At an adjourned meeting of the Mayor and Commissioners of the Town of Lake Lure, duly held in the Town office on June 6, 1936, at ten-thirty o'clock P.M. there were present:

Mr. Jason A. Vess, Commissioner
Mr. Norman A. Greig, Commissioner

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Commissioner Vess offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

"BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Commissioners of the Town of Lake Lure that the ordinances of the town heretofore adopted on June 6, 1933, be amended as follows:

That sections 1 and 2 of Boating Regulations be modified and changed to read as follows:

1. No person, firm, or corporation shall operate a commercial boat upon said lake within the corporate limits of said town until he shall obtain a license for said purpose from the Secretary-Treasurer of said Town, and shall pay to him the following fees:

(a) \$12.50 for license to operate each passenger boat for hire, per season.

~~(b)~~ \$ 5.00 for license to operate each fishing boat for hire, per season.

2. No person, firm or corporation shall operate a private boat upon said lake, within the corporate limits of the Town, until he shall obtain a license for said purpose from the Secretary-Treasurer of said Town, and shall pay to him the following fees:

(a) For license to operate a row boat or canoe 25¢ per day or \$1.00 per season.

(b) For license to operate any gasoline or electric propelled boat not exceeding 20 feet in length 25¢ per day or \$2.00 per season.

(c) For license to operate any gasoline or electric propelled boat exceeding 20 feet in length \$3.00 per season.

And that the fishing regulations as set forth in said ordinances be and the same are hereby modified and changed to read as follows:

FISHING REGULATIONS

1. It shall be unlawful for any person to place baskets, trot lines, or other devices for the catching of fish in any waters within the corporate limits of the Town of Lake Lure.

2. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish in any waters within the corporate limits of the Town of Lake Lure until such person shall have applied for and obtained a permit for said purpose, the fee for which shall be as follows:

(a) Annual permits for residents or non-residents of the State of North Carolina \$1.05.

(b) Daily permits for residents or non-residents of the State of North Carolina .20¢ (Daily permit to be in lieu of annual permit)

3. The regulations provided from time to time by the North Carolina Department of Conservation and Development fixing open and closed seasons, size limits, bag limits, and methods of taking fish, are hereby adopted by the Town of Lake Lure.

4. No person shall sell or offer for sale and fish taken from Lake Lure."

Commissioner Greig seconded the adopting of the foregoing resolution and upon the same being put to a vote, said resolution was unanimously adopted and the ordinances of said Town declared to be modified and changed as set forth in said resolution.

Commissioner Vess then offered the following resolution, and moved its adoption, to-witt:

"WHEREAS, the Town of Lake Lure is very largely a resort community and its well being and development depends upon the said lake being made available for fishing, bathing and boating; and

WHEREAS, said lake has heretofore been stocked with fish and is being restocked from time to time in the interest of the community and the public; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary and proper that the Town of Lake Lure should have power and authority to pass ordinances and regulations regulating and governing boating and fishing in said lake and to patrol the same and to provide for fishing licenses or permits and to make reasonable charges for the same in order to protect said lake and to make said lake available for fishing; and

WHEREAS, the Town owns certain rights and easements in the lake shore along said Lake Lure which it is unable to use to advantage except for the purpose of making available said lake for boating, fishing and bathing; and

WHEREAS, the owners of said lake have expressed a desire to grant to the Town of Lake Lure the right to levy and collect special privilege taxes or license fees for fishing and boating in connection with said lake and for the operation of bathing beaches in connection with said lake, but has expressed its intention and purpose to contract with others than the Town of Lake Lure for the operation of commercial boats, including fishing boats and passenger carrying boats and for the operation of bathing beaches within said town of Lake Lure; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed expedient and for the best interest of said Town that the owners of said Lake be authorized and permitted to use that strip of land known as the Boat landing and bathing beach lying between Highway #20 and the lake shore and extending about 1200 feet each way from Pool Creek in order to make available for use said lake for the purposes hereinbefore set forth; and

WHEREAS, a contract has this day been presented by the owners of said Lake to the Town of Lake Lure providing for the matters and things hereinbefore set forth, a copy of which is hereto attached, which it is for the best interest of said town to execute.

BE IT, THEREFORE, RESOLVED, that said contract bearing date of April 1, 1936, a copy of which is hereto attached, be executed by the Town by the Mayor and Secretary-Treasurer, and the said Mayor and Secretary-Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to execute the same in behalf of said Town."

Commissioner Greig seconded the adoption of the foregoing resolution, and upon the same being submitted to a vote it was unanimously adopted by the Mayor and Commissioners of said Town of Lake Lure and the said contract ordered to be recorded as a part of the minutes of this meeting.

Mr. L. L. Powers before the close of this meeting appeared before the Board and advised the town that he had contracted with the Carolina Mountain Power Corporation for the exclusive privilege of operating a bathing beach within the Town of Lake Lure at the same point where the beach has heretofore been operated and filed with the town a petition to operate the same, said petition conforming in all respects to the requirements of the town ordinances relating thereto, and at the same time tendered to the town \$50.00 for said licenses.

Upon motion by N. A. Greig which was duly seconded by J. A. Vess, the petition was granted and the said L. L. Powers licensed to operate said beach as provided by the ordinances.

Upon motion and second, meeting was adjourned.
