**January 12, 2016**

### **OPENING OF MEETING**

Mr. Ritter called the meeting to order at 5:30PM. Mr. Ritter and Mr. Insco were in attendance. Mr. Deters has resigned from the Board.

### **EXECUTIVE SESSION**

Mr. Rowan requested the Board enter Executive Session for the purpose of discussing pending litigation and the employment and compensation of public employees.

At 5:30PM, Mr. Insco made a motion to enter Executive Session and Mr. Ritter offered the second. No discussion and the roll was called:

Mr. Ritter. "Aye"

Mr. Insco. "Aye"

Mr. Ritter reconvened the meeting at 6:02 PM. Mr. Barbieri said no decisions or actions were made in Executive Session.

### **PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

All recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Ritter said that Mr. Deters said was appointed to the County Commission. He resigned at midnight on Thursday, January 7, 2016. The law states the vacancy must be filled in 30 days. The remaining two trustees can appoint the successor. If they can't agree, it goes to the five-member committee Mr. Deters named on his elections petitions. He said that the Board seeks to cast a wide net to find the new trustee. Interested individuals can submit a resume and cover letter of 500 words or less, describing their skills and capability, by Tuesday, January 26. The information should be sent to Mr. Rowan, who will forward it to the Trustees. The Board members will submit one name each to be interviewed by both members.

Mr. Insco said that if Mr. Deters's committee can't agree, it goes to the probate court judge. He suggested we prepare a plaque to for Mr. Deters.

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Mr. Ritter said that he is confident they will find a good successor. He also acknowledged Mr. Deters as he was an excellent colleague. He also acknowledged Commissioner Hartmann as an awesome public servant.

Mr. Rowan said he will put this information on the Township website and submit to Northwest Press.

### **PRESENTATIONS**

#### **LEGO LEAGUE PRESENTATION**

Kerry Marsh said her students are a Colerain-based team in the Lego-League. She said this year's theme is trash. The team worked to find a solution to the problem of how trash is created and handled. To research this, they visited Rumpke. The students presented a skit which detailed the problem and their solution, a home energy recovery unit. They showed a model of the unit in concept.

### **CITIZEN ADDRESS**

Matt Tietz spoke about the drones and asked if there was any thought put into instead of an outright ban, to have a spot set aside for this.

Mr. Rowan said this proposal requires people to seek permission. It's not a ban.

Mr. Tietz asked if there is an area that people can go to without having to ask.

Mr. Rowan said that with the number of drones, they have concern for the health and welfare of the public and our employees. He said we hope to establish an area in Heritage Park 150 yards away from play structures or ball fields. We still want registration to know who is there in case of problems. This written permission allows us time with each person to go over guidelines.

Chief Denney said the FAA requires registration for drones over ½ lb.

Mr. Rowan said drones are banned in all national parks. He said we just need to put safety precautions in place

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Bernie Fiedeldey also suggested the Obergiesing Park, with this time of year not playing soccer. Mr. Fiedeldey welcomed Mr. Insco to the Board. He said that we have a 1<sup>st</sup> amendment, about freedom of speech. I will continue to champion the right of free speech. He said he's seen over the last year or so, so much disparaging remarks from board members about citizens. They are not entitled to have disparaging remarks. Everyone is entitled to their rights.

Tara Stucky is the owner of Cincinnati Drones. She said they do a lot of flying at Heritage Park, but always take certain procedures. The drones are registered with the FAA. As this becomes more popular, more people are new and don't understand the procedures. She said they put up "heads-up flying signs" and are out in the field, not near walking trails or disc golfers. She said it's important to consider the security of people. Only 5% have a zoom feature, so it's incredibly difficult to spy on anyone. They certainly discourage this as they teach customers. She said she and her husband are open to working with the Trustees about the procedures.

Mr. Rowan said will work with her on this.

In response to Mr. Insco, Mr. Rowan said there will not be fines.

Jim Acton said Ms. Rinehart started something last year and asked the Board to hold comments until he's complete. He asked everyone to bow heads in silence for Township employees, and others in need, veterans and active military. He said at the December 8 meeting, Mr. Barbieri said the Board is not permitted to open meetings with prayer, per a ruling of the US Supreme Court. He said he placed calls to US Congressman asking guidance about this. He was told that if those in office want to pray, fine, but they can't prevent citizens from bringing this up. He requested that we have an opening prayer at our meetings.

