ROUTE 202 TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS NEXT WEEK

WARRINGTON – Penn DOT has advised Warrington Township officials that motorists will encounter single-lane conditions during the day next week (Oct. 3-7) on Route 152 (Limekiln Pike), Upper State Road and County Line Road in the vicinity of the Route 202 Parkway construction areas in Bucks and Montgomery counties, the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation said today.

Continuing installation of drainage pipes will reduce County Line Road in New Britain and Montgomery Townships to a single lane between Stump and Upper State roads Monday through Friday (Oct. 3-7) from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Ongoing drainage and intersection work also will reduce Route 152 (Limekiln Pike) to a single lane between Stump Road and Route 202 (Butler Avenue) in New Britain and Warrington townships on Monday through Friday (Oct. 3-7) from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Intersection widening on Upper State Road at Route 152 (Limekiln Pike) will require lane closures between County Line Road and Pickertown Road in New Britain and Warrington townships, Bucks County, on Monday through Friday (Oct. 3-7) from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Wells Road in Doylestown Township remains closed and detoured between Lower State and Turk roads, and Lower State Road remains closed to northbound traffic between Bristol and Almshouse roads for bridge construction.

Lane closures also may occur on Route 202 (DeKalb Pike) between Sumneytown Pike and Route 309 (Bethlehem Pike) and on Route 63 (Welsh Road) between Stump Road and Bell Run Boulevard in Upper Gwynedd and Lower Gwynedd townships, Montgomery County, for drainage and utility construction Monday through Friday (Oct. 3-7) from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Drivers should anticipate delays and add extra time for travel through the construction areas. All work is contingent on the weather.

PennDOT is investing more than \$200 million in state funds to build the nine-mile long Route 202 Parkway in Bucks and Montgomery counties and to improve roads approaching the Parkway's entrances.
