

**AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE
CITY OF NIAGARA FALLS AND NIAGARA FALLS HOUSING AUTHORITY**

THIS AGREEMENT made the _____ day of September, 2020, between the **NIAGARA FALLS HOUSING AUTHORITY**, a body corporate organized October 19, 1934, pursuant to Article 5 of the State Housing Law (hereinafter, "NFHA"), and the **CITY OF NIAGARA FALLS, NEW YORK**, a municipal corporation organized and existing pursuant to the Laws of the State of New York (hereinafter, "CITY"), collectively known as the "Parties".

WITNESSETH:

The Parties herein, each in consideration of the Agreement on the part and behalf of the other herein contained, have mutually agreed, for their selves and/or their successors and assigns, as follows:

1. CITY agrees to purchase the services from NFHA which are delineated in the "Scope of Services" which is attached hereto as Schedule "A" and incorporated by reference, subject to all the terms and conditions contained or incorporated herein.
2. Term. The initial term of this Agreement is July 1, 2020 and it terminates on December 31, 2023 unless otherwise terminated as provided herein. Upon the expiration of the initial term, the Agreement shall be automatically renewed continuously for one-year terms unless otherwise terminated as provided herein.
3. Payment Limit. Commencing July 1, 2020, CITY shall pay NFHA the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) per month, in equal installments, on the first day of each month through December 31, 2020. Commencing January 1, 2021, CITY's total payments to NFHA under this Agreement shall be Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000.00) per year. Payment shall be made in full by the CITY to the NFHA on or before the 31st of January of each year.
4. NFHA's Obligations. NFHA shall provide those services and carry out that work described in the "Scope of Services", attached hereto as Schedule "A", and incorporated herein by reference, subject to all the terms and conditions contained or incorporated herein.
5. CITY's Obligations. CITY shall make to NFHA those payments described in Paragraph "3" above. The CITY agrees to, within reason, cooperate and assist the NFHA in the transition, implementation, and operation of the obligations listed in the Scope of Services.
6. Compliance with Law. NFHA shall be subject to and comply with all Federal, State and local laws and regulations applicable with respect to its performance under this Agreement, including but not limited to, licensing, employment and purchasing practices; and wages, hours and conditions of employment.

7. Inspection. NFHA's performance, place of business and records pertaining to this Agreement are subject to monitoring, inspection, review and audit by authorized representatives of the CITY, the State of New York, and the United States Government.
8. Records. NFHA shall keep and make available for inspection and copying by authorized representatives of the CITY, the State of New York, and the United States Government, the NFHA's regular business records and such additional records pertaining to this Agreement as may be required by the CITY.

NFHA shall retain all documents pertaining to this Agreement for a period of five years following the termination of this Agreement (or for any further period that is required by law) and until all Federal or State audits are complete and exceptions resolved for this Agreement's funding period. Upon request, NFHA shall make these record available to authorized representatives of the CITY, the State of New York, and the United States Government.

9. Reporting Requirements. NFHA shall include in all documents or written reports completed and submitted to CITY in accordance with this Agreement a separate section listing the numbers and dollar amounts of all Agreements and subcontracts relating to the preparation of each such document or written report.

10. Termination.

- a. Written Notice. This Agreement may be terminated by either party, at their sole discretion, upon ninety (90) day advance written notice thereof to the other, and may be canceled immediately by written mutual consent.
- b. Failure to Perform. This Agreement may be terminated, as follows:
 - i. by either party, after thirty (30) days prior written notice if the other party remains in default of this Agreement and the default has not been cured after thirty (30) days;
 - ii. by the CITY with thirty (30) days prior written notice, if NFHA is unable to obtain, maintain, or otherwise forfeits or cancels any required approval(s) or the issuance of a license or permit by any agency, board, court or other government authority necessary for the performance of the obligations under this Agreement;
- c. Cessation of Funding. Notwithstanding Paragraph 10(a) and 10(b) above, in the event that Federal, State, or other non-CITY funding for this Agreement ceases, this Agreement may be terminated immediately by the CITY upon written notice.
- d. Consensual. The CITY and NFHA may agree, in writing, to terminate this agreement at any time.

11. Attachments. The following attachments are incorporated herein by reference, subject to all terms and conditions contained or incorporated herein. If there are any conflicts between the terms and conditions set forth in the Agreement herein and the terms and conditions set forth in the attached documents, the terms and conditions set forth in the attached documents shall take precedence and shall prevail.

- b. Schedule B – General Conditions for Non-Construction Agreements Sections I (HUD-5370-C).
- c. Schedule C – Certifications and Representations of Offerors (HUD-5369-C)
- d. Schedule D - HUD Form-Certifications Regarding Debarment and Suspension (HUD- 2992)

12. Entire Agreement. This Agreement contains all the terms and conditions agreed upon by the parties. Except as expressly provided herein, no other understandings, oral or otherwise, regarding the subject matter of this Agreement shall be deemed to exist or to bind any of the parties hereto.

13. Further Specifications for Operating Procedures. Detailed specifications of operating procedures and budgets required by this Agreement, including but not limited to, monitoring, auditing, billing, or regulatory changes, may be developed and set forth in written Information Agreements between the NFHA and the CITY. Such Information Agreements shall be designated as such and shall not be amendments to this Agreement except to the extent that they further detail or clarify that which is already required hereunder. Such Information Agreements may not enlarge in any manner the scope of this Agreement, including any sums of money to be paid the NFHA as provided herein.

