At the Traffic Advisory Commission meeting held on November 7, 2012, the Commission:

DENIED:

1) Request submitted by Robert Anderson to **INSTALL ALL WAY STOP SIGNS** at intersections of Edison Avenue and 72nd Street, Perry Avenue and 72nd Street and Perry Avenue and 77th Street.

The “Federal Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices” (MUTCD) guidelines warrant either five right angle or turning collision accidents in any twelve consecutive months or volumes of 300 + vehicles per hour on the major road and 200 + vehicles per hour on the minor road for any eight hours of the day. A study of these intersections revealed:

Accidents (right angle/turning collision):

77 th /Perry:	2008 – 1, 2009 – 0, 2010 – 0, 2011 – 0, 2012 (thru 11/1) – 1
72 nd /Perry:	2008 – 0, 2009 – 0, 2010 – 0, 2011 – 0, 2012 (thru 11/1) – 1
72 nd /Edison:	2008 – 1, 2009 – 1, 2010 – 1, 2011 – 0, 2012 (thru 11/1) – 2

Volumes:

77 th /Perry:	77 th – peak hour – 139; 8 th highest hour – 100 Perry – peak hour – 42; 8 th highest hour – 24
72 nd /Perry:	72 nd – peak hour – 180; 8 th highest hour – 104 Perry – peak hour – 21; 8 th highest hour – 11
72 nd /Edison:	72 nd – peak hour – 180; 8 th highest hour – 104 Edison – peak hour 50; 8 th highest hour - 26

In addition Police Traffic Captain Sal Pino said speeding was not an issue in these areas. These intersections fall far short of the MUTCD Minimum Warrants for the placement of “ALL WAY” stop signs. The homeowner at Perry Avenue and 77th Street (south east corner) will be contacted to trim high hedges which could obstruct sight. Therefore the Commission denied this request.

WHEREAS, the New York State Division of Parole has indicated a desire to move its office from its present location on Third Street to another area; and

WHEREAS, since Third Street is a destination for tourists and others who seek entertainment, this City Council supports a move to a different location; and

WHEREAS, this City Council understands that several suitable sites are being considered, including a building in the vicinity of Sixth Street and Walnut Avenue.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Niagara Falls, supports the removal of State parole operations from Third Street to another suitable location in the City as determined by the Division of Parole including a building in the vicinity of Sixth Street and Walnut Avenue; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this Resolution be forwarded to New York State Senator George Mazarz, New York State Assemblyman John Ceretto and Barbara Gray, Real Estate Project Manager, New York State Office of General Services.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Niagara Falls desires to abandon a portion of the alley running east-west between Third Streets and Fourth Streets, South of Rainbow Boulevard and North of Buffalo Avenue in order to facilitate the development of the real estate; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board of the City of Niagara Falls, at its meeting on November 14, 2012, approved the abandonment of a portion of the aforementioned alley (a copy of the Planning Board resolution is attached hereto); and

WHEREAS, the City Council did, by resolution, give notice of its intention to abandon a portion of the aforementioned alley and did direct the City Clerk to publish notice of such intention and that a public hearing would be held by the City Council at its meeting to be held in the Council Chambers on November 26, 2012 at 7:00 p.m. standard daylight time and advise that all persons interested would be heard there on that said time and place; and

WHEREAS, the hearing was duly held on November 26, 2012 at 7:00 p.m. standard daylight time in regards to said abandonment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Niagara Falls, New York, that a portion of the alley running east-west between Third Street and Fourth Street, South of Rainbow Boulevard and North of Buffalo Avenue is hereby abandoned, the said abandoned alley portion subject, however, to reservation of right of and for the City of Niagara Falls, the Niagara Falls Water Board and any utility companies, their successors and assigns to use, maintain, repair, replace and continue to maintain their services and operations in said abandoned alley. The said alley portion is bounded and described as follows:

Commencing at the point of intersection of the south line of the alley running east-west between Third and Fourth Streets, south of Rainbow Boulevard and north of Buffalo Avenue with the west line of Fourth Street; thence westerly along the south line of said alley a distance of 217.8 feet to a point, which is also the point of intersection, of said south line with the west line of SBL 159.53-1-12.2; thence north at a 90 degree angle a distance of 27 feet to a point on the north line of said alley, thence easterly to the point of intersection of said north alley line with the west line of Fourth Street, thence south along the west line of Fourth Street a distance of 27 feet to the point and place of beginning; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the abandonment of the alley is contingent upon the successful closing of a certain real estate contract dated October 9, 2012 by the between Frank Deni and JFD Holdings LP and Plati Niagara Inc.; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution be filed in the Office of the Clerk of the County of Niagara and that the Mayor may sign deeds or other documents desirable to effectuate this abandonment.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of Niagara Falls, New York that Chapter 252 of the Codified Ordinances entitled "Public Works Fees and Fire Protection Special Assessments" is hereby adopted as attached hereto.

