### **PRESS RELEASE**

The Skokie Police Department is pleased to report a string of successes in identifying and arresting individuals responsible for numerous residential burglaries, some that have occurred in Skokie dating back to January of 2010.

Based upon ongoing investigations, five juveniles and three adult offenders have been charged with 12 counts of burglary since February of 2011. The most recent arrests occurred in May, 2011. Of the offenders arrested, four were identified based upon fingerprint evidence recovered at the scene.

The adults charged with burglary are identified as:

Kenny Miller, 2847 N. Ridgeway, Chicago, IL, 23 YOA, one count of burglary which occurred February 2, 2011, in the 4300 block of Church.

Pablo Martinez, 1525 S. 22<sup>nd</sup> Street, Melrose Park, IL, 18 YOA, two counts of burglary which occurred in January of 2010, in the 8000 – 8300 blocks of Kildare.

Alberto Enriquez, 2751 W. Estes, Chicago, IL, 20 YOA, one count of burglary which occurred in January 2010, in the 9400 block of Harding.

The following juvenile offenders were charged for the below listed burglaries:

One juvenile offender was responsible for burglaries in the 8000 block of Kedvale and the 8700 block of Keystone, which occurred in January, 2010

One juvenile offender was responsible for a burglary in the 3300 block of Lake.

One juvenile offender was responsible for two burglaries in the 4700 block of Greenwood and the 5100 block of Greenleaf, which occurred in January, 2010.

One juvenile offender was responsible for a burglary in the 5000 block of Lunt, which occurred in February, 2010.

One juvenile offender was charged in two burglaries in the 9300 block of Central Park and the 7600 Block of Kolmar, which occurred in February, 2010, and January, 2010 respectively.

All reported burglaries are vigorously investigated. As noted above, those offenders who commit burglaries will be continuously pursued and prosecuted despite the passage of time.