14. Modifications and Amendments.

- a. General Amendments. This Agreement may be modified or amended by a written document executed by the NFHA and the CITY, subject to any required State or Federal approval.
- b. Administrative Amendments. Subject to the Payment Limit, the Payment Provisions and the Scope of Service may be amended by a written administrative amendment executed by the NFHA and the CITY, subject to any required State or Federal approval, provided that such administrative amendments may not materially change the Payment Provisions or the Service Plan.

15. Choice of Law and Jurisdiction.

- a. This Agreement is made in the County of Niagara and shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New York.
- b. Any action relating to this Agreement shall be instituted and prosecuted in the courts of the County of Niagara, State of New York.

16. Conformation with Federal and State Regulations. Should Federal or State regulations touching upon the subject of this Agreement be adopted or revised during the term hereof, this Agreement may be amended to assure conformance with such Federal or State requirements.
17. Waiver. Inspections or approvals, or statements by any officer, agent or employee of the CITY relating to the NFHA's performance, or payments therefore, or any combination of these acts, shall not relieve the NFHA's obligation to fulfill this Agreement as prescribed; nor shall the CITY be thereby stopped from bringing any action for damages or enforcement arising from any failure to comply with any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
18. Subcontract and Assignment. This Agreement binds the heirs, successors, assigns and representatives of NFHA. The NFHA shall not enter into subcontracts for any work contemplated under this Agreement and shall not assign this Agreement, nor any portion hereof or monies due or to become due, without the prior written consent of the CITY, subject to any required State or Federal approval.
19. Independent Agreement Status. This Agreement is by and between two Independent Contractors and is not intended to and shall not be construed to create the relationship of agent, servant, employee, partnership, joint venture or association.
20. Conflicts of Interest. NFHA promises and attests that the NFHA and any members of its governing body shall avoid any actual or potential conflicts of interest.
21. Confidentiality.
 - a. NFHA agrees to comply with, and to require its employees, agents and partners to comply with, all applicable State and Federal statutes or regulations respecting confidentiality, including but not limited to, the identity of persons served under this Agreement, their records, or services provided them, and assures that:
 - i. All applications and records concerning any individual made or kept by NFHA or any public officer or agency in connection with the administration of or relating to services provided under this Agreement will be confidential and will not be open to examination for any purposes not directly connected with the administration of such service.
 - ii. No person will publish or disclose or permit or cause to be published or disclosed, any list of persons receiving services, except as may be required in the administration of such service.
 - b. NFHA agrees to inform all employees, agents and partners of the above provisions, and that any person knowingly and intentionally disclosing such information other than as authorized by law may be guilty of a misdemeanor.

22. Indemnification.

- a. The NFHA shall defend, save harmless and indemnify the CITY from any and all claims, costs and liability for any damages, sickness, death or injury to persons or property arising from, or connected with, the operations or services of the NFHA or its agents, servants, employees or subcontractors hereunder, save and except claims or litigation arising from the negligence or willful misconduct of the CITY or its officers and employees. NFHA shall reimburse the CITY for any expenditures, including reasonable attorney's fees incurred by the CITY in pursuit or defense of matters that are the subject of this indemnification. If requested by the CITY, the NFHA shall defend any claims or litigation to which this indemnification provision applies. The CITY shall contribute to the cost of said litigation based on its level of negligence or willful misconduct.
- b. The CITY shall defend, save harmless and indemnify the NFHA from any and all claims, costs and liability for any damages, sickness, death or injury to persons or property arising from, or connected with, the operations or services of the CITY or its agents, servants, employees or subcontractors hereunder, save and except claims or litigation arising from the negligence or willful misconduct of the NFHA or its officers and employees. The CITY shall reimburse the NFHA for any expenditures, including reasonable attorney's fees incurred by the NFHA in pursuit or defense of matters that are the subject of this indemnification. If requested by the NFHA, the CITY shall defend any claims or litigation to which this indemnification provision applies. The NFHA shall contribute to the cost of said litigation based on its level of negligence or willful misconduct.

23. Notices. All notices provided for by this Agreement shall be made in writing and may be delivered by deposit in the United States mail, postage prepaid. Notices to the CITY shall be addressed to the Mayor. Notices to the NFHA shall be addressed to the Executive Director. The effective date of notice to the NFHA shall be the date of receipt by said NFHA. The effective date of notice to the CITY shall be the date of receipt by the CITY.

24. Primacy of General Conditions. Except for Special Conditions which expressly supersede General Conditions, the Special Conditions (if any) and Scope of Service do not limit any term of the General Conditions.

25. No Third-Party Beneficiaries. Notwithstanding mutual recognition that services under this Agreement may provide some aid or assistance to members of the CITY's population, it is not the intention of either the CITY or the NFHA that such individuals occupy the position of intended third-party beneficiaries of the obligations assumed by either party to this Agreement.

26. Changes and Extra Work.

- a. When changes in the Scope of Services are required by the CITY or requested by the NFHA, NFHA shall promptly estimate their effect on the cost of the services, and on its time schedule, and so notify the CITY in writing.
- b. No change shall be implemented by NFHA unless it is approved by the CITY in writing. Unless otherwise agreed to in writing, all provisions of this Agreement shall apply to all changes in the Scope of Service.
- c. If the CITY determines that a change materially affects the total value or time of performance of this Agreement, the NFHA and the CITY will mutually agree in writing to an equitable adjustment.