CHAPTER 252 PUBLIC WORKS FEES AND FIRE PROTECTION SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS

252.01 SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS FOR FIRE DEPARTMENT CALLS

- (a) There shall be a fee for every call made to a specific location or address by the Niagara Falls Fire Department. The amount of the fee is set forth in the fee schedule at 252.02
- (b) The fees shall be charged to the owner of the real property to which the Department responds. The fees shall apply only to the Seneca Niagara Casino Complex, including the hotel, parking lots and associated properties, Niagara Falls State Park, Whirlpool State Park, Devils Hole State Park or to any other real property which is wholly exempt from real property taxation and is not subject to a payment in lieu of tax agreement.

252.02 AMOUNT OF FIRE DEPARTMENT CALL FEES

(a) Fees For Hazardous Material Calls

- i. Multiple Apparatus Hazardous Material Response. \$528.00 per hour for Multiple Apparatus Response. If the response lasts more than an hour, an additional \$528.00 will be assessed per hour after the initial response hour. Multiple apparatus response includes 2-Fire Engines, 1-Ladder Truck, 1-Rescue Vehicle and 1- Command Vehicle. Any additional vehicles called to scene will be an additional cost of \$224.00 for each additional Ladder Truck or Fire Engine, \$74.00 for each additional Command Vehicle, \$53.00 for each additional Rescue Vehicle all at per hour rate at time and a half for manpower. Fire Chief responding to scene \$40.34 per hour or any Office staff responding will be billed at their Ranks wage per hour.
- ii. Single Apparatus Hazardous Material Response. \$148.00 per hour for Single Apparatus Response (Fire Engine or Fire Truck). If the response lasts more than an hour an additional \$148.00 will be assessed per hour after the initial hour. If additional apparatus is called to the scene to assist it will be at a rate of \$224.00 per Fire Engine, Fire Truck, and \$74.00 for a Command Vehicle or \$73.00 for Rescue Vehicle all at per hour rate at time and a half for man power. Fire Chief responding to scene \$40.34 per hour or any Office Staff responding will be billed at their Ranks wage per hour.

(b) Fees For False Alarms.

- i. Multiple Apparatus False Alarm Response. \$528.00 per hour for Multiple Apparatus Response. If the response lasts more than an hour, an additional \$528.00 will be assessed per hour after the initial response hour. Multiple

apparatus response includes 2-Fire Engines, 1-Ladder Truck, 1-Rescue Vehicle and 1- Command Vehicle. Any additional vehicles called to scene will be an additional cost of \$224.00 for each additional Ladder Truck or Fire Engine, \$74.00 for each additional Command Vehicle, \$53.00 for each additional Rescue Vehicle all at per hour rate at time and a half for manpower. Fire Chief responding to scene \$40.34 per hour or any Office staff responding will be billed at their Ranks wage per hour.

- ii. Single Apparatus False Alarm Response. \$148.00 per hour for Single Apparatus Response (Fire Engine or Fire Truck). If the response lasts more than an hour an additional \$148.00 will be assessed per hour after the initial hour. If additional apparatus is called to the scene to assist it will be at a rate of \$224.00 per Fire Engine, Fire Truck, and \$74.00 for a Command Vehicle or \$53.00 for Rescue Vehicle all at per hour rate at time and a half for man power. Fire Chief responding to scene \$40.34 per hour or any Office Staff responding will be billed at their Ranks wage per hour.

(c) Fees For Emergency Medical Calls. \$148.00 per hour for Single Apparatus Response (Fire Engine or Fire Truck). If the response lasts more than an hour an additional \$148.00 will be assessed per hour after the initial hour. If additional apparatus is called to the scene to assist it will be at a rate of \$224.00 per Fire Engine, Fire Truck, and \$74.00 for a Command Vehicle or \$73.00 for Rescue Vehicle all at per hour rate at time and a half for man power. Fire Chief responding to scene \$40.34 per hour or any Office Staff responding will be billed at their Ranks wage per hour.

