
At a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Lake Lure, held on Tuesday, February 20, 1940, the following business was transacted:


The clerk reported to the Board that he had been unsuccessful in getting a W.P.A. project approved to construct a water line extension across the lake to the north side of the town due to the small amount of labor involved in comparison with the material to be used.

After reviewing the matter, the Board was of the opinion that due to the recent building and settlements adjacent to the Bov's Camp road and the many application received from residents on that side of the lake for water supply, it was deemed advisable to make the necessary extension from the town's water department's appropriations.

Upon motion and second, and by unanimous vote of the board, the clerk was authorized and directed to purchase the necessary material and cause a 2 in. galvanized pipe line to extend westward along highway No. 74 and thence across the lake bed to a central point on the opposite shore. From the above point, the town would then extend any lateral line within reason to any resident making application provided said resident would refund to the town the approximate cost of such pipe lines used and said amounts would be credited to the users water account to apply against future billing.

Upon motion and second, meeting was adjourned.
