

MyMeter - Keep Track of your Utility Use Quickly and Easily

City of Sturgis utility customers now have a new way to keep track of their utility usage. The City of Sturgis is working with MyMeter, a company that provides an online tool to view, compare, and manage your utility data.

MyMeter works with the new meters currently being installed by the City of Sturgis to allow you to log in and access utility account information. MyMeter can be accessed online via computer, as well as by mobile application for your smart phone or tablet. You can even set mobile alerts to keep you up to date when you are out of town.

The system allows you to track data over time, letting you see how weather conditions or events impact your utility usage. You can even set markers to track events that might impact utility usage and determine how they affected your bill.

The Sturgis MyMeter system will allow you to view information for both electric and water usage in your home. The system is only available to those homes that have new meters installed - the City is currently in the middle of upgrading all meters in its system.

To sign up for a MyMeter account, go online to sturgismi.gov/utilities and follow the MyMeter link. Once at the MyMeter site, select "create an account". Be sure to use your correct account number and account name as they appear on your monthly utility bill.





Large Item Trash Drop off Scheduled - Pickup Available for those in Need

On Saturday, October 1st the City of Sturgis and Sturgis Ministerial Association will be teaming up to hold a "Palm Saturday" cleanup. A large-item trash drop off will be available to City Residents at the Sturgis Compost Site on Fawn River Road between 9:00 am and noon. Meanwhile, volunteers from area churches will go out in teams to remove trash items from Sturgis City Resident's homes that request assistance.

Items being collected include TVs, computers, chairs, tables, couches, and other similar large, bulky items. The drop off/pickup service will not accept tires, paint, refrigerators, air conditioners, or freezers.



Work requests for item pickup must be submitted no later than September 12th. Representatives of the Sturgis Ministerial Association will evaluate each request and contact you. They regret that they cannot promise every request will be fulfilled. However, they hope to be able to accommodate the majority—if not all—acceptable requests. If selected, all items must be outside of the home and ready to be picked up by 9 am on Saturday, October 1st.