27. Survival. The rights and obligations of the parties which by their nature survive termination or completion of the services covered by this Agreement, shall remain in full force and effect after termination or completion.

28. Performance and Final Acceptance.

- a. NFHA represents that it is experienced, qualified, registered, licensed, equipped, organized and financed to perform the services under this Agreement.
- b. NFHA shall perform the services under this Agreement with that degree of skill and judgment normally exercised by professional firms performing services of a similar nature in the State of New York, and shall be responsible for the professional quality, technical accuracy and coordination of the services it performs under this Agreement. In addition to the other rights and remedies which the CITY may have, the NFHA shall, at its own expense, correct any services which fail to meet the above standard.
- c. The CITY shall provide the NFHA an opportunity to cure errors and omission which may be disclosed during the review of submittals, with no increase in the authorized Agreement Payment Limit. Should NFHA fail to make necessary corrections in a timely manner, such corrections shall be made by the CITY and the cost thereof shall be charged to NFHA.

29. Force Majeure. Neither party hereto shall be considered in default in the performance of its obligations hereunder to the extent that the performance of such an obligation is prevented or delayed by any cause, existing or future, which is beyond the reasonable control of such party.

30. Severability. In the event that any of the provisions or portions or applications of this Agreement are held to be unenforceable or invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, the CITY and NFHA shall negotiate an equitable adjustment in the provisions of the Agreement with a view toward effecting the purpose of this Agreement, and the validity

and enforceability of the remaining provisions or portions or applications thereof, shall not be affected thereby.

31. Authorized Representatives and Notices.

- a. CITY and NFHA shall each designate, below, an Authorized Representative who has authority to act on its behalf in the administration of this Agreement.
- b. Written notification to the other party shall be provided, in advance, of changes in name or address of such Authorized Representatives.
- c. Notices provided for under this Agreement shall be in writing, and shall be served on the Authorized Representative of the receiving party, either personally or at the party's offices, or by registered or certified mail to its office address.
- d. The CITY hereby designates as its Authorized Representative:

By signing this Agreement, the Parties acknowledge that this Agreement has been ratified by both the Niagara Falls City Council and Niagara Falls Housing Authority Board of Commissioners. Furthermore, the Parties have independently determined and collectively agree that there is no incompatibility of office created by this Agreement.

SCHEDULE “A”

SCOPE OF SERVICES

- Work directly with the City of Niagara Falls Community Development Department staff and the City of Niagara Falls’ City Administrator, and report regularly to the City Administrator regarding Community Development operations and financial management in accordance with the provisions of Article IV, Section 4.5 (B) of the Charter of the City of Niagara Falls, New York.
- Work with Community Development staff and City Administrator to oversee the completion of all tasks with HUD's Annual Contributions Contract (ACC) and HUD Community Planning and Development (CPO) requirements and deliverables.
- Work with Community Development staff to ensure implementation/compliance with all Federal Regulation Notices.
- Work with Community Development Staff to ensure effective service delivery to program participants and HUD CPO objectives.
- Identify key opportunities and carry out strategies for effective administration of the City of Niagara Falls HUD Housing Choice Voucher and HUD CPO Programs.
- Represent the City of Niagara Falls Community Development Department and the City of Niagara Falls in internal and external relations in conjunction with the City Administrator and the Mayor's office.
- Provide daily, at a minimum of eight to ten hours per week, onsite leadership and supervision of Community Development Department operations.
- Assess internal operations to align resources with an objective, mission-focused perspective within the City of Niagara Falls Community Development Department.
- Perform key functions such as monitoring budgets, developing reports to HUD, the City Administrator, and managing Community Development staff.
- Oversee the preparation and submittal of all applications and reports to HUD.
- Maintain and support continuity of relationships with HUD, the City of Niagara Falls, vendors, and key community officials, and the agency's partners.

- 3) Maintenance contracts (including nonroutine maintenance), greater than \$100,000 – use Sections I and II.

Section I - Clauses for All Non-Construction Contracts greater than \$100,000

1. Definitions

The following definitions are applicable to this contract:

- (a) "Authority or Housing Authority (HA)" means the Housing Authority.
- (b) "Contract" means the contract entered into between the Authority and the Contractor. It includes the contract form, the Certifications and Representations, these contract clauses, and the scope of work. It includes all formal changes to any of those documents by addendum, Change Order, or other modification.
- (c) "Contractor" means the person or other entity entering into the contract with the Authority to perform all of the work required under the contract.
- (d) "Day" means calendar days, unless otherwise stated.
- (e) "HUD" means the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development, his delegates, successors, and assigns, and the officers and employees of the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development acting for and on behalf of the Secretary.

2. Changes

- (a) The HA may at any time, by written order, and without notice to the sureties, if any, make changes within the general scope of this contract in the services to be performed or supplies to be delivered.
- (b) If any such change causes an increase or decrease in the hourly rate, the not-to-exceed amount of the contract, or the time required for performance of any part of the work under this contract, whether or not caused by the order, or otherwise affects the conditions of this contract, the HA shall make an equitable adjustment in the not-to-exceed amount, the hourly rate, the delivery schedule, or other affected terms, and shall modify the contract accordingly.
- (c) The Contractor must assert its right to an equitable adjustment under this clause within 30 days from the date of receipt of the written order. However, if the HA decides that the facts justify it, the HA may receive and act upon a

proposal submitted before final payment of the contract.

