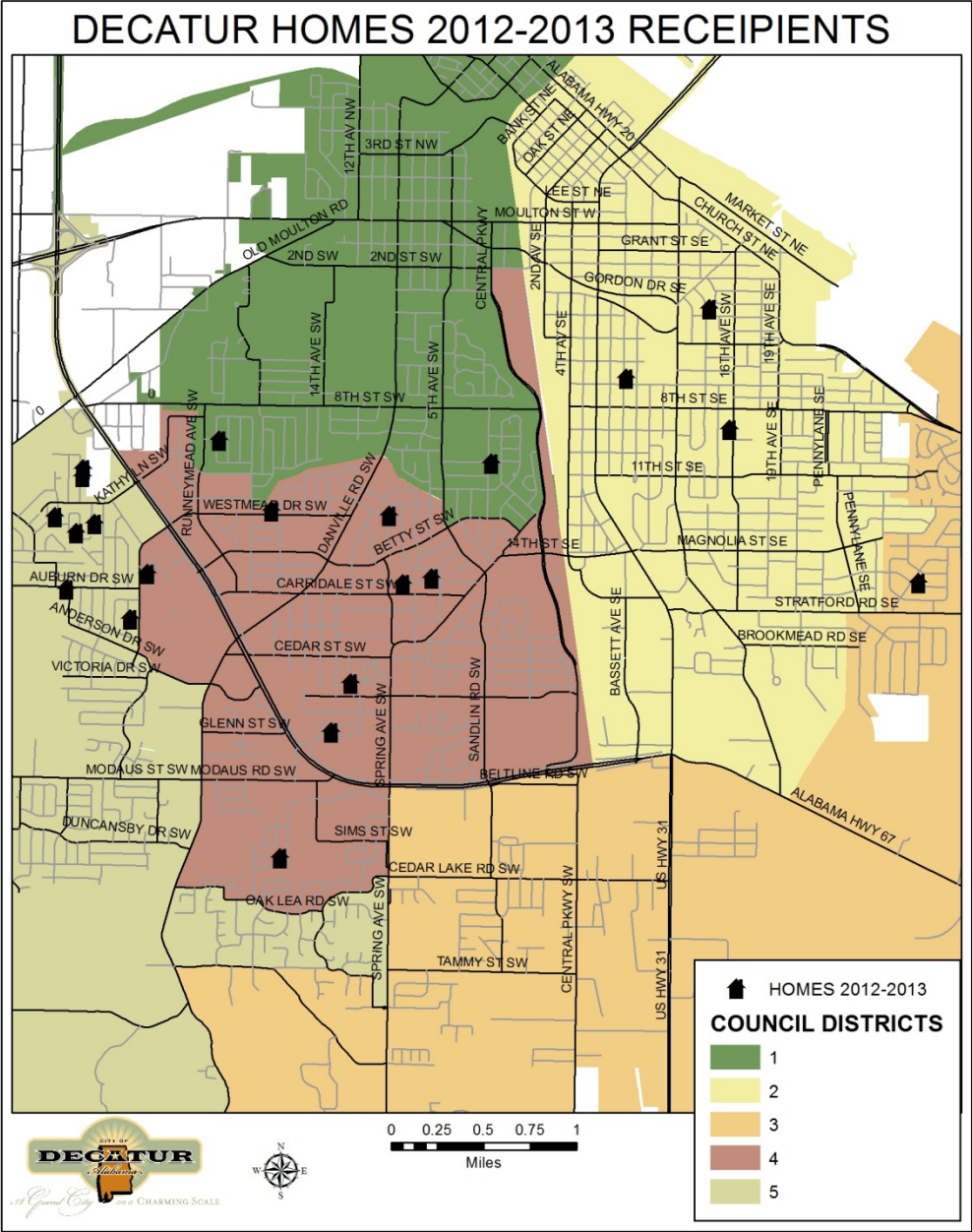

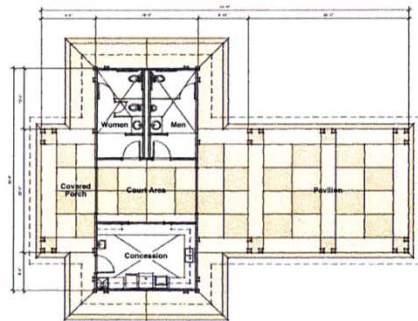

