An ordinance enacting Chapter 728 “Medical Marijuana Dispensaries” of the Business Regulation and Taxation Code and amending Section 1359.03 “Permitted Uses” and Section 1359.06 “Regulations for Specific Uses” of Chapter 1359 U4, U5 and U6 Business and Industrial Districts of the Planning and Zoning Code, of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Euclid are hereby amended to allow the licensing and operation of medical marijuana dispensaries as accessory uses at state-licensed medical marijuana cultivation or processing facilities. Comment: This would allow for Council to be the final approving body of daycares wishing to operate in U-4, U-5 or U-6 use districts.
