Additionally, we want to provide you with some information. In case you haven't heard/read/seen this before, we have included some helpful information for you.

STAY AT HOME ORDER: To mitigate the impact of COVID-19 and protect the capacity of New Jersey's health care system for the state's most vulnerable, Governor Phil Murphy on March 21 signed Executive Order No. 107 and Executive Order 108, directing all residents to stay at home until further notice. The order provides for certain exceptions, such as obtaining essential goods or services, seeking medical attention, visiting family or close friends, reporting to work, or engaging in outdoor activities.

SENIOR BUDDY PROGRAM: The Borough has started a "Senior Buddy" program as an outreach. We are connecting our seniors with borough employees who will be checking in with anyone who feels they may need a little help making it through this time. "Buddies" will have information available about grocery stores and pharmacy hours and food delivery, and will also just check in to brighten someone's day. In the event of a true emergency, please dial 911.

STAY CONNECTED: This is important! Call the people you care about - reach out to another club member or two - connect! Share a story, a joke, or a memory. Talk about ideas of how to fill the time. Make someone smile! If you have any ideas or good news, please share it with us too - leave a message at the center. We are all in this together!