(d) Fees For Lockouts. \$148.00 per hour for Single Apparatus Response (Fire Engine or Fire Truck). If the response lasts more than an hour an additional \$148.00 will be assessed per hour after the initial hour. (If additional apparatus is called to the scene to assist it will be at a rate of \$224.00 per Fire Engine, Fire Truck, and \$74.00 for a Command Vehicle or \$73.00 for Rescue Vehicle all at per hour rate at time and a half for man power. Fire Chief responding to scene \$40.34 per hour or any Office Staff responding will be billed at their Ranks wage per hour.

(e) Fees For Rescues (Including But Not Limited to High Angle Rescues and Elevator Rescues)

- i. Multiple Apparatus Rescue Response. \$528.00 per hour for Multiple Apparatus Response. If the response lasts more than an hour, an additional \$528.00 will be assessed per hour after the initial response hour. If additional apparatus is called to the scene to assist it will be at a rate of \$224.00 per Fire Engine, Fire Truck, and \$74.00 for a Command Vehicle or \$73.00 for Rescue Vehicle all at per hour rate at time and a half for man power. Fire Chief responding to scene \$40.34 per hour or any Office Staff responding will be billed at their Ranks wage per hour.

- ii. Single Apparatus Rescue Response. \$148.00 per hour for Single Apparatus Response (Fire Engine or Fire Truck). If the response lasts more than an hour an additional \$148.00 will be assessed per hour after the initial hour. If additional apparatus is called to the scene to assist it will be at a rate of \$224.00 per Fire Engine, Fire Truck, and \$74.00 for a Command Vehicle or \$73.00 for Rescue Vehicle all at per hour rate at time and a half for man power. Fire Chief responding to scene \$40.34 per hour or any Office Staff responding will be billed at their Ranks wage per hour.

(f) Fees For Assistance Calls. Single Apparatus Rescue Response. \$148.00 per hour for Single Apparatus Response (Fire Engine or Fire Truck). If the response lasts more than an hour an additional \$148.00 will be assessed per hour after the initial hour. If additional apparatus is called to the scene to assist it will be at a rate of \$224.00 per Fire Engine, Fire Truck, and \$74.00 for a Command Vehicle or \$73.00 for Rescue Vehicle all at per hour rate at time and a half for man power.

Fire Chief responding to scene \$40.34 per hour or any Office Staff responding will be billed at their Ranks wage per hour.

(g) Fees For Smoke Odor Investigations. Single Apparatus Rescue Response. \$148.00 per hour for Single Apparatus Response (Fire Engine or Fire Truck). If the response lasts more than an hour an additional \$148.00 will be assessed per hour after the initial hour. If additional apparatus is called to the scene to assist it will be at a rate of \$224.00 per Fire Engine, Fire Truck, and \$74.00 for a Command Vehicle or \$73.00 for Rescue Vehicle all at per hour rate at time and a half for man power. Fire Chief responding to scene \$40.34 per hour or any Office Staff responding will be billed at their Ranks wage per hour.

(h) Fees For Building Fires.

i. Multiple Apparatus Building Fires Response. \$528.00 per hour for Multiple Apparatus Response. If the response lasts more than an hour, an additional \$528.00 will be assessed per hour after the initial response hour. If additional apparatus is called to the scene to assist it will be at a rate of \$224.00 per Fire Engine, Fire Truck, and \$74.00 for a Command Vehicle or \$73.00 for Rescue Vehicle all at per hour rate at time and a half for man power. Fire Chief responding to scene \$40.34 per hour or any Office Staff responding will be billed at their Ranks wage per hour.

ii. Single Apparatus Building Fire Response. \$148.00 per hour for Single Apparatus Response (Fire Engine or Fire Truck). If the response lasts more than an hour an additional \$148.00 will be assessed per hour after the initial hour. If additional apparatus is called to the scene to assist it will be at a rate of \$224.00 per Fire Engine, Fire Truck, and \$74.00 for a Command Vehicle or \$73.00 for Rescue Vehicle all at per hour rate at time and a half for man power. Fire Chief responding to scene \$40.34 per hour or any Office Staff responding will be billed at their Ranks wage per hour.

