

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF
COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWN OF LAKE LURE,
TUESDAY, MARCH, 9, 1971

The regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners was held in the Town Hall at 7:30 o'clock, P. M. on March 9, 1971. The following members of the Board were present: J. Paul Wilson, Mayor; Robert B. Jones, Commissioner; Woodrow Price, Commissioner; Hollis M. Owens, Jr., Town Attorney was also present.

The Mayor, J. Paul Wilson, called the meeting to order and the Clerk read the minutes of the last meeting.

Mayor Wilson recognized representatives from the Burgess Garbage Collecting Service. Cleston Burgess suggested to the Board that if the residents of Lake Lure would use smaller garbage cans and plastic bags and that if the operators of camps and camping areas would put their garbage in a central location, better garbage service could be given in the Town of Lake Lure. The Board agreed to take the suggestions under consideration. No decisions were made.

Mr. James Morris, Mr. Zeb Dalton, and other members of the Hickory Nut Gorge Civic Association were present and discussed with the Board the possibility of leasing a tract of land owned by the Town of Lake Lure. The Board requested more information as to the use that would be made if said property is leased and no decision on whether to lease the property was made.

Mrs. J. V. Bell, citizen of Lake Lure, was present and suggested to the Board that a privilege license tax is a good source of municipal revenue and such a tax should be imposed on all businesses within the corporate limits of Lake Lure.

The Municipal Election to be held in the Town of Lake Lure, in May, 1971, was discussed along with the appointment of elections officials. After discussion, Commissioner Jones moved, seconded by Commissioner Price that the following resolution be adopted:

A RESOLUTION CALLING A REGULAR ELECTION FOR
MAYOR AND TWO COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWN OF
LAKE LURE, NORTH CAROLINA.

Be It Resolved By The Board of Commissioners Of The Town of Lake Lure, That:

- 1- An election is hereby called for Tuesday, May 4, 1971, the date established by law, for the purpose of electing a Mayor and two Commissioners.
- 2- The polling place will be the Town Hall and the polls will be open on election day from 6:30 A. M. until 6:30 P. M.
- 3- Clyde W. Keeter is hereby appointed as registrar, and Eugene Melton and Jane N. Melton are hereby appointed as Judges of Said election.
- 4- The registrar is hereby directed to open the Books of Registration for

for the purpose of registering all the qualified electors who request registration and who are not now registered to vote in Municipal elections.

- 5- The registration period will be from Friday, April 16, 1971, through Friday, April 23, 1971, excluding Sunday April 18, 1971. The registration books will be open for registration each day from 9:00 A.M. until 5:00 P. M. at Keeter's Service Station, except that on Saturday, April 17, 1971, the books will be open from 9:00 A. M. until 3:00 P. M. at the polling place.
- 6- Challenge Day will be Saturday, April 24, 1971, and all challenges may be entered on such day from 9:00 A. M until 3:00 P. M. at the polling place.
- 7- The Town Clerk shall, no later than Saturday, April 3, 1971, cause a copy of this Resolution to be published in a News Paper having general circulation in the Town, and to be posted at the Town Hall.

FINAL FILING DATE FOR CANDIDATES SHALL BE APRIL 15, 1971.


The following commissioners voted in the affirmative: J. Paul Wilson, Mayor; Robert B. Jones, Commissioner; Woodrow Price, Commissioner.

Upon motion made, seconded and unanimously passed, Robert C. Wilson was appointed Alternate Judge for the election to be held on May 4, 1971, and it was decided to pay the Registrar \$150.00 for his services, and each of the Judges \$20.00 for serving on the day of the election, and to pay the Alternate Judge at the same rate as the regular Judges if it is necessary for said Alternate Judge to actually serve on May 4, 1971.
