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A FINAL RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CLI US 22D (URBAN PAVING) PID 89011 PROJECT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

The following **Final Resolution** enacted by the **City of Wilmington**, hereinafter referred to as the Legislative Authority or Local Public Agency (LPA), in the matter of the stated described project.

WHEREAS, on 18<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2010, the LPA enacted legislation proposing cooperation with the Director of Transportation for the described project:

Mill and fill U.S. Route 22 using Type 1H asphalt. Install pavement markings, lying within the City of Wilmington; and

**WHEREAS**, the LPA shall cooperate with the Director of Transportation in the above described project as follows:

The City agrees to assume and bear one hundred percent (100%) of the entire cost of the improvement, less the amount of State funds set aside by the Director of Transportation for the financing of this improvement, and further, the City agrees to assume and bear one hundred percent (100%) of the cost of Preliminary Engineering and Right-of-Way, excluding in-house preliminary engineering and Right-of-Way charges incurred by the State.

The share of the cost of the LPA is now estimated in the amount of **Fifty Thousand and - - -00/100 Dollars**, (\$50,000.00), but said estimated amount is to be adjusted in order that the LPA's ultimate share of said improvement shall correspond with said percentages of actual costs when said actual costs are determined.

WHEREAS, The Director of Transportation has approved said legislation proposing cooperation and has caused to be made plans and specification and an estimate of cost and expense for improving the above described highway and has transmitted copies of same to this legislative authority; and

**WHEREAS**, The LPA desires the Director of Transportation to proceed with the aforesaid highway improvement.

**NOW THEREFORE**, be it resolved by the Council of the City of Wilmington that Section 1.

- I. That the estimated sum of **Fifty Thousand and ----11/100 Dollars, (\$50,000.00)** is hereby appropriated for the improvement described above and the fiscal officer is hereby authorized and directed to issue an order on the Treasurer for said sum upon the requisition of the Director of Transportation to pay the cost and expense of said improvement. We hereby agree to assume in the first instance, the share of the cost and expense over and above the amount to be paid from **State** funds.
- II. That the LPA hereby requests the Director of Transportation to proceed with the aforesaid highway improvement.
- III. That the LPA enter into a contract with the State, and the **Mayor** be, and is hereby authorized to execute said contract, proving for the payment of the LPA the sum of money set forth herein above for improving the described project.
- IV. That the LPA transmit to the Director of Transportation a fully executed copy of this Resolution.

SETTING THE SALARY FOR LARRY REINSMITH AT A RATE LOWER THAN THE MINIMUM AMOUNT REQUIRED BY THE CITY OF WILMINGTON EMPLOYEE PAY PLAN ADOPTED IN ORD. #4823 FOR THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ord. # 4823, the City of Wilmington City Council adopted a pay plan for all City employees, which said pay plan is currently in effect; and

WHEREAS, said pay plan sets a minimum salary for the Director of Public Service at \$87,256 (Range 29, Step A); and

WHEREAS, the current Director of Public Service, Larry Reinsmith, intends to retire on March 31, 2011, and would accept an appointment to the same position on or after April 1, 2011 at a salary lower than the minimum set in the city pay plan; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor intends to appoint Larry Reinsmith as the Director of Public Service after March 31, 2011, at a salary lower than the established minimum, to wit: \$79,750 (8% lower than Range 29, Step A on the pay plan), resulting in a minimum cost savings to the City of \$44,396.91 per year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILMINGTON, STATE OF OHIO:

- Section 1. That this Ordinance concerns only the setting of an annual salary for Larry Reinsmith in the event that the Mayor re-appoints Mr. Reinsmith to the position of Director of Public Service of the City of Wilmington on or after April 1, 2011.
- Section 2. That on or after April 1, 2011, the annual salary for Mr. Reinsmith for the position of Director of Public Service shall be set at \$79,750 at the request of Mr. Reinsmith and shall remain so fixed for Mr. Reinsmith until further act of Council. However, in the event that Council should approve a cost of living increase for all city employees, said cost of living increase shall be applied to Mr. Reinsmith's base salary of \$79,750 in the same manner.
- Section 3. That the pay scale for the Director of Public Service set forth in Ord. 4823 remains in effect and shall apply to any person appointed to serve as Director of Public Service on or after April 1, 2011 other than Mr. Reinsmith.

Section 4. That this Ordinance shall have full force and effect from the earliest period allowed by law.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILMINGTON, OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1. That we encourage the Mayor, other elected officials and our city department heads, purchasing agents and/or staff to use their best efforts to identify bio-based products that can be incorporated effectively and economically into the city's daily operations.

SECTION 2. That reasonable efforts will be made to make the City of Wilmington a greener government through the incorporation of policies, programs and products that protect the environment, reduce our reliance on foreign oil, and eliminate unnecessary waste.

SECTION 3. This Resolution shall have full force and effect from the earliest period allowed by law.
