At a regular meeting held on Tuesday, August 23, 1949 by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Lake Lure, the following business was transacted:

The following resolution was offered by Commissioner Washburn which was seconded and unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Lake Lure to appropriate various sums for the maintenance and operation of the Town Government and its institutions for the fiscal year, beginning July 1, 1949 and ending June 30, 1950.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Lake Lure, N.C. does hereby appropriate the following sums for the maintenance and operation of the Town Government and its institutions for the fiscal year aforesaid:

AND, WHEREAS, in order to raise the necessary revenue for the foregoing appropriated expenditures, it is necessary that the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Lake Lure Levy a tax rate for the fiscal year.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that there shall be levied and collected in accordance with existing laws a tax upon all real estate situated in the Town of Lake Lure and upon all personal property owned by the residents of the Town, a rate of \$1.30 per \$100 valuation of said property, the said tax being necessary to raise the required revenues for the General Fund appropriated and designated herein.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED THAT The Town Clerk and Tax Collector is hereby instructed to allow such discounts and to charge and collect such penalties upon such taxes, if and when paid, as are set forth in Section 805 of the Machinery Act of 1933 and all subsequent laws pertaining thereto.

The following resolution was offered by Comm. Washburn who moved it's adoption, to wit:

WHEREAS, the Town of Lake Lure is the owner of a tract of land lying in said Town and known as the Golf Course Tract, whereon is situated a Golf Course owned and operated by said Town and

WHEREAS, bordering on and adjacent to said Golf Course and within said Golf Course Tract there are certain wooded lands not being used in connection with said Golf Course and not necessary to the proper operation of same which said wooded lands are heavily timbered and in need of thinning or selective cutting of some of the larger timber located thereon in order to properly preserve the growth and welfare of said timbered lands, and

WHEREAS, V. W. Parton, a reliable lumber man has offered to selective cut and remove certain standing timber located on said Golf Course Tract Southeast and South of the Golf Course proper, subject to the supervision of the Town of Lake Lure with no trees less than ten inches in diameter at the base being cut and subject to being stopped from cutting said timber at the option of said Town, for which the said V. W. Parton has agreed to pay to the Town of Lake Lure the sum of ten dollars per thousand for said timber and to make weekly

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or bi-monthly accountings to said Town for the amounts so cut, and having also agreed that the measurement of said timber shall be subject to inspection by said Town if they so desire;

BE IT, THEREFORE, RESOLVED; That it is to the best interest of said Town and to the welfare of its growing timber that the offer described in detail above by W. W. Parton be accepted, and he is hereby authorized to selective cut the timber described as outlined above, that said offer is the best one submitted for this work.

That the said V. W. Parton is not to cut any trees within one hundred feet of the fairways and greens of said Golf Course proper no ton near the Cane Creek Baptist Church."

The foregoing resolution was seconded by Commissioner Allison and unanimously adopted by the Board on this 23rd. day of August, 1949.

Upon motion and second, meeting was adjourned.
