Sturges-Young Auditorium Preparing for 50th Anniversary Celebration! May 15, 2005

October 13, 1952 ...

City receives \$300,000 legacy from the estate of Emma D. Young who requested that the money be used for the benefit of the people of the community. The newly appointed auditorium board decides to locate the Auditorium on the Northeast corner of North Nottawa and West Streets and architect A.M. Strauss, Inc. is chosen to design the preliminary plans.

October of 1953 ...

Additional funds for the auditorium building project become available via a trust fund established by two sisters, Stella Sturges-Taylor and Clara Sturges.

March 4, 1954 ...

Contractor bids were opened on and construction began shortly thereafter. The general construction was done by Miller Davis Company of Kalamazoo. Fordec-Kemerly Electric and Frank Casselman, both of Sturgis, were two other companies involved in the original building project.

May 15, 1955 ...

A public dedication and Open House was held. Mr. R.H. Shepherd was the first manager of The Sturges-Young Civic Center & Auditorium.

Today ...

Since its opening, the people of Sturgis and its surrounding communities have visited the Auditorium for banquets, meetings and special events. This past year, we hosted 793 events and serviced over 64,000 people.

Because of three women's generosity and futuristic thinking, the Sturges-Young Civic Center & Auditorium came to exist. And, because of the continual support of the citizens of this community, we continue to grow, expand, and improve.

The Upcoming Year...

Over the course of the next year, the Auditorium will be going forward with several capital improvement projects in order to enhance this gem of our community. These projects will include installing new seats and making other needed repairs and updates within the facility. Several committees have been formed to organize fund raising efforts and the celebration itself. The Sturges-Young Auditorium has been an important part of the Sturgis community for many years now, the next year will be a great time to show your appreciation by offering your support. Also, this Spring, changes will be taking place within the Sturgis Police Department. The Police station will no longer house a dispatch center. By the end of April, Sturgis will be serviced by Central Dispatch out of Centreville. This means when you call 911, dispatchers in Centreville will answer your call. The change should not result in a reduction in service or response time. By using Central Dispatch, the City aims to eliminate a duplicated service, which means a better overall use of your tax dollars. In addition, the county's 911 center is better equipped to handle larger scale emergencies.

As Spring approaches and we start to see more warm and sunny days, we should take some time to help make Sturgis even more beautiful. It doesn't take very much time at all to plant some flowers around your home, or do the little home improvement projects you have been planning to do for years. By doing these projects, you can not only feel proud of your home, but you can also help your entire neighborhood feel good about itself. 2004 City of Sturgis Spring Pickup Schedules



LARGE ITEM TRASH PICKUP SCHEDULE



The City s Large Item Trash Pickup typically took place in early June, this year it is going to take place a little earlier. The City is having a spring cleaning to make the town look her best for Michigan Week. The pickup day for residents NORTH of Chicago Rd. will be May 1st, and the day for residents located SOUTH of Chicago Rd. will be May 8th. On your scheduled day, place the items on the curb in front of your property. The City asks that you do not place any items in the street itself. Also, due to environmental concerns, residents wanting to have items containing freon (refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, etc.) picked up by the City will need to follow specific instructions. These items need to have the freon removed from them before they can be disposed of legally. Residents can go to Camburn Appliance at 411 North Nottawa St. and register their appliances. There will be a \$35 fee per appliance for this service. Upon registering, Camburn Appliance will come to your house and properly remove the freon from the items. They will then put a sticker on the appliance saying the freon has been properly removed. You can then put these items on the curb on your pickup date. The City WILL NOT pick up any appliance that uses freon that does not have a sticker from Camburn Appliance on it.



LEAF PICKUP SCHEDULE



Spring is here! It has been a long winter, and everyone is anxious to get outside and get some spring cleanup started. The City of Sturgis leaf schedule will be as follows:

MONDAY APRIL 5th, THE AREA SOUTH OF EAST CHICAGO RD. AND EAST OF SOUTH NOTTAWA ST.

TUESDAY APRIL 6th, THE AREA SOUTH OF WEST CHICAGO RD. AND WEST OF SOUTH NOTTAWA ST.

WEDNESDAY APRIL 7th, THE AREA NORTH OF WEST CHICAGO RD. AND WEST OF NORTH NOTTAWA.

THURSDAY APRIL 8th, THE AREA NORTH OF EAST CHICAGO RD. AND EAST OF NORTH NOTTAWA.

This is a tentative schedule subject to weather conditions.



BRUSH PICKUP SCHEDULE



The Citywide brush pick-up will begin on **Monday April 5th**, **2004**. The City of Sturgis provides brush pick-up to its residents the **first Monday of each month**, **April to October**. Please have brush neatly stacked in the terrace area, away from trees or signs, by 7 a.m. the day of pick-up. It is unlawful to place brush beyond the curb. This monthly pick-up is for **BRUSH ONLY**. Grass clippings, leaves, roots, thorn-bearing branches, tree trunks, stumps and building materials **WILL NOT BE COLLECTED**.

The City compost site on East Fawn River Road is open Mondays and Thursdays from noon to 7:30 p.m. and Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. The compost site accepts brush, grass clippings, wood chips and leaves. Compost material is also available at the site.

THURSDAY, APRIL 22nd, NORTH OF EAST CHICAGO ROAD AND EAST OF NORTH NOTTAWA STREET.

FRIDAY, APRIL 23rd, NORTH OF WEST CHICAGO ROAD AND WEST OF NORTH NOTTAWA STREET TO N. CENTERVILLE RD.

Should any water discoloration occur, let water run until clear.

The City of Sturgis Homebuyer Assistance Program

The City of Sturgis currently has a grant to acquire, develop and re-sell *two* single-family homes to income-qualified buyers. The grant funding allows the city to offer qualified homebuyers assistance with their purchase by subsidizing closing cost and down-payment requirements. The city has partnered with the Sturgis Neighborhood Program (SNP) on this program which seeks to provide affordable home buying opportunities for Sturgis families while promoting neighborhood revitalization and stability through pride-in-ownership.

The first of the two properties being offered through this grant is located at 302 N. Lakeview Avenue. Interior improvements currently underway on this property include the installation of a new high-efficiency furnace and water heater, new flooring, new drywall and paint, updated cabinetry and new appliances. Planned exterior improvements include new energy-efficient vinyl windows, vinyl siding, structural garage changes and the addition of low-maintenance landscaping.

St. Joseph County Homeowner Assistance Program

Did you know that St. Joseph County has funding available to assist qualified homeowners with repairs and home improvements? Funding is available to all eligible St. Joseph County residents to assist with repairs that will make their homes more livable, energy-efficient, safe and handicap accessible.

Homeowners can use the program's low-interest loan funds to make repairs to or replace plumbing, electrical and heating systems, roofing, siding, windows and doors, interior/exterior painting, floor coverings, rotting porches and steps, ramps, bathroom conversions, and lead-based paint hazards. All construction improvements are completed by licensed and insured contractors. Lead hazard reduction activities are completed by state-licensed lead abatement contractors.

Eligible projects include roof replacement, exterior painting, new siding, etc. Projects will be given priority based upon the positive aesthetic impact to the home and surrounding neighborhood.
