AN ACT Relating to the City of <u>Decatur</u> in Morgan County; authorizing the <u>sale</u> of certain alcoholic beverages on certain days and providing for a referendum.

## **Text**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. This act only applies to the City of Decatur in Morgan County.

Section 2. The <u>sale</u> of alcoholic beverages during certain hours after 12:00 p.m. on Sundays is authorized within the city. The <u>Decatur</u> City Council may, by ordinance, regulate and permit the <u>sale</u> of alcoholic beverages after 12:00 p.m. on <u>Sunday</u> by properly licensed retail licensees of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board.

Section 3. The <u>Decatur</u> City Council shall hold a referendum to determine if alcoholic beverages may be sold on <u>Sunday</u>. If a majority of the voters voting thereon vote in favor of the question, then the <u>sale</u> of alcoholic beverages after 12:00 p.m. on <u>Sunday</u> shall be authorized.

Section 4. The referendum shall be held at a special election called for that purpose by the <u>Decatur</u> City Council. Costs of the referendum shall be paid by the City of <u>Decatur</u>. A second or subsequent referendum shall not be held within 12 months following a referendum [D> which fails to be approved by the voters of the City of <u>Decatur</u> <D].

Section 5. In the event a referendum is called pursuant to this act, the City of <u>Decatur</u> shall conduct a public hearing not less than 10 days before the referendum date in which the content of the proposed ordinance providing for the <u>sale</u> of alcoholic beverages on <u>Sunday</u> pursuant to any resolution of the governing body shall be presented as to the times and locations and other restrictions pertaining to alcoholic beverages sold on <u>Sunday</u>.

Section 6. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

As the Decatur Downtown Redevelopment Authority we would like to request that the Planning Commission for the city of Decatur begin the process of reviewing and taking the steps necessary to change the Sunday times for alcohol service in restaurants.
