

The regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Lake Lure, North Carolina, was held in the Administration Building in said Town on the 6th day of March, 1928, in pursuance of notice duly given.

Mr. J. B. Phillips tendered his resignation as Commissioner, for the reason that he was leaving Lake Lure.

Upon motion made and duly seconded, the resignation of Mr. Phillips was accepted with regrets of his Board.

Mr. F. B. Logan was thereupon elected Commissioner in the place of J. B. Phillips resigned. Mr. Logan thereupon took the oath of office as Commissioner, which said oath is as follows:

"F. B. Logan, being duly sworn deposes and says; 'that I will faithfully and impartially discharge the duties of Commissioner of the Town of Lake Lure to the best of my skill and ability; so help me God'."

After discussion, it was deemed advisable to appoint Mr. S. V. Hooker as Commissioner in charge of all of the public utilities and streets of the Town at a monthly salary of \$50.00 beginning March 1, 1928.

After discussion, it was deemed advisable to pay Miss Nettie Lee Weber a salary of \$25.00 per month beginning April 8, 1927.

Upon motion made and seconded, it was ordered that the above salaries be put into effect.

Mr. L. C. Cobb thereupon presented his bill for \$50 to cover expenses incurred by him to date in travel, etc., on business for the Town of Lake Lure.

Upon motion, the above bill was accepted and ordered paid.

Upon motion made and seconded, Miss Nettie Lee Weber was requested to furnish bond for \$5,000 with Surety, in her capacity as Clerk and Disbursing Officer of the Town of Lake Lure.

It was moved, seconded and carried that the fiscal year of the Town of Lake Lure be from June 1st to May 31st of each year.

Upon motion, it was resolved to borrow from the Water Fund the sum of \$6,000 and charge the same to the account of General Fund, the same to be re-paid from the first receipt of taxes.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