(i) Fees For Vehicle Fires. Multiple Apparatus Response. \$331.00 per hour for Multiple Apparatus Response. If the response lasts more than an hour, an additional \$331.00 will be assessed per hour after the initial response hour. If additional apparatus is called to the scene to assist it will be at a rate of \$224.00 per Fire Engine, Fire Truck, and \$74.00 for a Command Vehicle or \$73.00 for Rescue Vehicle all at per hour rate at time and a half for man power. Fire Chief responding to scene \$40.34 per hour or any Office Staff responding will be billed at their Ranks wage per hour.

(j) Fees For Rubbish Fires. Single Apparatus Response. \$148.00 per hour for Single Apparatus Response (Fire Engine or Fire Truck). If the response lasts more than an hour an additional \$148.00 will be assessed per hour after the initial hour. If additional apparatus is called to the scene to assist it will be at a rate of \$224.00 per Fire Engine, Fire Truck, and \$74.00 for a Command Vehicle or \$73.00 for Rescue Vehicle all at per hour rate at time and a half for man power. Fire Chief responding to scene \$40.34 per hour or any Office Staff responding will be billed at their Ranks wage per hour.

(k) Fees For Materials or Damaged Equipment. Materials used or equipment that was damaged while responding or on the emergency scene will be billed to property owner at current replacement cost plus shipping. Equipment that can be repaired will be billed at cost for parts and labor to property owner.

252.03 SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS FOR PUBLIC WORKS SERVICES

(a) There shall be a fee for every public works service made to a specific location or address. The amount of the fee is set forth in the fee schedule at 252.04

(b) The fees shall be charged to the owner of the real property or adjacent to the location to which the Department of Public Works responds. The fees shall be charged to the owner of the real property to which the Department responds. The fees shall apply only to the Seneca Niagara Casino Complex, including the hotel, parking lots and associated properties, Niagara Falls State Park, Whirlpool State Park,

252.05. EXEMPTIONS FROM ASSESSMENTS

- (a) The fees set forth in this chapter shall not apply or be charged to residential real property.
- (b) The fees set forth in this chapter shall not apply or be charged to real property exempt from real property taxation under Article 4, Title 2 of the Real Property Tax Law, including real property held for religious, charitable, hospital, educational, or moral or mental improvement of men, women or children purposes.
- (c) The fees set forth in this chapter shall not apply to taxable non-residential real property which is not wholly exempt from real property taxation or is subject to a payment in lieu of tax agreement.

252.06. ENFORCEMENT

- (a) The Fire Chief and the Director of Public Works shall cause a report for each fire department call made or public works service provided to a property to which fees are to be charged under this Chapter to be made to the City Controller. The City Controller shall bill the owner of the real property to which the call made service is provided for the fire protection fees or public works services fees established under this Chapter.
- (b) On or after October 15 of each year, the City Controller shall report to the City Council all unpaid fire protection fees or public works fees, whereupon the City Council shall order each unpaid fees to be assessed against the real property to which the fire call was made or the public works service was provided.

NIAGARA FALLS LOCAL LAW NO. _____ FOR THE YEAR 2012

A Local Law to amend the Niagara Falls City Charter as amended, by amending Section 294-a of Article XI by amending the Board of Library Trustees from five (5) members to not less than Five (5) members nor more than Nine (9) members.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NIAGARA FALLS, NEW YORK, as follows:

Section 1. The Niagara Falls City Charter, as amended, is hereby amended by amending Section 294-a to read as follows:

ARTICLE XI

LIBRARY BOARD

SECTION 294-a. **[Five]** **Not less than Five (5) members nor more than Nine (9)** members of the Board of Library Trustees, appointed as hereinbefore provided, shall hereafter constitute the Board of Library Trustees. Subject to the provisions of this act, said Board shall have power and it shall be their duty to maintain a free public library, to provide rooms for their use, to employ librarians and other employees and to have the care and supervision of the library building and rooms and the books and other publications belonging thereto and to superintend the letting out and return thereof and to exercise the same discretion as to disposition of the moneys provided by law for the purchase of libraries as is conferred upon the inhabitants of school districts, and to elect from its members a president, clerk and such other officers as it may by resolution determine. The records of the proceedings of said Board or a transcript thereof, certified by its president and clerk, shall be received in all courts and places as prima facie evidence of the facts therein stated. (As added by L. 1917, Ch. 442; Amended L.L. 1959, No. 2.)

Section 2. This Local Law shall take effect as provided in the Municipal Home Rule Law.
