- 1. **Call to Order:** The Civil Preparedness Advisory Committee meeting was called to order by Joe Tolisano at 7:35 a.m.

3. Update on Reverse 911 – next steps

The Reverse 911 system was tested on October 10th and October 15th. On October 10th Cox Communications' system went down as planned. 1799 residences were called to notify residents of the outage. Frank Falcone shared two reports from the system. The second calling on October 15th netted 2409 calls. A mile wide band across the center of the town was not called during the first test. Possible Cox outage could be explanation for difference in calls. The system will continue to be tested monthly to identify any other issues. The map still is not projecting. Frank Falcone will work with tech support to resolve.

Frank Falcone is continuing to work on the process of entering data into the system.

There are three hours of training left for Reverse 911. Frank Falcone gave the group three dates. The group agreed training time should be spent on 1) remote access 2) data import 3) segmented calls/without utilizing map 4) outbound session. The group also agreed the need to develop a procedure book and others must be trained on the system (Joe Tolisano, Maynard Suffredini, Dave Pinney and other appropriate personnel) The school system will discuss and identify how they would like to utilize the Reverse 911 system for the next meeting. The school system will research other districts to identify how they have utilized Reverse 911. Frank Falcone will distribute a "cheat sheet" to users of the system.

The question was raised what number shows up on caller ID when Reverse 911 calls a residence. The group questioned if Town of Somers could be input. Frank Falcone will research.

4. Briefing of town emergency response

Joe Tolisano briefed the committee on the emergency response plan. He recently reviewed and confirmed the plan is consistent with the standard national model. We need to bring together those with roles to play during an emergency and walk through a table top exercise to review those roles. We will plan to have all people identified in the plan as having assigned roles to attend the next meeting of this council.

5. Approve 10/5/07 meeting minutes