(d) Failure to agree to any adjustment shall be a dispute under clause Disputes, herein. However, nothing in this clause shall excuse the Contractor from proceeding with the contract as changed.

(e) No services for which an additional cost or fee will be charged by the Contractor shall be furnished without the prior written consent of the HA.

3. Termination for Convenience and Default

- (a) The HA may terminate this contract in whole, or from time to time in part, for the HA's convenience or the failure of the Contractor to fulfill the contract obligations (default). The HA shall terminate by delivering to the Contractor a written Notice of Termination specifying the nature, extent, and effective date of the termination. Upon receipt of the notice, the Contractor shall: (i) immediately discontinue all services affected (unless the notice directs otherwise); and (ii) deliver to the HA all information, reports, papers, and other materials accumulated or generated in performing this contract, whether completed or in process.
- (b) If the termination is for the convenience of the HA, the HA shall be liable only for payment for services rendered before the effective date of the termination.
- (c) If the termination is due to the failure of the Contractor to fulfill its obligations under the contract (default), the HA may (i) require the Contractor to deliver to it, in the manner and to the extent directed by the HA, any work as described in subparagraph (a)(ii) above, and compensation be determined in accordance with the Changes clause, paragraph 2, above; (ii) take over the work and prosecute the same to completion by contract or otherwise, and the Contractor shall be liable for any additional cost incurred by the HA; (iii) withhold any payments to the Contractor, for the purpose of offset or partial payment, as the case may be, of amounts owed to the HA by the Contractor.
- (d) If, after termination for failure to fulfill contract obligations (default), it is determined that the Contractor had not failed, the termination shall be deemed to have been effected for the convenience of the HA, and the Contractor shall be liable to payment as described in paragraph (b) above.
- (e) Any disputes with regard to this clause are expressly made subject to the terms of clause titled Disputes herein.

4. Examination and Retention of Contractor's Records

- (a) The HA, HUD, or Comptroller General of the United States, or any of their duly authorized representatives shall, until 3 years after final payment under this contract, have access to and the right to examine any of the Contractor's directly pertinent books, documents, papers, or other records involving transactions related to this contract for the purpose of making audit, examination, excerpts, and transcriptions.

(b) The Contractor agrees to include in first-tier subcontracts under this contract a clause substantially the same as paragraph (a) above, "Subcontract," as used in this clause, excludes purchase orders not exceeding \$10,000.

(c) The periods of access and examination in paragraphs (a) and (b) above for records relating to:

- (i) appeals under the clause titled Disputes;
- (ii) litigation or settlement of claims arising from the performance of this contract; or,
- (iii) costs and expenses of this contract to which the HA, HUD, or Comptroller General or any of their duly authorized representatives has taken exception shall continue until disposition of such appeals, litigation, claims, or exceptions.

5. Rights In Data (Ownership and Proprietary Interest)

The HA shall have exclusive ownership of, all proprietary interest in, and the right to full and exclusive possession of all information, materials and documents discovered or produced by Contractor pursuant to the terms of this Contract, including but not limited to reports, memoranda or letters concerning the research and reporting tasks of this Contract.

6. Energy Efficiency

The contractor shall comply with all mandatory standards and policies relating to energy efficiency which are contained in the energy conservation plan issued in compliance with the Energy Policy and Conservation Act (Pub.L. 94-163) for the State in which the work under this contract is performed.

7. Disputes

(a) All disputes arising under or relating to this contract, *except for disputes arising under clauses contained in Section III, Labor Standards Provisions*, including any claims for damages for the alleged breach thereof which are not disposed of by agreement, shall be resolved under this clause.

(b) All claims by the Contractor shall be made in writing and submitted to the HA. A claim by the HA against the Contractor shall be subject to a written decision by the HA.

(c) The HA shall, with reasonable promptness, but in no event in no more than 60 days, render a decision concerning any claim hereunder. Unless the Contractor, within 30 days after receipt of the HA's decision, shall notify the HA in writing that it takes exception to such decision, the decision shall be final and conclusive.

(d) Provided the Contractor has (i) given the notice within the time stated in paragraph (c) above, and (ii) excepted its claim relating to such decision from the final release, and (iii) brought suit against the HA not later than one year after receipt of final payment, or if final payment has not been made, not later than one year after the Contractor has had a reasonable time to respond to a written request by the HA that it submit a final voucher and release, whichever is earlier, then the HA's decision shall not be final or conclusive, but the dispute shall be determined on the merits by a court of competent jurisdiction.

(e) The Contractor shall proceed diligently with performance of this contract, pending final resolution of any request for relief, claim, appeal, or action arising under the contract, and comply with any decision of the HA.

8. Contract Termination; Debarment

A breach of these Contract clauses may be grounds for termination of the Contract and for debarment or denial of participation in HUD programs as a Contractor and a subcontractor as provided in 24 CFR Part 24.