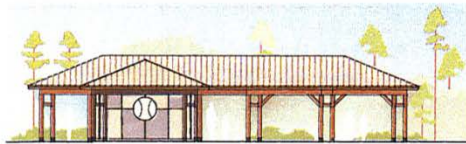

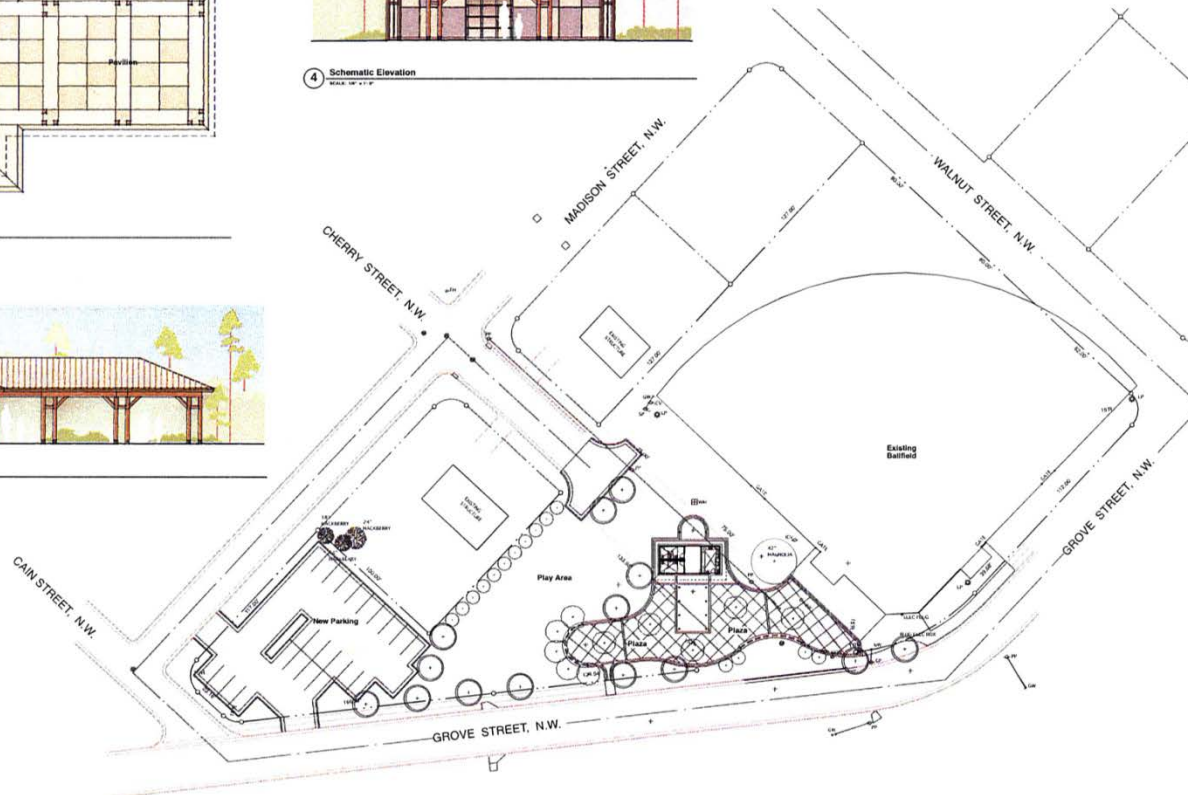
③ Schematic Plan
