

ORDINANCE NO. 74-14

AN ORDINANCE TO REQUIRE SALARIED EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY TO RETIRE UPON ATTAINING AGE SIXTY-FIVE (65), BUT MAY CONTINUE TO WORK UNTIL SEVENTY (70) YEARS OF AGE BY REQUESTING PERMISSION FROM THE CITY COMMISSIONERS AND OBTAINING SAID PERMISSION UPON A YEARLY BASIS, RETIREMENT TO BE COMPULSORY AT AGE SEVENTY (70).

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF MT. JULIET, TENNESSEE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. All regular salaried employees of the City of Mt. Juliet, Tennessee shall retire and cease their employment with the City upon attaining age sixty-five (65), except the Board of Commissioners may grant five (5) one-year terms of further employment, but only on request in writing by the employee and a letter signed by the three (3) Commissioners granting said request which shall be done yearly. The compulsory age for retirement shall be seventy (70) years of age and the City Commissioners will have no further power to permit an employee to work past his nearest payday upon attaining the age of seventy (70) years.

SECTION 2. That this Ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, the general welfare of the City of Mt. Juliet, Wilson County, Tennessee, requiring it.
