**SUBJECT:** MANAGER'S REPORT

2009 Preliminary Goals: If you have not already done so, please forward to my attention any supplementary notes/commentary with respect to the draft goals that were discussed at the February workshop. Ideally I would like to have them ready for the Board's preliminary review/adoption at a future meeting when all members are present. Based on some feedback received already, information regarding cost impacts, timelines and performance measurements need to be incorporated before final approval. Staff is working on the latter.

202 Lighting Agreement: There are still some outstanding issues preventing the 202 Parkway Lighting Agreement from being considered Tuesday evening. Staff hopes to have these issues amicably resolved for consideration at the March 24, 2009 BOS meeting.

Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) Workshop: The EAC, in partnership with BCATO and Bucks TMA, is hosting a CNG workshop for area municipalities on the use of CNG vehicles on April 1 at 7:30 pm. A copy of the promotional brochure is attached.

Communications Initiatives Update: The launching of the website was scheduled for Friday, March 6, 2009. The website takes at least 24 hours to populate to the general public once the change is made. We are currently working with IQnection to get our IP address changed so that it points to Egov Link's server. We requested this change to happen on March 5 and it was not done. We hope to have this matter resolved by the end of the day on March 6 so that the website will be up and viewable by March 8. The launching of the new TV Channel is scheduled to take place at the end of the month. Verizon came in on Tuesday, March 3 to install internet service in the basement for our new Telvue equipment and that installation has been completed. The next step is to upload the software and have it tested by Telvue. Once this is complete, we will start working on creating slides for the public to view. The Link is scheduled to go to the printer on Monday, March 9. All board members were emailed a PDF version of the document on Friday, March 6 for final review.

Encroachment into Open Space: In response to an on-going issue with a resident of Sovereign Drive regarding structures in a common open space area as well as removal of buffer vegetation, Michael Mrozinski has drafted Notice of Violation that is currently under review by the solicitor. A memo from Mike on this subject is attached.

Other Business:

- PLCM Legislative Initiatives: I have been asked to serve on the PLCM legislative committee to help advocate/lobby for certain League positions adopted by the membership. The Committee will be meeting all day Monday (3/8) and members have been asked to make appointments with their legislators. This is also a good opportunity for me to raise any other legislative issues/concerns with our legislators. I will have a report on our Day in Harrisburg on Tuesday evening.
- Residential Trash Collection Survey: Attached are the results of the survey that has been available on line since November regarding residential trash services. We received 361 responses, which is approximately 7 per cent of the households in Warrington. While 41% of the responses rated their current service as good, over 44% agreed that having multiple haulers causes unnecessary noise, pollution and wear on roads. 41% responded that they would be very supportive of moving to a single Township-contracted hauler if it resulted in a reduction in cost. The current contract for trash removal in Willow Knoll runs through 2009, so the option of a single hauler could be bid with that contract this fall for 2010.
- King Park Neighbors Petition: Residents of Warrington Ridge presented the attached petition to the Park and Recreation Board in January. The PRB discussed the petition at the February 26 meeting and their recommendations/comments are summarized in the cover memo from Carolyn Hanel.
- Resident Comments: Attached are copies of recent resident comments submitted via the Township website
- 275<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Update: Gay Currie has received confirmation that Senator Greenleaf will attend our event and will also present an official citation to our community. Gay has also contacted Governor Rendell, Congressman Murphy and State Representative Watson and is waiting to confirm their appearances.
