

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF  
COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWN OF LAKE LURE  
TUESDAY, MAY 11, 1971

The regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners was held in the Town Hall at 7:30 o'clock, P. M. on May 11, 1971. The following members of the board were present: J. Paul Wilson, Mayor, Avery T. Cashion, Jr., Commissioner; Zeb V. Dalton, Commissioner.

Hollis M. Owens, Jr., Town Attorney, was also present.

The Mayor, J. Paul Wilson, called the meeting to order and the Clerk read the minutes of the last regular meeting and the minutes of a special meeting held on May 5, 1971. The minutes were approved as written.

Roy Yearty, Glenn Burgess, and John Monday, citizens of Lake Lure were among those present at the meeting.

Mayor Wilson asked if there was any old or unfinished business. Roy Yearty, past president of the Hickory Nut Gorge Civic Club, inquired about the possibility of enlarging the concrete slab back of the Bath House on the beach area of Lake Lure for the purpose of street dances. Mayor Wilson advised that the board was considering constructing a new and larger slab on other property owned by the Town of Lake Lure.

Upon motion of Commissioner Cashion, seconded by Commissioner Dalton and unanimously adopted, the Mayor was authorized to appoint a committee to study and make recommendations regarding the size and costs of a new and larger concrete slab. Zeb Dalton and Roy Yearty were appointed to serve on this committee.


Glenn Burgess, representing Burgess Garbage Service, requested that the board increase the amount being paid for garbage collection to \$600.00 per month for the months of May, June, July, August, September and October and to \$500.00 per month for the months of November, December, January, February, March and April. No decision was made on this request. Mayor Wilson advised Mr. Burgess a decision would be made on or before June 1, 1971.


The date for opening of the Lake Lure Beach House came up for discussion. Decision on this matter was deferred until a special meeting to be held on May 18, 1971.

Upon motion of Commissioner Cashion, seconded by Commissioner Dalton and unanimously adopted, the board increased the salary of Lake Lure Chief of Police, Gene L. Lovell, to \$400.00 per month.

Mayor Wilson reported to the board that the estimated total costs of transporting the equipment necessary to dredge the channel and swimming area of the lake known as Lake Lure and the dredging of said areas is \$142,000.00

The Mayor asked if there was any further business to come before the board. There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 9:00 o'clock P. M.
