Planning and Zoning Commission, City of Euclid, Ohio, et al., Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court Case Number 24-CV-997034 and related matters under terms and conditions discussed in Executive Session of the Euclid City Council and as further memorialized in an Agreed Consent Decree and Final Order to be executed between the parties.
