

## Fall Leaf Pick Up

The Department of Public Services will begin the annual fall leaf pick up on November 4th for City residents only. Pick up will begin on the north side of the City and crews will work their way to the south side of the City. This cycle will continue through the month of November.

Please make sure leaves are piled on the terrace area. Leaves should <u>not</u> be piled in the street or in bags. No brush, grass clippings or other yard waste will be collected during this time.

The Compost Site hours for the month of November are:

Monday Noon—6:00 p.m.

Thursday Noon—6:00 p.m.

Saturday 9:00 a.m.—5:00 p.m.

Sunday 1:00 p.m.—5:00 p.m.

The compost site will also be open the first two Saturday's in January for Christmas Tree drop off. Township residents that are near City jurisdiction are encouraged to take their leaves to the compost site for disposal. City residents are also encouraged to utilize the compost site for their brush, grass clippings or other yard waste.



Those who do not have a compost site pass can visit Sturgis City Hall at 130 N. Nottawa St. to obtain one. There is a charge for Township residents.






#### **Snow Removal**

As winter approaches, so too does snow and snow removal season. The City of Sturgis handles snow removal based on the amount of snowfall received. Snowfalls less than three inches will be met with applications of deicers and plowing; depending on the amount of snow, this may include plowing of intersections, major streets, and/or local streets.

Snowfalls of 4 inches or more are categorized as Snow Removal Emergencies; this condition can also be declared by the City using various media outlets,



During any snowfall, citizens are required by ordinance to keep their sidewalks clear of snow, ice, or other nuisances for a period of more than 24 consecutive hours.

Residents are also asked to please use caution when driving during snow events. When the City's snow removal equipment is out, don't follow too closely behind. Staying back will help crews prevent accidents. During heavy snowfalls, residents are urged to stay off roads unless necessary to allow crews to clear streets as quickly as possible for all drivers.
