September 8, 2015

OPENING OF MEETING

Ms. Rinehart called the meeting to order at 5:30PM. All Board members were in attendance.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Mr. Rowan requested the Board enter Executive Session for the purpose of discussing pending litigation and the employment and compensation of public employees.

At 5:31PM, Mr. Ritter made a motion to enter Executive Session and Mr. Deters offered the second. No discussion and the roll was called:

Mr. Deters. "Aye" Ms. Rinehart. "Aye" Mr. Ritter. "Aye"

Ms. Rinehart reconvened the meeting at 6:00PM. Mr. Rowan said no decisions or actions were made in Executive Session.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

All recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

PRESENTATIONS

WAL-MART

Chief Denney introduced Dan Rodenburg, store manager, and Heather Gombes, loss prevention manager, for Wal-Mart. They presented Chief Denney with a donation of \$2,500 for the K9 unit.

RESOLUTION FOR CHILDHOOD CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

Ms. Rinehart read a resolution for childhood cancer awareness month.

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PUBLIC HEARING

WHITE OAK GARDEN CENTER

Mr. Deters made a motion to open the public hearing and Mr. Ritter offered the second. The roll was called:

Mr. Deters. "Aye" Ms. Rinehart."Aye" Mr. Ritter. "Aye"

Mrs. LeCount presented the staff report.

Craig Abercrombie approached the Board and is representing the owners in the case. He introduced Jeff Webeler, owner.

Bernie Fiedeldey said the White Oak Garden Center does a great job and they all shop there. He said they are trying to squeeze a lot into a small piece of property. Residents to the west have a small buffering and that's wrong. He said there is nothing in the law that says we must comply with the County Engineer's thoroughfare plan.

Mr. Deters made a motion to close the public hearing and Mr. Ritter offered the second. The roll was called:

Mrs. LeCount read the conditions recommended from the Zoning Commission.

Mr. Deters said that most of the houses are pretty far back.

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CITIZEN ADDRESS

Mr. Rowan read the new public participation policy.

Bernie Fiedeldey said he has asked in the past for the statutory authority to take Township money to support the chamber. He would like that answer now. He spoke about the road projects we let out, with Township money and block grant money. We only had two bidders and he feels that was because we only advertised in the Northwest Press, which is not adequate. He asked why the Board doesn't put the bid notice where it will get the most exposure. He said that we don't even know how to bid a job and we have a responsibility to be sure it's done right.

Mr. Barbiere said that he never said he didn't remember. His obligation is to give legal advice to the Board. This authority is in the Ohio Constitution and limited home rule. He said it's not his normal procedure to answer other's questions.

Mike Parsons said that the Board is discussing the trash contract again tonight. He remembers when the Township functioned out of a trailer behind the school. He also remembers when we got zoning authority. He said it is a complete disrespect of Township zoning to give the contract to Rumpke.

Jack Tobler thanked the Board for their service and the police and fire. He said that his biggest problem with the trash contract is that we're taking away people's rights for \$1.28/month. He also said that he will need to coordinate how to buy furniture because you can't put out both a mattress and boxed spring. Some people recycle and compost their garbage, so they'll be forced to pay for a service they don't use. They are raising the cost of living in the Township, taking a bite out of the middle class. He asked about snow bird discounts and evictions.

George Reiter asked who pays for all this.

Mr. Deters said "you."

Mr. Reiter asked why he never sees cars from the county sheriff. He said they only see one police car every three days. There are so many abandoned houses. We need Hamilton County to come back to patrol the area. He said Northbrook is a big place and getting to be a bad place to live.

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Ms. Rinehart said the sheriff wanted to charge us more money and we couldn't pay. She suggested he call the sheriff to talk about this.

Rich McVay spoke about the roads. He asked how we decide which roads will be done. What is our strategy for road improvements? Can it be published or shared? He said that in benchmarking with other areas, he knows that Butler County has repaved with chip and seal for \$150,000/mile, but it's \$880,000/mile for what we're doing. He said that we might be able to do something different.

Garrett Pace asked for a Skyline Community Center update.

Mr. Birkenhauer said that we have the center listed with a realtor. We have had a lot of churches look at it, but it's challenging for them to get a loan. He said we had it appraised and we must be aware of the appraised value.

Mr. Pace asked what we are doing to create stability in the zoning department and what support we are offering to Mrs. LeCount to help her be successful.

Mr. Rowan said that he will offer comments later.

Greg Insco said that Mr. Rowan makes \$130,000/year and has had raises. He was hired to get rid of long-time employees. He was given a township car, gas, rental cars, insurance, etc. He said that Mr. Rowan is literally stealing from us and he has the receipts to prove it.

Ms. Rinehart said that Mr. Rowan has not been to New York City. Nothing was going in in the Township when she got elected. Now, everyone is performing and doing an outstanding job. We had a change in culture and thought. There has been so much progress.

Mr. Insco said that it's not theft because the Board allows it.

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ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

Chief Cook said that Firefighter Ron Stenger has been named the Communications Manager for the Urban Search and Rescue team. Will Mueller has been named the Colerain Township Business Association's firefighter of the year. Chief Cook said that he has been asked to serve on the University of Cincinnati's paramedical task force.

Chief Denney read an e-mail in appreciation of the criminal investigation unit's work on the homicide on Niagra. He said the school resource officers are developing a new program. He said they have received a grant from the Department of Justice for bullet proof vests. The CTBA will honor Jamie Penley as police officer of the year. On Sunday, they are hosting a picnic in Skyline Park.

Mr. Meloy announced that Dt. Stockmeier has received his bachelor's degree. He said that Darian Edwards has graduated from the National Fire Academy.

TRUSTEE REPORTS

MR. DETERS

Mr. Deters congratulated the team on the Taste of Colerain. He said it was a successful event, but it may be time to look at reinventing it. He offered his thanks to those who volunteers and gave their time.

He said, regarding the man who left after he spoke, that this man seems to have problems with how we do business. We do run like a business and we complete with other communities for residents and businesses. We need to find talent willing and able to do that. We lead the region in stopping the heroin epidemic. Our police and fire are going the extra mile to talk about race in the neighborhoods. That's courageous. That's the leadership we will have, a team directed to innovate. There is no one else he would trust to do this. He believes in our leadership team.

MS. RINEHART

Ms. Rinehart said that with the heroine issues, we are bringing back people who would otherwise be dead. Everyone has the chance to be better, to get back on track and be productive members of society. In her day job, every case is traced back to heroin.

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Ms. Rinehart said that in the zoning department, with the number of nuisance complaints, they can't get to the zoning part of zoning.

Ms. Rinehart offered her congratulations to the Colerain Cardinals who beat St. Xavier in football.

MR. RITTER

Mr. Ritter said that we have innovation, professionalism and attach the root cause of problems. He asked Mr. Barbiere for an update on the Rumpke trial.

Mr. Barbiere said the 11-day trial was over on August 6. They are now filing briefs. The judge will consider the trial and the briefs. They have no timeline for this, but it should be before the end of the year.