9. Assignment of Contract

The Contractor shall not assign or transfer any interest in this contract; except that claims for monies due or to become due from the HA under the contract may be assigned to a bank, trust company, or other financial institution. If the Contractor is a partnership, this contract shall inure to the benefit of the surviving or remaining member(s) of such partnership approved by the HA.

10. Certificate and Release

Prior to final payment under this contract, or prior to settlement upon termination of this contract, and as a condition precedent thereto, the Contractor shall execute and deliver to the HA a certificate and release, in a form acceptable to the HA, of all claims against the HA by the Contractor under and by virtue of this contract, other than such claims, if any, as may be specifically excepted by the Contractor in stated amounts set forth therein.

11. Organizational Conflicts of Interest

(a) The Contractor warrants that to the best of its knowledge and belief and except as otherwise disclosed, it does not have any organizational conflict of interest which is defined as a situation in which the nature of work under this contract and a contractor's organizational, financial, contractual or other interests are such that:

- (i) Award of the contract may result in an unfair competitive advantage; or
- (ii) The Contractor's objectivity in performing the contract work may be impaired.

(b) The Contractor agrees that if after award it discovers an organizational conflict of interest with respect to this contract or any task/delivery order under the contract, he or she shall make an immediate and full disclosure in writing to the Contracting Officer which shall include a description of the action which the Contractor has taken or intends to take to eliminate or neutralize the conflict. The HA may, however, terminate the contract or task/delivery order for the convenience of the HA if it would be in the best interest of the HA.

(c) In the event the Contractor was aware of an organizational conflict of interest before the award of this contract and intentionally did not disclose the conflict to the Contracting Officer, the HA may terminate the contract for default.

(d) The terms of this clause shall be included in all subcontracts and consulting agreements wherein the work to be performed is similar to the service provided by the prime Contractor. The Contractor shall include in such subcontracts and consulting agreements any necessary provisions to eliminate or neutralize conflicts of interest.

12. Inspection and Acceptance

(a) The HA has the right to review, require correction, if necessary, and accept the work products produced by the Contractor. Such review(s) shall be carried out within 30 days so as to not impede the work of the Contractor. Any

product of work shall be deemed accepted as submitted if the HA does not issue written comments and/or required corrections within 30 days from the date of receipt of such product from the Contractor.

(b) The Contractor shall make any required corrections promptly at no additional charge and return a revised copy of the product to the HA within 7 days of notification or a later date if extended by the HA.

(c) Failure by the Contractor to proceed with reasonable promptness to make necessary corrections shall be a default. If the Contractor's submission of corrected work remains unacceptable, the HA may terminate this contract (or the task order involved) or reduce the contract price or cost to reflect the reduced value of services received.

13. Interest of Members of Congress

No member of or delegate to the Congress of the United States of America or Resident Commissioner shall be admitted to any share or part of this contract or to any benefit to arise there from, but this provision shall not be construed to extend to this contract if made with a corporation for its general benefit.

14. Interest of Members, Officers, or Employees and Former Members, Officers, or Employees

No member, officer, or employee of the HA, no member of the governing body of the locality in which the project is situated, no member of the governing body in which the HA was located, and no other public official of such locality or localities who exercises any functions or responsibilities with respect to the project, shall, during his or her tenure, or for one year thereafter, have any interest, direct or indirect, in this contract or the proceeds thereof.

15. Limitation on Payments to Influence Certain Federal Transactions

(a) Definitions. As used in this clause:

"Agency", as defined in 6 U.S.C. 652(f), includes Federal executive departments and agencies as well as independent regulatory commissions and Government corporations, as defined in 31 U.S.C. 9101(1).

"Covered Federal Action" means any of the following Federal actions:

- (i) The awarding of any Federal contract;
- (ii) The making of any Federal grant;
- (iii) The making of any Federal loan;
- (iv) The entering into of any cooperative agreement; and,
- (v) The extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement.

Covered Federal action does not include receiving from an agency a commitment providing for the United States to insure or guarantee a loan.

"Indian tribe" and "tribal organization" have the meaning provided in section 4 of the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (25 U.S.C. 450B). Alaskan Natives are included under the definitions of Indian tribes in that Act.

"Influencing or attempting to influence" means making, with the intent to influence, any communication to or appearance before an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with any covered Federal action.

"Local government" means a unit of government in a State and, if chartered, established, or otherwise recognized by a State for the performance of a governmental duty, including a local public authority, a special district, an intrastate district, a council of governments, a sponsor group representative organization, and any other instrumentality of a local government.

"Officer or employee of an agency" includes the following individuals who are employed by an agency:

- (i) An individual who is appointed to a position in the Government under title 6, U.S.C., including a position under a temporary appointment;
- (ii) A member of the uniformed services as defined in section 202, title 18, U.S.C.;
- (iii) A special Government employee as defined in section 202, title 18, U.S.C.; and,
- (iv) An individual who is a member of a Federal advisory committee, as defined by the Federal Advisory Committee Act, title 6, appendix 2.

"Person" means an individual, corporation, company, association, authority, firm, partnership, society, State, and local government, regardless of whether such entity is operated for profit or not for profit. This term excludes an Indian tribe, tribal organization, or other Indian organization with respect to expenditures specifically permitted by other Federal law.

"Recipient" includes all contractors, subcontractors at any tier, and subgrantees at any tier of the recipient of funds received in connection with a Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement. The term excludes an Indian tribe, tribal organization, or any other Indian organization with respect to expenditures specifically permitted by other Federal law.

