An ordinance to amend Section 1377.05 “Structure for Animals” of Chapter 1377 “Accessory Uses in Residence Districts” of the Planning and Zoning Code of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Euclid to accommodate domestic hen raising subject to appropriate limits and conditions. (Sponsored by Councilperson Langman by request of the Planning and Development Director) (To be referred to Planning and Zoning)	Ord. (047-18)
SENT TO PLANNING AND ZONING	Comment: The Hen Pilot Program has been successful for years, and this codifies regulations for same.

(Sponsored by Councilperson Langman by request of the Planning and Development Director) (To be referred to Planning and Zoning)</p> <p>Comment: Bee keeping has become more popular with the honey bees becoming endangered and this would establish rules and regulations for the keeping of bees.</p> | <p>Ord. An ordinance enacting Section 541.37 “Littering” of the General Offense Code of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Euclid to assist the Euclid Police Department in enforcement of littering in the City of Euclid. (Sponsored by Councilperson Caviness by request of the Chief of Police)</p> <p>Comment: This creates a littering section in the criminal chapter of the Euclid Codified Ordinances instead of just in the health and sanitation code.</p> | <p>Ord. An ordinance enacting Section 331.44 “Noise Disturbance from Motor Vehicle Prohibited” of Chapter 331 “Operation Generally” of the Traffic Code of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Euclid to prohibit the playing of loud music while operating a motor vehicle. (Sponsored by Councilperson Caviness by request of the Chief of Police)</p> <p>Comment: This creates a section prohibiting noise from motor vehicles in the traffic code.</p> | <p>Ord. (045-18)</p> |
