ORDINANCE NO. O-16-60

AMENDING CHAPTER 925, REFUSE COLLECTION, OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES

WHEREAS, the City of Wilmington is instituting automated refuse collection as part of a policy to cut costs and increase efficiencies in the Sanitation Department; and

WHEREAS, City Council desires to amend certain sections of Chapter 925, Refuse Collection, of the Codified Ordinances, in order to better define services provided through automated refuse collection; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILMINGTON, STATE OF OHIO:

[Additions to the CODIFIED ORDINANCES are in **bold** and deletions are lined through or noted below]:

Section 1. That Section 925.24 I. Classifications and Rates for Refuse Collections, Curbside Recycling, Yard Waste, and Landfill and Compost Area Tipping Fees of Chapter 925, Refuse Collection, of the Codified Ordinances, be, and hereby is, amended to read in full as follows:

- 925.24 CLASSIFICATIONS AND RATES FOR REFUSE COLLECTIONS, CURBSIDE RECYCLING, YARD WASTE, AND LANDFILL AND COMPOST AREA TIPPING FEES.
- I. Commencing after June 1, 2016, in addition to fees levied by the OEPA and the Clinton County Solid Waste Management District as set forth in Section 925.24 II (a) and (b), every householder and commercial establishment creating refuse shall pay for the furnishing of the service of collection in accordance with the following schedule of monthly rates:

Assessment fees will be adjusted proportionately by the Director of Public Service as OEPA Solid Waste Disposal Fees change.

(b) Commencing after November 30, 1994, every householder and commercial establishment creating refuse shall also pay their share of the current fees assessed to the City of Wilmington by the Clinton County Solid Waste Management District. Those current fees are as follows:

- (c) All tipping fees assessed to the City of Wilmington by other entities, including but not limited to, fees from the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency and the Clinton County Solid Waste Management District are included in the fee schedule.
- (d) The fee schedule shall be posted continually throughout the year in a conspicuous place at the landfill offices as well as on the City of Wilmington website.
- (e) Any amendments to the fee schedule are subject to Council approval.

III. CURBSIDE RECYCLING AND YARD WASTE BAG COLLECTION FEES

(a) Yard Waste Bags \$1.50 per bag
(30 lb. material weight limit)
In accordance with Section 925.14 (b)
(b) Curbside Pick-up Service per month \$0.01

IV. COMPOST AREA TIPPING FEES FOR YARD WASTE

(a) <u>Haulers of Yard Waste</u>. Haulers of yard waste will be charged five dollars (\$5.00) per cubic yard for yard waste.

Section 2. That each and every section of Chapter 925, Refuse Collection, of the Codified Ordinances, except those sections identified and amended in Section 1 of this ordinance, are hereby ratified and republished and incorporated herein by reference as though fully rewritten herein.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall be effective from the earliest period allowed by law.