"Regularly employed" means, with respect to an officer or employee of a person requesting or receiving a Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement, an officer or employee who is employed by such person for at least 130 working days within one year immediately preceding the date of the submission that initiates agency consideration of such person for receipt of such contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement. An officer or employee who is employed by such person for less than 130 working days within one year immediately preceding the date of submission that initiates agency consideration of such person shall be considered to be regularly employed as soon as he or she is employed by such person for 130 working days.

"State" means a State of the United States, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, a territory or possession of the United States, an agency or instrumentality of a State, and a multi-State, regional, or interstate entity having governmental duties and powers.

(b) Prohibition.

- (i) Section 1362 of title 31, U.S.C. provides in part that no appropriated funds may be expended by the recipient of a Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement to pay any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with any of the following covered Federal actions: the awarding of any Federal contract, the making of any Federal grant, the making of any Federal loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement.
- (ii) The prohibition does not apply as follows:

(1) Agency and legislative liaison by Own Employees.

(a) The prohibition on the use of appropriated funds, in paragraph (1) of this section, does not apply in the case of a payment of reasonable compensation made to an officer or employee of a person requesting or receiving a Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement, if the payment is for agency and legislative activities not directly related to a covered Federal action.

(b) For purposes of paragraph (b)(1)(a) of this clause, providing any information specifically requested by an agency or Congress is permitted at any time.

(c) The following agency and legislative liaison activities are permitted at any time only where they are not related to a specific solicitation for any covered Federal action:

(1) Discussing with an agency (including individual demonstrations) the qualities and characteristics of the person's products or services, conditions or terms of sale, and service capabilities; and,

(2) Technical discussions and other activities regarding the application or adaptation of the person's products or services for an agency's use.

(d) The following agency and legislative liaison activities are permitted where they are prior to formal solicitation of any covered Federal action:

(1) Providing any information not specifically requested but necessary for an agency to make an informed decision about initiation of a covered Federal action;

(2) Technical discussions regarding the preparation of an unsolicited proposal prior to its official submission; and

(3) Capability presentations by persons seeking awards from an agency pursuant to the provisions of the Small Business Act, as amended by Public Law 95-507 and other subsequent amendments.

(a) Only those activities expressly authorized by subdivision (b)(1)(a) of this clause are permitted under this clause.

(2) Professional and technical services.

(a) The prohibition on the use of appropriated funds, in subparagraph (b)(1) of this clause, does not apply in the case of:

(i) A payment of reasonable compensation made to an officer or employee of a person requesting or receiving a covered Federal action or an extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of a covered Federal action, if payment is for professional or technical services rendered directly in the preparation, submission, or negotiation of any bid, proposal, or application for that Federal action or for meeting requirements imposed by or pursuant to law as a condition for receiving that Federal action.

(ii) Any reasonable payment to a person, other than an officer or employee of a person requesting or receiving a covered Federal action or an extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of a covered Federal action if the payment is for professional or technical services rendered directly in the preparation, submission, or negotiation of any bid, proposal, or application for that Federal action or for meeting requirements imposed by or pursuant to law as a condition for receiving that Federal action. Persons other than officers or employees of a person requesting or receiving a covered Federal action include consultants and trade associations.

(b) For purposes of subdivision (b)(1)(2)(a) of this clause, "professional and technical services" shall be limited to advice and analysis directly applying any professional or technical discipline.

(c) Requirements imposed by or pursuant to law as a condition for receiving a covered Federal award include those required by law or regulation, or reasonably expected to be required by law or regulation, and any other requirements in the actual award documents.

(d) Only those services expressly authorized by subdivisions (b)(1)(2)(a)(i) and (ii) of this section are permitted under this clause.

(III) Selling activities by independent sales representatives.

(a) The prohibition on the use of appropriated funds, in subparagraph (b)(1) of this clause, does not apply to the following selling activities before an agency by independent sales representatives, provided such activities are prior to formal solicitation by an agency and are specifically limited to the merits of the matter:

(i) Discussing with an agency (including individual demonstration) the qualities and characteristics of the person's products or services, conditions or terms of sale, and service capabilities; and

(ii) Technical discussions and other activities regarding the application or adaptation of the person's products or services for an agency's use.

(d) Agreement. In accepting any contract, grant, cooperative agreement, or loan resulting from this solicitation, the person submitting the offer agrees not to make any payment prohibited by this clause.

(e) Penalties. Any person who makes an expenditure prohibited under paragraph (b) of this clause shall be subject to civil penalties as provided for by 31 U.S.C. 1362. An imposition of a civil penalty does not prevent the Government from seeking any other remedy that may be applicable.

(f) Cost Allowability. Nothing in this clause is to be interpreted to make allowable or reasonable any costs which would be unallowable or unreasonable in accordance with Part 31 of the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR), or OMB Circulars dealing with cost allowability for recipients of assistance agreements. Conversely, costs made specifically unallowable by the requirements in this clause will not be made allowable under any of the provisions of FAR Part 31 or the relevant OMB Circulars.

