

The Regular Meeting Of The Board Of
Commissioners Met In The Town Hall
Tuesday October 21, 1965.

Sideny E. Nelon were present for the meeting.

The first item of business to be discussed was a letter from L.C. Cook Chevrolet, Company of Forest City, N.C. L.C. Cook made a bid for a new police car for the Town, the bid was a 1966 Chevrolet Biscayne 2 door, Model # 15411, 8 cylinder, equipped with heater, back up lights, and 2 speed wiper and washer. Allowance to be allowed on the Town Police car 1961, 2 door 8 cylinder Biscayne, \$919.43. Trade difference \$1550.00, if 4 door car is needed add \$41.00 to the above price making a total of \$1591.00. Other bids have been submitted, do not have details for minutes, so far the Cook Chevrolet Co. bid is the best deal. No action was taken at this meeting to buy the car.

The second item of business to be discussed was an ordinance to be adopted by the Board regarding Junk Yards within the Corporate Limit of the Town.

A Motion was made by Commissioner Nelon and unanimously passed that the following State Of North Carolina Law Regulating Junk Yards be incorporated into the Town Ordinances, the same follows:

State Law: Section 14-399, Placing Trash, Refuse, Ect., on the right of way of any Public road.-It is unlawful for any person firm, organization or private corporation, or for any governing body, agents or employees of any municipal Corporation, to place or leave so cause to be left temporarily or permanently, any trash or refuse, garbage, scraped automobile, scraped truck or part thereof on the right of way of any State Highway or public road where said highway or road or street ^{is} within the ~~Corporate~~ town limits of the Town Of Lake Lure, N.C.

The placing or leaving of the articles or matter forbidden by this section shall, for each day or portion thereof that said articles or matter are placed or left, constitute a separate offense.

Violation of this section is punishable by a fine of not less than Ten dollars (\$10.00) and not more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for each offense.

A new Water Reservoir was discussed, place chosen for the reservoir has to be approved by the owners of the land,. When approval has been acquired work will begin on a 100,000 gal. reservoir, off of Washburn Road.

No other business the adjourned.
