

Chapter 92, Article III, CONSTRUCTION CODES

§ 92-15. Adoption of standards.

A. To provide certain minimum standards, provisions and requirements for safe and stable design, methods of construction and uses of materials in buildings hereafter erected, constructed, enlarged, altered, repaired, relocated and converted, the following uniform codes are hereby incorporated by reference in addition to all amended additions as though printed in full herein. Copies of said uniform codes printed in booklet or pamphlet form shall be maintained in the office of the Papillion Chief Building Official:

- (1) International Energy Conservation Code (IECC) 2006 edition.
- (2) International Plumbing Code (IPC) 2006 edition.
- (3) International Mechanical Code (IMC) 2006 edition.
- (4) International Code Council Electrical Code (administrative provisions for NEC) 2006 edition & 2005 (latest edition) National Electrical Code (NEC).
- (5) International Fuel Gas Code (IFGC) 2006 edition.
- (6) International Existing Building Code (IEBC) 2006 edition.
- (7) International Residential Code (IRC) 2006 edition.
- (8) International Building Code (IBC) 2006 edition.

Per section 105/ 106 of the adopted codes:

Any owner or authorized agent who intends to install, construct, alter, repair, move, remove, replace or change the any fixture, occupancy, or portion of a building or structure. The installation of which is regulated by this code, or to cause any such work to be done, shall first make application to the code official and obtain the required permit for the work.

§ 92-16. Violations and penalties. [Amended 5-5-1998 by Ord. No. 1264]

Any person who violates any of the prohibitions or provisions of any article or section of this chapter shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor. Unless otherwise specified in the particular article or section for which the person stands convicted of violating, the penalty for such violation shall be fined in any sum not exceeding \$500 or imprisoned six months, or both said fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the sentencing court.