16. Equal Employment Opportunity

During the performance of this contract, the Contractor agrees as follows:

- (a) The Contractor shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, or national origin.
- (b) The Contractor shall take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to (1) employment; (2) upgrading; (3) demolition; (4) transfer; (5) recruitment or recruitment advertising; (6) layoff or termination; (7) rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and (8) selection for training, including apprenticeship.
- (c) The Contractor shall post in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment the notices to be provided by the Contracting Officer that explain this clause.
- (d) The Contractor shall, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, or national origin.
- (e) The Contractor shall send, to each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, the notice to be provided by the Contracting Officer advising the labor union or workers' representative of the Contractor's commitments under this clause, and post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.
- (f) The Contractor shall comply with Executive Order 11246, as amended, and the rules, regulations, and orders of the Secretary of Labor.
- (g) The Contractor shall furnish all information and reports required by Executive Order 11246, as amended and by rules, regulations, and orders of the Secretary of Labor, or pursuant thereto. The Contractor shall permit access to its books, records, and accounts by the Secretary of Labor for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with such rules, regulations, and orders.
- (h) In the event of a determination that the Contractor is not in compliance with this clause or any rule, regulation, or order of the Secretary of Labor, this contract may be canceled, terminated, or suspended in whole or in part, and the Contractor may be declared ineligible for further Government contracts, or federally assisted construction contracts under the procedures authorized in Executive Order 11246, as amended. In addition, sanctions may be imposed and remedies invoked against the Contractor as provided in Executive Order 11246, as amended, the rules, regulations, and orders of the Secretary of Labor, or as otherwise provided by law.
- (i) The Contractor shall include the terms and conditions of this clause in every subcontract or purchase order unless exempted by the rules, regulations, or orders of the Secretary of Labor issued under Executive Order 11246, as amended, so that these terms and conditions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor. The Contractor shall take such action with respect to any subcontractor or purchase order as the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development or the Secretary of Labor may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions, including sanctions for noncompliance; provided that if the

Contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor or vendor as a result of such direction, the Contractor may request the United States to enter into the litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

17. Dissemination or Disclosure of Information

No information or material shall be disseminated or disclosed to the general public, the news media, or any person or organization without prior express written approval by the HA.

18. Contractor's Status

It is understood that the Contractor is an independent contractor and is not to be considered an employee of the HA, or assume any right, privilege or duties of an employee, and shall save harmless the HA and its employees from claims suits, actions and costs of every description resulting from the Contractor's activities on behalf of the HA in connection with this Agreement.

19. Other Contractors

HA may undertake or award other contracts for additional work at or near the site(s) of the work under this contract. The contractor shall fully cooperate with the other contractors and with HA and HUD employees and shall carefully adapt scheduling and performing the work under this contract to accommodate the additional work, heeding any direction that may be provided by the Contracting Officer. The contractor shall not commit or permit any act that will interfere with the performance of work by any other contractor or HA employee.

20. Liens

The Contractor is prohibited from placing a lien on HA's property. This prohibition shall apply to all subcontractors.

21. Training and Employment Opportunities for Residents in the Project Area (Section 3, HUD Act of 1968; 24 CFR 136)

- (a) The work to be performed under this contract is subject to the requirements of section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, as amended, 12 U.S.C. 1701u (section 3). The purpose of section 3 is to ensure that employment and other economic opportunities generated by HUD assistance or HUD-assisted projects covered by section 3, shall, to the greatest extent feasible, be directed to low- and very low-income persons, particularly persons who are recipients of HUD assistance for housing.
- (b) The parties to this contract agree to comply with HUD's regulations in 24 CFR Part 136, which implement section 3. As evidenced by their execution of this contract, the parties to this contract certify that they are under no contractual or other impediment that would prevent them from complying with the Part 136 regulations.
- (c) The contractor agrees to send to each labor organization or representative of workers with which the contractor has a collective bargaining agreement or other understanding, if any, a notice advising the labor organization or workers' representative of the contractor's commitments under this section 3 clause, and will post copies of the notice in conspicuous places at the work site where both employees and applicants for training and employment positions can see the notice. The notice shall describe the section 3 preference, shall set forth minimum number and job titles subject to hire, availability of

apprenticeship and training positions, the qualifications for each; and the name and location of the person(s) taking applications for each of the positions; and the anticipated date the work shall begin.

(d) The contractor agrees to include this section 3 clause in every subcontract subject to compliance with regulations in 24 CFR Part 135, and agrees to take appropriate action, as provided in an applicable provision of the subcontract or in this section 3 clause, upon a finding that the subcontractor is in violation of the regulations in 24 CFR Part 135. The contractor will not subcontract with any subcontractor where the contractor has notice or knowledge that the subcontractor has been found in violation of the regulations in 24 CFR Part 135.

(e) The contractor will certify that any vacant employment positions, including training positions, that are filled (1) after the contractor is selected but before the contract is executed, and (2) with persons other than those to whom the regulations of 24 CFR Part 135 require employment opportunities to be directed, were not filled to circumvent the contractor's obligations under 24 CFR Part 135.

(f) Noncompliance with HUD's regulations in 24 CFR Part 135 may result in sanctions, termination of this contract for default, and debarment or suspension from future HUD assisted contracts.

