SUMMER SAFETY

Summer outdoor activities include grilling and using an outdoor approved recreational fire pit. Every year the fire department receives numerous inquiries about the use of both of these outdoor appliances.

The safest formula for grilling is to keep your grill at least 10-15 feet away from your home or at the farthest end of your patio. Most grill fires occur when the grill flares up in close proximity to the resi-

dence and nearby combustible materials catch on fire.

Another safety tip is to make sure all fittings on your gas grill are tight so that propane gas doesn't leak from around

your connections. If you do smell gas, and you can't find the leak, the safest way to find it is to mix a little dish soap and water and apply around all the connections. If a bubble appears you have found your leak. Make sure the gas is off, tighten the connection, then turn the gas back on and check it again.

Other concerns are about outdoor fires. The Ohio Fire Code prohibits any open burning. Section 1307-7-7-03-307(g) strictly states no open burning. The use of a properly approved fire pit will provide a safe, warming fire for outdoor summer recreation. Do not burn yard waste or trash in your approved vessel.



Every summer we read about some of our young people being killed in tragic auto crashes. There are several primary factors that are main contributors to these terrible

events and as parents you need to stress to your teens and young adults, before they go out for the night, to avoid these pit falls and they will have a much better chance of coming home safe. The worst thing that can happen in a parent's life is to get a knock on the door at 2 A.M. and look out the window and see me. I unfortunately have had to deliver those messages and it is the worst part of my job. The main contributors to crashes are:

1. Distracted Driving

This is anything from texting, talking on the phone, or having a car that is overloaded with friends. It is a proven fact that the more people that are in the car the odds of crash increases exponentially. Please have your children wait until they reach their destination to call or text you that they got there safe.

2. Alcohol/Drugs and Driving

This is a bad combination for anyone but even more so for an inexperienced driver. Reaction times are slowed and "risk taking" increases. Also, the legal limit for someone over 18 but under 21 is .02, which is one-fourth that which is allowable by those over 21. The legal limit for those under 18 is ZERO.

3. Out Past Curfew

As my father always said, "Nothing good happens after midnight." Please set a curfew for your children. They will know your expectations and will be much safer for it.

Please stress to your children the importance of avoiding these common factors in auto crashes. Your input will resonate with them more than you know and you will be able to avoid that awful knock at the door.
