

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF BOARD OF  
COMMISSIONERS OF TOWN OF LAKE LURE  
OCTOBER 9, 1973

The regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners was held in the Town Hall at 7:30 p.m. on October 9, 1973. The following members of the board were present: J. Paul Wilson, Mayor; Avery T. Cashion, Jr., Commission and Zeb V. Dalton, Commissioner. Hollis M. Owens, Jr., Town Attorney, was also present.

Mayor Wilson presided and called the meeting to order. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved as written.

Mayor Wilson invited Mr. Martin Goodman, Chairman of the Board of Elections of the Town of Lake Lure to comment on the new system for holding municipal elections in North Carolina. Mr. Goodman explained the new card system for the registration of voters and advised that municipal registration records must conform with those of the county in which the municipality is located. He stated that all candidates for positions on the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Lake Lure would be given a list of registered voters and expressed the opinion that members of the Board of Elections of the Town of Lake Lure should be paid gas mileage for travel in connection with the registration books.

Commissioner Cashion moved, seconded by Commissioner Dalton, that members of the Board of Elections of the Town of Lake Lure be paid at the rate of \$.11 per mile for travel in connection with voter registration books. Motion was unanimously adopted.

Mr. Don Cothran advised the Board that ten additional Honda bikes for the Junior Police program will be delivered by November 19, 1973, and asked the Board to have Christmas decorations installed along the highway through the Lake Lure business area. The estimated cost was \$500.00.

Mr. Martin Nesbitt inquired of the Board as to when Cane Creek Drive can be paved. Mayor Wilson advised him rights of way would have to be acquired and the road made ready for paving, and that the paving could not be done before the spring of 1974.

Mr. Nicholas Morrow inquired as to when the Ridge Road would be paved. Mayor Wilson advised he would measure this road and get an estimate on the paving cost.

Upon motion of Commissioner Cashion, seconded by Commissioner Dalton, and unanimously adopted, the Board set December 1, 1973 as the date for lowering the lake known as "Lake Lure" to permit repairs to boat houses and dock repairs.


Upon motion of Commissioner Dalton, seconded by Commissioner Cashion and unanimously adopted, the Board decided that no changes should be made in the boat and fishing license fees for 1974.

Mr. F. M. Blankenship brought up the matter of damage to the Cane Creek area of the lake known as "Lake Lure" by the drainage of the Girl Scout lake. Mayor Wilson advised that the Environmental Protection Agency issues permits for drainage purposes and that a hearing is held before a permit is issued. Mr. Blankenship stated he would like to be present for any such hearing.

Bids by Rouse Stokes Motors, Inc., Cline-Moore Auto Sales, and Garrett Ford on a new police care were presented to the board. The low bid was by Rouse Stokes Motors, Inc. in the amount of \$5,160.59 for a 1974 Plymouth Fury III Four Door Sedan less a trade allowance of \$2,584.40.

Upon motion of Commissioner Cashion, seconded by Commissioner Dalton, and unanimously adopted, the Board instructed Chief of Police to place an order for the 1974 Plymouth as soon as possible.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 10:30 o'clock P. M.


