

MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
OF THE TOWN OF LAKE LURE, N.C. HELD IN THE TOWN OFFICE AT
7.30 P.M. TUESDAY SEPT 14, 1954

At a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the
Town of Lake Lure, N.C. held in the Town Office at 7.30 P.M.
Tuesday Sept. 14, 1954, the following were present-

The Mayor opened the meeting and brought up the matter of
constructing a Town Hall. The 1951 Budget included provision
for the erection of a Town Hall, Taxes were levied for the
purpose, and there is a reserve of \$4,000.00 for the purpose
on the Town's Books. After discussion, Mr. Pearson moved that
immediate steps be taken to construct a Town Hall. The motion
was seconded by Mr. Allison and duly adopted.

The Clerk was instructed to address Mr. F.C. Lee and request
that he clear and remove the debris of his boat house which
burned Sunday Sept. 12, 1954.

The Mayor was authorized to sell two (2) old tires from the
tractor at the golf Course. These tires have not been used for
two or more years and whatever we get for them will be O.K.

Mr. Hague Kiser whose term expired Monday was retained until
the regular officer, Mr. C. Ray Dalton who is confined to his bed,
returns to duty.

Mr. Ray Vess was authorized to have all Golf tools and implements
sharpened and put in good shape. It was, also, authorized that
terraces at Golf Course be built up. Mr. Vess was instructed to
relieve Curtis Wagner of his duties at Golf Course as season is
over. Wagner has been temporarily employed during the season.

It was decided, also, to work hard for the repeal of the ruling
requiring that out of State visitors be required to purchase an
annual fishing license. The matter is expected to come before the
Legislature in Jan. 1955 and the Town of Lake Lure will join with
other sections in attempting to have such a Law repealed.

Mr. V.T. Salter was recognized. He brought up the matter of getting
water to Green # 5. It was suggested that a certain party, name not
mentioned, would give the pipe necessary for an annual membership
to the Golf Club. This was accepted.

Considerable discussion pertaining to boating and fishing on the
lake and the probability of a longer lease than one year from the
Carolina Mt. Power Corp. so that the basin or bay in the center
of the Town might be developed.

Mr. David Lahn, a new resident, was recognized and welcomed along
with Wm. E. Franks, C.E. Havnaer, and Francis C. Proctor.
No further business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
