A SPECIAL MEETING WAS CALLED AND HELD IN THE TOWN OFFICE SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 6, 1965, At 8:30 A.M.

THE PURPOSE OF THIS MEETING WAS TO APPROVE A PETITION COMPILED BY THE LAKE LURE CIVIC ASSOCIATION, COMPOSED OF THE REGISTERED VOTERS AND THOSE WHO WILL BE REGISTERED FOR THE 1965 TOWN ELECTION TO BE HELD IN MAY OF THIS YEAR.

PETITION FOR ELECTION

The Town Council of Lake Lure, Rutherford County, North Carolina;

To The Honorable Hollis M.Owens,Jr, Member Of The North Carolina House Of Representatives; and

To The Honorable Clarence O.Ridings, representing the 33 Senatorial District of North Carolina:

The undersigned being registered Voters of the Town Of Lake Lure Rutherford County, North Carolina, have in their own respective handwriting signed the following Petition in which it is respectfully requested that The Town Council of Lake Lure, Rutherford County, North Carolina, request the Legislative Delegation of Rutherford County to prepare and introduce an Enabling Act at the 1965 Session of the North Carolina General Assembly which will provide for the calling of an election to determine the following:

The question of whether or not the "On Premises" sale of beer and wine by Grade "A" Hotels, Motels and Restaurants only and "OFF PREMISES" sales by all other licensees, and by the establishment and operation of ALCHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL STORES shall be legal in the Town Of Lake Lure, Rutherford County, North Carolina.

It is further requested, in the event of the passage of such legislation, authorizing the above election, that this be considered as a petition for such an election.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE SPEED LIMIT ON U. S. HIGHWAY
No. 74 IN AND NEAR THE BUSINESS SECTION OF THE TOWN OF LAKE LURE

WHEREAS, the Town of Lake Lure has determined upon the basis of an Engineering and Traffic investigation that the Statutory Speed limit applicable under GS20-141 upon U. S. Highway No. 74 through the Town of Lake Lure is greater than is reasonable or safe under the conditions found to exist, and

WHEREAS, the Municipality has the authority under GS20-141 (g2) to establish a safe and reasonable speed limit, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the Town of Lake Lure as follows:

Section 1- the maximum speed for any vehicle upon that Section of Chimney Rock Road (SR 1305) from U. S. 64-74, N. C. 9 Northeastward for a distance of 0.52 mile and U. S. 64-74, N. C. 9 from a point 0.40 mile East of the Western Corporate limits of said Town Eastward for a distance of 0.50 mile, shall be 35 miles per hour.

Section 2- that U. S. 64-74, N. C. 9 from the Western Corporate limits (approximately 50 feet West of Chimney Rock Camp Road SR 1305), Southeastward for a distance of 0.40 mile shall be 45 miles per hour.

Section 3- this Ordinance shall not become effective until signs are posted giving Notice of the authorized Speed limit.

Section 4- All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.


Section 5- Any person, firm or Corporation violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a Misdemeanor, and shall be punished in accordance with Section 14-4 of the North Carolina General Statutes.

MUNICIPAL ELECTION, MAY 4, 1965

A RESOLUTION BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWN OF LAKE LURE CALLING FOR A REGULAR ELECTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING A MAYOR AND TWO COMMISSIONERS OF THE GOVERNING BODY.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT, by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Lake Lure, that in accordance with the General Laws of the State of North Carolina, the Board hereby calls for an election to be held in the Town Hall on Tuesday May 4, 1965, the date established for the election, said election shall be conducted for the purpose of electing a Mayor and two Commissioners by the Voters of Lake Lure. The Mayor and two Commissioners shall be elected to hold office for a term of two years, and until their successors are elected and qualified.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, the polling place shall be the Town Hall in Lake Lure.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, Clyde W. Keeter, be and is hereby appointed as REGISTRAR; that Eugene Melton and J.V. Bell be and are hereby appointed as JUDGES of the election.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, all persons eligible to vote in the Town, as defined by the General Law, shall be eligible to register and vote in the election herein called.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, the REGISTRAR be and he is hereby directed to open the registration books for the purpose of recording therein the names of all persons eligible to be registered who did not register for the preceding Municipal Election.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, the REGISTRAR shall open said books at 9:00 A.M., on Friday April 16. The books are to remain open between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. on each day (Sunday excluded) for SEVEN DAYS (7) closing April 23, except on April 17, when they shall remain open until 9:00 P.M.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, Saturday April 24, 1965 shall be designated as challenge day, and that any person desiring to challenge any name included in said registration books on this day, advise the REGISTRAR AND THE JUDGES OF THIS FACT. THE REGISTRAR AND THE JUDGES thereupon set a date and a time for the hearing of the challenge, but, said date shall be no later than Monday May 3, 1965.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, the final filing date shall be April 20, 1965, at 12:00 O'clock, NOON.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THIS RESOLUTION SHALL BE POSTED AT THE TOWN HALL.

THE FOREGOING RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS AT THE REGULAR MEETING HELD MARCH 9, 1965.
