Ordinance 017-25.** An emergency ordinance authorizing the Mayor, or her designee, to enter into a five (5) year contract with Axon Enterprise, Inc., 17800 N 85<sup>th</sup> Street, Scottsdale, Arizona 85255, for the use of hardware and software products and supporting services, including a real-time crime center platform from Fusus, for one hundred seven (107) body cameras and tasers and twenty-five (25) vehicle dash cameras at a total cost of \$3,002,549.40 (Three million, two thousand five hundred forty nine dollars and forty cents) 6 for use in the Police Department. Ordinance passed with a unanimous vote.