Mr. Barbieri said that we didn't have a full discussion. The US Supreme Court said that you can have prayer, as long as you allow any denomination lead the prayer. We didn't want to go in the direction of having just any group do the prayer.

Mr. Ritter asked if he could sign in and offers a prayer. Mr. Barbieri said he could do that at every meeting. He said that a moment of silence is different.

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Joseph Beal asked about zone change.

Mr. Ritter said we will give him a chance to speak during this part of the meeting.

Gary Middleton welcomed Mr. Insco. He also spoke about the drones and asked if we could find a bigger area, as to not have them collide.

A citizen said that the moment of silence is typical at other meetings she has attended.

### **ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS**

Mr. Rowan said there will be three community meetings regarding the levy. He encouraged everyone to attend or bring questions to a future meeting.

Mr. Meloy said the director of the communications center has resigned. Mr. Dunn was instrumental in driving costs savings forward and we will miss him. The Police Department has changed their hours since 2010, with the clerks answering 55,000 calls, with \$375,000 in dispatch fees saved. Mr. Dunn will be missed.

Mr. Birkenhauer thanked the salt plow drivers for their work. He also said that on Thursday at 2pm, Supercuts is having their grand opening.

### **TRUSTEES' REPORTS**

#### **MR. INSCO**

#### **MR. RITTER**

Happy New Year! He said he is glad to see old and new faces here tonight.

He said his wife is the financial controller for a health care company. Her boss invites outside speakers to their staff meetings. Neal Tillow, CEO of Talbert House, spoke about the heroin epidemic and said that if one community is doing it right, it's Colerain.

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### **PUBLIC HEARING – ZA2015-05**

Mr. Insco made a motion to open the public hearing. Mr. Ritter offered the second. The roll was called:

Mrs. LeCount presented the staff report. She said the property is 12.72 acres, located at 7600 Colerain Ave., with 360' of frontage on Colerain Ave., and 110' on Jonrose Ave. The request is to rezone the property to bring the entire site under one zoning classification and therefor make the site more desirable for future occupation and possible development. The request is to change the zoning from B-2 general business and R-7 multi-family residential to B-3 commerce. The Colerain Township Zoning Commission voted 5-0 to recommend approval of the map amendment. She said the rezoning would be consistent with the Comprehensive Plan. Staff recommends approval of the application.

Joseph Beal asked how this will effect on adjacent property owners.

Mr. Ritter said that when a potential developer comes forward, we have a chance to vet it and discuss impacts on neighbors.

Mrs. LeCount said that if a developer would come in, there are plenty of criteria they would need to meet. She said it's more difficult to market for sale when the zoning is not in place.

Mr. Ritter said that you can rely on us to protect your interests.

Bernie Fiedeldey said to change to one zone type is a great idea. He said bars and restaurants are prohibited in B3. What do we want to see there and how do we want it to look? Zoning says minimal outside storage, but it should be prohibited. B3 is a wide zoning. He suggested added conditions in the character area, such as fully enclosed and landscaping and buffering with residential. The CRA is a bonus for those people developing there. What do we as a Township get out of it?

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Mr. Birkenhauer said this was a difficult property to market for redevelopment. It was under a long-term lease. Most buildings will be demolished. Bob Stenger will expand his business on to this property. He will pick his own neighbors, who will be pillars in community, like he is.

Mr. Ritter asked if we have flexibility for this and if the existing code protects us with set-backs, etc.

Mrs. LeCount said outdoor storage does require a zoning certificate. There is 50' buffer yard. There are still controls in place.

Mr. Fiedeldey said we shouldn't allow pole barns.

Steve Cahill with Abercrombie and Associates represents Bob Stenger of FKS Realty. He said this is a more desirable mixed use parcel in an area in desperate for re-development.

Jim Acton asked question about the map.

Mr. LeCount said this is all one site, 5 parcels total, with rezoning for the three northern parcels.

Mr. Insco asked about the buffer zone. Mrs. LeCount said there not one now, but this would add it.

Mr. Insko asked everyone to pray for an employee who is fighting for his life.

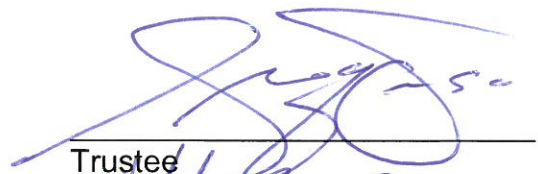
