

MINUTES
WAYNESVILLE PARKS AND RECREATION
ADVISORY COMMISSION
JULY 08, 2003

Chairman Kenny Mull called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm.

In attendance were; Kenny Mull, Lee Starnes, Ed Moore, Don Frady, and Michael Smith. Kitty Eaker was out of town and Wallace Messer was unable to attend.

Lee made the motion to approve the June minutes as individually read, Ed second, and all approved.

New Business:

The **Spring Softball** season has ended except for the recreation division and they have two more nights of tournament play. The **Fall Softball** season will begin August 4 and we anticipate 18 to 20 teams in the league. To eliminate player conflicts within the divisions, we have had to require that no player or team that plays in the upper divisions can move down to the less competitive division, unless they finish last in that division. Division winners must move up. A protest committee has been set up to handle protests and problems. **Yoga, Ab, Buns, and Legs** classes are scheduled for July. **Horse Back Riding Camp** is going well and has three more weeks before school starts. The **Summer Camp** also has three more weeks of operation. The **Summer Swim Team** has one more home meet, a league meet, and an all star meet before the season ends. The **pools** have been very busy this summer with swim practice, lessons, aerobics, and daily bus loads of camp kids from the surrounding counties as well as Haywood. The **Relay for Life** event on June 20 and 21, went well and the weather was good.

The **June Monthly Review** for the center was distributed. We have 3,887 members and the revenue totaled \$48,428.52.

An **ultra violet, chloramine destruct system** for the play pool has been approved for next year. Although it is on the frozen list, we anticipate getting the system in the spring of 2004. This will enable us to run the water features more, especially the mushrooms. The biggest advantage however, will be the almost, total elimination of bacteria in the water.

Although the **outdoor pool** is in phase III of the Recreation Center construction, there is no date

set as to when it will be constructed. The state's money shortfall has changed several of the town's plans for capital improvement and the outdoor pool has been affected by those changes.

Ed has offered the **Pigeon Street Recreation Center** as an alternative to people who are unable to schedule one of our picnic shelters for family and group outings. Contact Mary Wilson at 452-7232.

There being no further business, Don moved that we adjourn, and Ed second. All were in favor.