22. Procurement of Recovered Materials

(a) In accordance with Section 6002 of the Solid Waste Disposal Act, as amended by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, the Contractor shall procure items designated in guidelines of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) at 40 CFR Part 247 that contain the highest percentage of recovered materials practicable, consistent with maintaining a satisfactory level of competition. The Contractor shall procure items designated in the EPA guidelines that contain the highest percentage of recovered materials practicable unless the Contractor determines that such items: (1) are not reasonably available in a reasonable period of time; (2) fail to meet reasonable performance standards, which shall be determined on the basis of the guidelines of the National Institute of Standards and Technology, if applicable to the item; or (3) are only available at an unreasonable price.

(b) Paragraph (a) of this clause shall apply to items purchased under this contract where: (1) the Contractor purchases in excess of \$10,000 of the item under this contract; or (2) during the preceding Federal fiscal year, the Contractor: (i) purchased any amount of the items for use under a contract that was funded with Federal appropriations and was with a Federal agency or a State agency or agency of a political subdivision of a State; and (ii) purchased a total of in excess of \$10,000 of the item both under and outside that contract.

The prospective primary participant shall provide immediate written notice to the department or agency to whom this proposal is submitted if at any time the prospective primary participant learns that its certification was erroneous when submitted or has become erroneous by reason of changed circumstances.

5. The terms covered transaction, debarred, suspended, ineligible, lower tier covered transaction, participant, person, primary covered transaction, principal, proposal, and voluntarily excluded, as used in this clause, have the meanings set out in the Definitions and Coverage sections of the rules implementing Executive Order 12549. You may contact the department or agency to which this proposal is being submitted for assistance in obtaining a copy of these regulations.

6. The prospective primary participant agrees by submitting this proposal that, should the proposed covered transaction be entered into, it shall not knowingly enter into any lower tier covered transaction with a person who is debarred, suspended, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this covered transaction, unless authorized by the department or agency entering into this transaction.

7. The prospective primary participant further agrees by submitting this proposal that it will include the clause titled "Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion - Lower Tier Covered Transaction," provided by the department or agency entering into this covered transaction, without modification, in all lower tier covered transactions and in all solicitations for lower tier covered transactions.

8. A participant in a covered transaction may rely upon a certification of a prospective participant in a lower tier covered transaction that it is not debarred, suspended, ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from the covered transaction, unless it knows that the certification is erroneous. A participant may decide the method and frequency by which it determines this eligibility of its principals. Each participant may, but is not required to, check the Nonprocurement List.

9. Nothing contained in the foregoing shall be construed to require establishment of a system of records in order to render in good faith the certification required by this clause. The knowledge and information of a participant is not required to exceed that which is normally possessed by a prudent person in the ordinary course of business dealings.

10. Except for transactions authorized under paragraph (6) of these instructions, if a participant in a covered transaction knowingly enters into a lower tier covered transaction with a person who is suspended, debarred, ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction, in addition to other remedies available to the Federal Government, the department or agency may terminate this transaction for cause of default.

Certification B: Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion - Lower Tier Covered Transactions

1. The prospective lower tier participant certifies, by submission of this proposal, that neither it nor its principals is presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction by any Federal department or agency.
2. Where the prospective lower tier participant is unable to certify to any of the statements in this certification, such prospective participant shall attach an explanation to this proposal.

Instructions for Certification (B)

1. By signing and submitting this proposal, the prospective lower tier participant is providing the certification set out below.
2. The certification in this clause is a material representation of fact upon which reliance was placed when this transaction was entered into. If it is later determined that the prospective lower tier participant knowingly rendered an erroneous certification, in addition to other remedies available to the Federal Government, the department or agency with which this transaction originated may pursue available remedies, including suspension and/or debarment.
3. The prospective lower tier participant shall provide immediate written notice to the person to which this proposal is submitted if at any time the prospective lower tier participant learns that its certification was erroneous when submitted or has become erroneous by reason of changed circumstances.
4. The terms covered transaction, debarred, suspended, ineligible, lower tier covered transaction, participant, person, primary covered transaction, principal, proposal, and voluntarily excluded, as used in this clause, have the meanings set out in the Definitions and Coverage sections of rules implementing Executive Order 12549. You may contact the person to which this proposal is submitted for assistance in obtaining a copy of these regulations.

5. The prospective lower tier participant agrees by submitting this proposal that, should the proposed covered transaction be entered into, it shall not knowingly enter into any lower tier covered transaction with a person who is debarred, suspended, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this covered transaction, unless authorized by the department or agency with which this transaction originated.

6. The prospective lower tier participant further agrees by submitting this proposal that it will include this clause titled "Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion - Lower Tier Covered Transaction," without modification, in all lower tier covered transactions and in all solicitations for lower tier covered transactions.

7. A participant in a covered transaction may rely upon a certification of a prospective participant in a lower tier covered transaction that it is not debarred, suspended, ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from the covered transaction, unless it knows that the certification is erroneous. A participant may decide the method and frequency by which it determines the eligibility of its principals. Each participant may, but is not required to, check the Nonprocurement List.

8. Nothing contained in the foregoing shall be construed to require establishment of a system of records in order to render in good faith the certification required by this clause. The knowledge and information of a participant is not required to exceed that which is normally possessed by a prudent person in the ordinary course of business dealings.

9. Except for transactions authorized under paragraph (5) of these instructions, if a participant in a lower covered transaction knowingly enters into a lower tier covered transaction with a person who is suspended, debarred, ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction, in addition to other remedies available to the Federal Government, the department or agency with which this transaction originated may pursue available remedies including suspension and/or debarment.
