WILMINGTON POLICE DEPARTMENT & COMMUNICATIONS

This year has been a busy year for the Wilmington Police Department. We had a lot of success with two committees this year. I created a Citizen Advisory Committee (CAC). We have meet quarterly this year. The members of that committee are Dean Feldmeyer, Robyn Allen, David Lieurance, James Prather, Marty Beaugard, Byron McGee, Bekah Muchmore, Bryson Thompson, Nathan Kraatz, Dr. William Kennedy, and Chip Murdock. This committee was formed late in 2014 as a recruitment committee with the intension of transitioning into a CAC. During our meetings we discussed committee issues and policing strategies.

During our February meeting we formulated goals and a mission for the CAC. Our mission is as follows:

The mission of the Wilmington Police Advisory committee is to provide community insight to the Chief of Police so he can create and maintain a police force that is competent, committed, and compassionate about the needs of our community.

It has been a pleasure working with the CAC and I look forward to great things from their insight.

We also decided it was time to review our vision and mission for the organization. To do that a Shared Leadership Committee (SLC) was formed. The SLC is made up of officers, sergeants, and communication personnel. The members of our SLC were Sgt. Fithen, Sgt. Cravens, Ptl. Gibson, Ptl. Matt Hamilton, Disp. Myers, and Disp. Smithson. We worked on our vision, mission, and reviewed our strategic plan as well as other critical documents.

We revised our vision and mission and they are as follows:

Vision Statement

The Wilmington Police Department is committed to providing exceptional customer service by addressing the needs of our community thus greatly increasing the quality of life for all Wilmington's citizens. Furthermore, the Wilmington Police Department strives to utilize community partnerships to reduce crime and to be considered a premier police organization in the state of Ohio.

Mission Statement

It is the mission of the Wilmington Police Department to enhance the quality of life in our city, to safeguard the lives and property of the people we serve, preserve the peace, reduce the incidents and fear of crime, and to enhance public safety in accordance with constitutional rights while working with the various members of our community. We will do this with honor and integrity, while conducting ourselves with the highest ethical standards.

We have started the process to get this out to our officers as well as posting them for all to see. I can't thank the SLC members enough for their time and effort.

Calls for service for the year were 17,492. This year had a large number of sex offense cases involving minors. We also had a handful of breaking and entering as some thefts. The calls for service typically remained the same and the only out of the ordinary calls we had were two bomb threats to local schools and Det. Baker indicted and convicted a Dee Wampler for involuntary manslaughter.



In 2015, Ptl. James Smithson was the recipient of the Officer of the Year Award. He continues to work hard for our department and the community. Ptl. James Smithson has had perfect attendance for two years.



Det. Robert Wilson was recognized as our crime fighter of the year for his endless pursuit of criminals. My thanks to Ptl. James Smithson and Det. Robert Wilson for a job well done. I would also like to recognize Ptl. Kyle Brown, Sgt. Ron Cravens, and Ptl. Jeremy Skates for perfect attendance.

We've been very busy in the community this year. We held safety days at the Banana Split Festival, Senior Center, Walmart, and at Quaker Apartments. We also conducted one medication disposal days where over 50 pounds of pills were collected from local residents. Our medication disposal box that is located in our lobby has collected a little over 300 pounds of pills left for destruction. This year we implemented a traffic safety unit and Ptl. Tyler Johnson was assigned to that unit. This was due to the volume of complaints we had regarding traffic related issues.

We have also been busy with training and in-service. This year we have logged 2236 hours of training. This year we did in-service for driving, Taser, unarmed self-defense, and legal update. Sgt. Cravens and Sgt. Martin put on four range sessions at our range and did an excellent job putting officers through tough scenarios.

This year Wilmington PD saw some new faces. We swore in Ptl. Tyler Johnson and Ptl. Codey Juillerat. We look forward to great things from them.

This year WPD exceeded 1200 arrests. We had 1100 physical arrests and filed another 100 plus charges that were served as summons. This year capped off another great year of fine work by the men and women of WPD.

Wilmington Communications

This year has been very busy for our Communications Center. In 2015, we dispatched 17,492 calls for police service, 3,250 calls for Wilmington EMS, 614 calls for Wilmington FD, 214 Blanchester fire runs, 79 Sabina fire runs, and 509 Sabina EMS runs. Our dispatchers handled just over 6,100 calls for 911 services.

My thanks to our excellent communication staff that worked through shortages all year long. We did hire three new communications officers at the end of 2014 but lost two of them early in 2015. Darcie Mayberry finished her first full year with WPD and did a fine job for us. We tested and hired Terri Murphy as our newest addition to the communications center. We look forward to great things from her.



Hannah Smithson is being recognized as our Communications Officer of the Year for the second straight year. She has done an excellent job for us and has been a joy to work with.

Robin Cassell is being recognized for perfect attendance. This is her third year earning such distinction.
