## ORDINANCE NO. O-17-62

ADOPTING THE CITY OF WILMINGTON ELECTRIC AGGREGATION PROGRAM PLAN OF OPERATION AND GOVERNANCE PURSUANT TO SECTION 4926.20, OHIO REVISED CODE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Section 4926.20, a city council may aggregate customers within their jurisdiction in order to secure lower cost electric services within the citythrough the collective purchasing of electric services; and

WHEREAS, this Council seeks to continue a governmental aggregation program with opt-out provisions, according to law, for the residents, businesses and other electric consumers in the city who receive commodity sales service and distribution service from Dayton Power & Light; and

WHEREAS, this Council seeks to adopt a Electric Aggregation Program Plan of Operations and Governance, attached hereto and incorporated herein as if fully reappearing pursuant to Section 4926.20, Ohio Revised Code, for the residents, businesses and other electric consumers in the city, as permitted by law;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by this council, City of Wilmington, State of Ohio; two thirds (2/3) all members elected thereto concurring:

Section 1. This Council finds and determines that it is in the best interest of the City, its residents, businesses and other electric located within the boundaries and who receive commodity sales service and distribution service from Dayton Power & Light to continue alone an opt-out Aggregation Program in accordance with law in the State of Ohio.

Section 2. This Council finds and determines that it is in the best interest of the city, its residents, businesses and other electric consumers located within the boundaries of the city to adopt a Electric Aggregation Program Plan of Operations and Governance attached hereto and incorporated herein as if fully reappearing, pursuant to Section 4926.20, Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Wherefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
