Chairman George Kenney welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at 4:05 p.m.

### 1. Minutes from the July 13, 2023 Regular Meeting

## 2. Mountain Lion Sculpture Update

George said that the Mountain Lion installation went well. He said the piece was featured in the Mountaineer and the local news. He instructed staff to reach out to Mr. Blevins, the donor, and see if he is available to get a photo with the Public Arts Commission and the mountain lion sculpture at the next meeting.

## 3. Pigeon Center Art Piece

George said we should hear from T-Mobile regarding the Hometown Grant relatively soon, but if we don't secure the grant this quarter, we could re-apply next quarter. George mentioned that he saw in interesting piece while visiting Arizona. He described it as a bronze sculpture of children, created by artist Jane DeDecker. Vicki said that she could see that piece being done in front of the Pigeon Center, but the children would represent different cultures.

# 4. Dog Show Planning

George reminded the Commission that Sarge's Dog Walk fundraiser is the day before the dog show. He said that we still need judges for the show, but the categories are set-same as last year. He said the tent has been rented. Skip mentioned that Sarge's may be at the event but will reach out to the Haywood County Animal Shelter to see if they would be there. He added that the owner of The Dog House said we could borrow their dog statue for the event. Skip said the sponsors have been secured for the event.
