chapter 81 of the Town's Code of Ordinances to provide regulations to include additional Town owned property; and

WHEREAS, the Lake Lure Town Council, after due notice, conducted a public hearing on the 14th day of May 2019, upon the question of amending the Town Code in this respect.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF LAKE LURE, NORTH CAROLINA, MEETING IN REGULAR SESSION AND WITH A MAJORITY OF THE COUNCIL MEMBERS VOTING IN THE AFFIRMATIVE:

**SECTION ONE.** §81.02(C) of the Code of Ordinances of the Town of Lake Lure, entitled "Dangerous Dogs; Barking, Leash Requirements" is hereby amended as noted below. Throughout this Ordinance additions to text are designated by underlining, whereas deletions are designated by the use of strike-through.

# § 81.02 DANGEROUS DOGS; BARKING; LEASH REQUIREMENTS.

- (C) It shall be unlawful for any person owning, having possession, charge, care, custody or control of a dog to allow such dog to enter <u>any</u> town owned parcels that <u>includeing</u>, <u>but not limited to</u>, Lake Lure Town Hall, Washburn Marina, <u>and-Morse Park, and Dittmer Watts Nature Trail (Tax Pins 1648621, 1648652, and 1604697)</u>, without being properly restrained by a leash. This subsection shall apply to all dogs with the following exceptions:
  - (1) Dogs used or being trained for law enforcement by law enforcement officials
  - (2) Service animals, as defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act, used by authorized persons and under the control of such persons
  - (3) Dogs in specified off-leash areas as designated by the Town of Lake Lure

As has been stated numerous times throughout the process, the Town will not move into the design phase with engineers until the Engineering Report (ER) is complete and DEQ is satisfied with the ER. Brown Consultants recently (June 6, 2019) submitted the third version of the ER to DEQ in an effort to comply with comments/feedback expressed by DEQ. The Geo Technical work is being performed now at the request of the Town to "ground truth" the construction cost estimated by Brown Consultants, PA. The estimated construction costs sets the stage the financing/funding/loan procurement phase of the process.

The Utility Advisory Board recommends Town Council approve the latest Brown Consultants proposal with the stipulation that the \$80,000 be clearly divided into two categories each with conditions as follows:

- 1. Up to \$50,000 for Geo Technical Work The UAB wants at least two bids for the Geo Technical work and wants to inspect the bids received. Any unused portion of the \$50,000 will come back to the Town as a savings/credit. The UAB also wants a preliminary phase added to the Geo Technical Work that entails David Arrowood working with local contractor in addition a representative of Brown Consultants to locate on a map (in the ER depicting line sizes) where rock is/is not known. The UAB wants to make it clear that the Geo Technical work may not begin until David Arrowood gives the Geo Technical firm the newly created map and authorizes the firm to proceed.
- 2. \$30,000 for Updating the Engineering Report (ER) with Geo Technical findings and COMPLETING the ER to 100% The UAB wants Brown Consultants to give the Town a guarantee that the ER will be completed for a lump sum of \$30,000 regardless of the number of meetings it takes, numbers of comments received from the State, number of discussions with the State takes place, or the number of meetings/conferences with the Town (Council, UAB, Staff) needed to get the ER to the 100% COMPLETE level.
