As warmer weather sets in, so do construction projects. Just a friendly reminder to check with the Township Zoning Department for permit requirements before you begin your project. Most residential Zoning Permits have no fee attached to them.

Development and infrastructure initiatives are continuing, with some of the major projects finally seeing completion. The improvements to the Montgomery Road / I-71 interchange have improved traffic flow in the area, especially during the holiday season. The Hosbrook Road widening and traffic calming project will be complete soon and the Galbraith Road utility project continues. Each of these improvements helps maintain the economic viability of Kenwood, which in turn benefits all property owners.

The Township has also begun the process of updating our Zoning Code and Comprehensive Plan. The Zoning Code dates back to 1997 and the Land Use plan was last updated in 2008. These two important documents guide development and protect the welfare of the Township. Public drafts of the documents should be available later in the summer for your review and comment.

Financially, the Township is on stable ground. The Joint Economic Development Zones continue to do well, and all of the Township levies are generating revenue at their expected levels. Did you know that local tax rates for Sycamore Township property owners are among the lowest in Hamilton County? For every \$100,000 of property valuation, Sycamore Township property owners pay \$173 in local taxes.

It has been over 10 years since the last property tax levy was requested. There are no other local communities that can boast of that accomplishment, and with sound fiscal planning and financial management, we hope to continue providing quality services without raising your taxes for as long as possible.

On behalf of my fellow Trustees, Tom Weidman and Denny Connor, our Fiscal Officer Rob Porter, Township Administrator Greg Bickford and the rest of the Township staff, we thank you for your continued support and look forward to serving you. Police & Crime Prevention

Sycamore Township contracts with the Hamilton County Sheriff's Office for police service. This includes three 24 hour cars a day, plus one additional car during peak times. These officers are specifically dedicated to Sycamore Township and its residents to protect the community 24 hours a day, seven days a week. In 2015,

officers assigned to Sycamore Township responded to 12,756 calls for service/dispatches and drove over 207,243 miles. A total of 581 original arrests, including felony, misdemeanor, and minor misdemeanor offenses, and 1,445 warrant arrests were made in Sycamore Township last year.

NEW: EMERGENCY CONTACT FORM

The Sycamore Township

Fire Department makes a high number of emergency calls each year. One of the many challenges we face occurs when responding to a home where a patient, often an elderly patient, lives alone or is left alone on a daily basis and is unable to speak to the paramedics. In this case we have no way of contacting loved ones to let them know that there is a problem and they need to go to the hospital.

The fire department has created an "Emergency Contact Form" on our website that can be completed online and sent to us. The contact form will include your name, address and space to list up to two people you would like to be contacted in the case of a medical emergency in which you must be transported by ambulance to the hospital. The information you send will be placed in our data base and will not be shared with anyone. We will either notify your emergency contact person ourselves, or give it to the hospital to do so if you are transported there.



The form may be found on our web site at: www. sycamoretownshipfire.org. Click on "Resident Medical Emergency Contact Form" on the upper left hand side of the home page. Forms will also be available at the fire stations. It is our hope that having an emergency contact form on file will give our residents peace of mind knowing that the proper people will be contacted as soon as possible in the event of an emergency.



HELPFUL INFORMATION ABOUT USING 911

If you are in need of medical help and must call 911, it is best to use your home phone, if you have one, rather than a cell phone. The advantage

to calling 911 from your home phone is that it allows the dispatcher to trace your call back to your address. In the event you cannot speak or are hard to understand you will be assured that help is on its way to your home. When using a cell phone there is no signal that identifies you to the dispatcher. Your call would only be traced to the cell phone tower closest to you, therefore, your home address cannot be determined.


DATES & ENTERTAINMENT FOR ANNUAL FESTIVAL ANNOUNCED!



TOWNSHIP TIDBITS

FINES TO PROPERTY OWNERS FOR OBSTRUCTING ROADWAYS

Did you know it is illegal to dump construction materials or place dumpsters on the road or in the public right-of-way? Placing a dumpster or dumping construction materials such as gravel, mulch and dirt causes damage to Sycamore Township roads and sidewalks, which are very expensive to repair, and may create safety and traffic issues. In 2015, Sycamore Township Trustees passed Resolution 2015-112, setting a civil fine for obstructing roads and sidewalks in Sycamore Township. The property owner and/or contractor who illegally obstructs the road or right-of-way is subject to civil fines of \$350 for the first offense, \$700 for the second offense and \$1,000 for the third offense. Please do your part to help keep our roads in good shape, reduce repairs and save taxpayer money by keeping Sycamore Township roads clear.



BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR!

Warm weather is here and Sycamore Township residents and their four-legged friends are out enjoying it! Keep in mind there are Township resolutions in place prohibiting dogs roaming at large and requiring pet owners to pick up after their pets. Always walk your dog on a leash and remember to be respectful of your neighbors' properties by cleaning up after your pet. It is also a park rule that dogs must be kept under control and on a leash at all times in any Township park. For your convenience, there are "mutt mitts" available at most of the parks. Do your part to keep our community clean, and our residents and pets safe, by picking up after your pets and keeping them tethered!

BEST SELLING AUTHOR TO SPEAK AT KENWOOD BAPTIST CHURCH

New York Times #1 bestselling author Eric Metaxas will be speaking at Kenwood Baptist Church on Wednesday, March 16 at 7:00 p.m. His books include Bonhoeffer, Miracles, Seven Women, Seven Men, and Amazing Grace, as well as more than thirty children's books. He hosts the Eric Metaxas Show, a nationally syndicated radio program. He was the keynote speaker at the 2012 National Prayer Breakfast in Washington DC, an event attended by the President and First Lady, the Vice President, members of Congress, and other U.S. and world leaders.

Metaxas will be speaking about the compelling life of Dietrich Bonhoeffer, a Lutheran pastor in Germany when the Nazis came into power. Opposing the Nazi regime meant significant personal risk, and while most chose the 'safety' of silence, Dietrich Bonhoeffer boldly lived with God as his Fuhrer and the Bible as his standard of truth. Until he was arrested for aiding the escape of seven Jews, Bonhoeffer spent his energy writing, speaking and doing all that he could to live in a way that pleased God, not Hitler. RIGHT OF WAY OBSTRUCTIONS

It has come to our attention that basketball goals, both permanent and portable, have been erected in the public right of way throughout the Township. Sycamore Township has been notified by our insurance company that these right of way obstructions create a liability for the Township. Unfortunately, because of this, the Township must enforce Section 210 of the Hamilton County Subdivision Rules and Regulations which prohibits right of way obstructions. If you currently have a basketball goal in the right of way, please remove it and place it on your private property where the children can play safely.



PLACEMENT OF GARBAGE/RECYCLING CONTAINERS

The Board of Trustees has passed a resolution that will require all residential garbage/ recycling containers to be placed at the curb or authorized location for pick-up no more than 24 hours preceding the scheduled pick-up day, and all containers to be removed within 24 hours after the pickup unless prior arrangements have been made with the Township regarding a special pickup time or location. All garbage/recycling containers shall either be in an enclosed building or placed behind the front building line when not placed for pickup.

STORM DAMAGE COLLECTION

When storms pass through Sycamore Township, you can rest assured that we are looking out for our residents. Storm damage collection is a service that Sycamore Township has provided for many years through the Maintenance Department. Due to the size of the Township, it is not feasible for the Maintenance Department to cover the whole Township every time there is a storm. Therefore, our storm damage pick up policy is as follows: Superintendent/Assistant Administrator Tracy Kellums declares whether a "storm damage condition" has occurred. If a storm has been declared, in order to have the branches picked up at no charge, residents are required to contact the Township to request a storm damage pickup within two business days of the storm either by calling 791-8447 or by using the Action Line on our website at www.sycamoretownship.org.

Branches must be ready for pickup within two (2) weeks of the storm, stacked at the side of the street, butt ends out.

TRASH BASH INFORMATION (SEE DATES TO THE RIGHT)

This year, the annual document shredding event for residents will take place at Bechtold Park in conjunction with the South Trash Bash on Saturday, May 14, 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Household chemicals and pesticides will be accepted at the SOUTH TRASH BASH ONLY.

Sycamore Township Maintenance staff will be on hand to offer assistance to residents at these events. Trash, junk, debris, old tires, used motor oil, construction materials, furniture, lawnmowers, and appliances of all kinds will be accepted. Mattresses and box springs will also be accepted provided they are wrapped in plastic or in a plastic mattress bag. **Please note that paint and yard waste including brush and leaves will not be accepted.** Latex paint may be taken to Matthew 25 Ministries at 11060 Kenwood Road. Be prepared to show proof of residency.
